Officials Join Forces to Fight Drugs

The Village Police Department has joined with area municipal, Valencia County, state, tribal and federal law enforcement agencies to form a partnership to pool resources in the fight against drugs in Valencia County.

The agencies have formed the Valencia County Regional Drug Task Force.

Participating agencies include the police departments from Belen, Bosque Farms and Los Lunas, Valencia County Sheriff's Department, Isleta Tribal Police, State Police, DEA/U.S. Department of Justice, 12th Judicial District Attorney's office, FBI, Department of Homeland Security and the U.S. Marshal's office.

Council Districts To Be Redrawn

With the release of 2010 U.S. Census figures, Village of Los Lunas officials will be redrawing the village's council districts. This may result in some village residents being in a different council district.

The village council seats were districted after the 2000 U.S. Census showed the village's population had reached 10,034.

After 10,000 population, municipalities, counties and school boards must create districts. Officials then run from these districts.

Criteria for districts include:

- Equal population;
- No dilution of voter strength by ethnic language or minority groups;
- Districts must be compact;
- Districts must be contiguous; and
- Districts must have common community interests such as neighborhoods or cultural /historic traditions.

The census data for New Mexico is expected to be released before April 1.

The village has four districted council seats.

In March 2012 an election will be held for Village Council Districts One and Three.

Pardon our Progress . . . An Update on Village Projects

The following is an update on village projects from Village Public Utilities Director James Blasing.

The Calle de Las Familias project is close to 95 percent complete. This work included utility updates, sidewalk installation, strengthening the structure of the existing street and drainage improvements.

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) project on the west side of NM 314 south of Main Street is 75 percent complete. The contractor continues to install landscaping and dress up items. They are close to finishing up the pedestrian improvements at Courthouse Road and NM 314. The project should be substantially complete by mid March and done by about the beginning of April.

The ARRA project on the east side of NM 314 south of Main Street is approximately 80 percent complete. The path is about 90 percent paved and the contractor is about to move on to the railroad-related improvements. Trees are being planted next to the path. Substantial completion is anticipated by the end of March, and total completion by about mid April.

The intersection of Main Street (NM6) and NM 314 is close to 75 percent complete. This has caused the most traffic disruption and Blasing, along with the administration and council, thank the motoring public for the patience displayed during the project..

The contractor has removed the old traffic signals and will be widening NM 314 to add the double left turn lanes to westbound Main Street. A right turn lane from NM 314 to east bound Main Street will also be added. Substantial completion is expected by the beginning of April, and final completion at the end of April.

This sewer force main replacement installation is approximately 30 percent complete. The river flows affect the progress. The contractor is hoping for lower levels of the river to remove old piping directly over the major flow areas. The by-passing system is working well.

The Los Lunas Village Council and employees thank the public for its support.

From April 1 through September 30 spray irrigation is allowed in Los Lunas from 6 p.m. to 10 a.m. on all properties.

Shut-off nozzles in the village are required on any hoses used for hand watering, vehicle or equipment washing or other outdoor uses.

Citizen Input Needed to Update Village's Comprehensive Plan

The village is looking for citizen input to update the community's comprehensive plan, says Community Development Director Christina Ainsworth.

The comprehensive plan is a plan for the future physical and economic development of the community and sets the directions, policies, strategies and actions for that future.

The comprehensive plan looks out 25 to 30 years.

Elements of the comprehensive plan include land use; economic development; natural resources and environment; urban design; infrastructure and transportation; community services; and special districts.

The village's comprehensive plan was last updated in 1999.

Updating the plan is a very public process requiring a lot of input from the community while the village planning department works to revise the plan.

The input process began in late February with a visioning workshop conducted with the village council.

The council establishes policy in the village.

The Village Planning and Zoning Commission is charged with oversight for the comprehensive plan, explained Ainsworth. Because the planning and zoning commission is a planning body, it will make recommendations regarding the comprehensive plan to the council.

Ainsworth is looking for people to serve on a five to seven member committee to help with creating the new comprehensive plan. If you are interested, call Christina Ainsworth at 352-7659.

A draft of the updated plan is expected to be completed by the fall so that it can be approved by the village council by the end of 2011.

Ainsworth points out that the comprehensive plan is a living document, a vision for the community.
