Castillo, Saiz Win New Four Year Terms

Village Council incumbents Cecilia CC Castillo and Gerard Saiz won reelection to their positions in the March 4 election.

The unofficial results are:

Village Council District One — Amanda Perea, 170; Cecilia CC Castillo, 180.

Village Council District Three — Gerard Saiz, 152; Donald M. Mondragon, 33.

Total votes cast in District One were 350 out of a potential 2,267 registered voters in that district which is a 15 percent voter turnout.

Total votes cast in District Three were 185 of a potential 1,343 registered voters in that district which is a 14 percent voter turnout.

Both Castillo and Saiz were first elected to the village council in 2000 when village council members

were elected at large.

In 2004 Castillo and Saiz were elected to their first four year terms representing a specific district in the Village of Los Lunas.

Village Museum Now Open

The Village Museum of Heritage and Arts held its public grand opening March 1 and is now open Tuesday through Friday noon to 5 p.m. and Saturday 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Premier exhibits focus on The Civil War, Founding Families of Los Lunas and the museum's Genealogical Resource Center.

Northern Valencia County's Peralta was the site of one of the skirmishes that hastened the exit of the Confederates from New Mexico during the Civil War.

The standoff skirmish occurred April 15, 1862, one year after President Abraham Lincoln declared war and the blood and carnage that ripped the United States apart began.

The Founding Families features the Luna/Otero Dynasty for the opening exhibit. Other families will be featured in the future.

The Lunas and Oteros contributed to the political, economic and educational development of not only Los Lunas, but New Mexico and the United States, points out historian Patty Guggino.

The Civil War and Luna/Otero Dynasty exhibits will be on display through April 30.

The Genealogical Resource Center is a permanent part of the museum.

Village Applies for Road Funding

The village has applied to the state for COOP funding to work on improvements to Edeal, Giron and Maestas Roads, Gomez Court, Calle de Los Familias, Lujan Road and Mountain Laurel. The majority of the work is for repaving and sidewalks.

The village is also applying for Municipal Arterial Program funding for more work on Carson Drive. Village officials hope to obtain funding to make improvement to Aspen Road.
