## Infrastructure Improvements

Infrastructure improvements continue throughout the village.

The work at the intersection of Highway 6 (Main Street) and Los Lentos should begin in August after several months of work by other utilities at the intersection.

An extra right-turn lane was added in July to the southbound lanes of Los Cerritos where the road meets with Main Street.

The repaving of several streets is continuing with Edeal just about completed in the village limits.

Major work at the Main Street and Highway 314 intersection will probably start in the late fall. Be prepared for some delays as the intersection is reworked.

Work is proceeding on the village's arsenic treatment project.

## Budget Focuses on Economic Development, Continued Service

A focus on economic development and continued service to the citizens are among the highlights of the 2009-2010 budget approved by the Village Council July 23.

A top priority of village officials is continuing efforts to attract new businesses. New retail trade provides new employment opportunities.

There will also be a focus on attracting industrial development to the 1,000 acre area recently annexed on the far west side of the village.

Because the village is a service-oriented organization, there will be an emphasis on employee training and on the village Safety Program. Improved safety lowers expenses by lowering the Workers Compensation modifier.

The Fiscal Year 2009-2010 budget includes 17 funds, separated

into six fund types. Total revenues for all funds combined are \$43,444,592. Total expenditures are \$44,813,993.

The total estimated beginning cash balance is \$15,197,026 and the total ending cash balance on 6/30/2010 is projected to be \$13,827,624, an ending cash balance increase of \$1,399,135 (11.26%) from fiscal year 2009.

The principal operating fund is the General Fund. Revenues are derived primarily from gross receipts taxes, property tax, franchise tax, intergovernmental/grants, licenses and permits, sales and services and a variety of other sources.

The fiscal goal of the village is to establish and maintain effective management of the Village's financial resources.

## Police Chief Melnick Receives Police Officer Certification

Los Lunas Police Chief Roy E. Melnick has received his police officer certification from the New Mexico Department of Public Safety Police Academy, Advanced Training Bureau in Santa Fe.

Melnick completed extensive training at the New Mexico Department of Public Safety Police Academy by attending the 67th Certification by Waiver Class held for three weeks. He attended 120 hours of classes.

Melnick was previously certified in the States of Arizona, Massachusetts and New Hampshire as a police officer. He was required to achieve New Mexico police officer certification as a condition of employment when he was appointed police chief in March, 2009.

The courses Melnick took included New Mexico criminal and motor vehicle state statutes, state and federal constitutional case law, U.S. and New Mexico constitutions, firearms classroom training, day time and night time qualifications, complete simulator firearms training, patrol operations, state pursuit act, defensive tactics, ethics, domestic violence, use of force, hate crimes, profiling, critical incident management, survival Spanish, DWI Field tests and roadblocks.

# Youth Workers Collect 9,860 Pounds of Trash

A total of 493 bags or 9,860 pounds of trash was collected from throughout the village by the workers in the summer youth program.

The program had two two-week sessions in July with a total of 25 students who worked. The program is paid for by a grant that the Village of Los Lunas applies for each year for beautification and litter control.

In each session students were provided safety vests, gloves, mosquito spray and sunscreen.

The students picked up trash as well as cutting and bagging weeds.

Among the areas cleaned were around the Transportation Center, Juan Perea Road, Morris Road, North Lentes Road, Desert Willow Street, Emilio Lopez Road, Los Morros area, Sun Ranch area, and several sections of Highway 6, also known as Main Street.

The group working the second session spent a week at the Huning Ranch subdivision and also cleaned the public right-of-way to Sundance Elementary School, Los Lunas' newest school. While cleaning in the Huning Ranch area, several people stopped to thank the students for their work.

At the end of each session the workers were treated to a pizza field day at Daniel Fernandez Park. Certificates of appreciation for the students' hard

work were handed out. The students received their pay checks at the same time they received their certificates. Students were requested to turn in a short essay about their experience as part of the village's summer youth program.

Marie Marquez, who coordinates the program said that all the students did a great job. She feels the program is a great experience for the students, giving them an opportunity to work at a job for what might be the first time.

Marquez added that village staff wishes all students who worked so hard cleaning up the community a wonderful school year. The work is very appreciated by everyone.

TVs will be accepted for a \$6 disposal fee for 28" or smaller and \$11 for larger. Take the money to the cashier at the east end of the Village Administration Building, Don Pasqual and Main Street. Bring the receipt to the Transfer Station when you bring the TV. Hard drives are wiped of information. Working computers are donated to non-profits or schools. Everything else is disassembled and recycled through carefully chosen local and national recyclers that comply with all local and federal laws and do not export.
