Candidates File January 5; Election Set for March 2

On Tuesday, January 5, 2010, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., candidates will file for office in the Village's municipal election.

This is the only time that candidates may file so that the candidate's name appears on the ballot for the election to be held on Tuesday, March 2, 2010.

Voters in the Village of Los Lunas will be deciding on a mayor and a municipal judge. Voters in Village Council Districts Two and Four will also be voting on a village councilor. All terms are for four years.

The certification of candidates will be completed by 5 p.m. Wednesday, January 6, with a list of candidates posted by 9 a.m. Thursday, January 7.

Candidates will draw for ballot order at 5:01 p.m. Thursday, January 7.

Write-in candidates may file for office on Tuesday, January 12. The names of write-in candidates do not appear on the ballot.

Certification of write-in candidates will be done Wednesday, January 13, with the list of write-in candi-

dates posted by 9 a.m. Thursday, January 14.

The last day to withdraw as a write-in candidate is Tuesday, January 26, which is the first day to issue absentee ballots.

Voter registration closes Tuesday, February 2. Persons desiring to register should call the Valencia County Clerk's Bureau of Elections at 866-2080.

Early voting begins Wednesday, February 10, at the Village Administration Building, 660 Main Street N.W., the corner of Main and Don Pasqual.

The last day for absentee ballots and early voting is Friday, February 26.

Election Day is Tuesday, March 2, from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. The polling place is the Village Administration Building, 660 Main Street N.W.

Only people living within the village limits of Los Lunas will vote in this election. Some addresses may list Los Lunas, but that address may be in the unincorporated area of Valencia County.

Spending in Village Even More Important Now To Bring Tax Money To Village Budget

The continually evolving economic scene in the United States has resulted in changes in people's spending habits throughout the country.

Some people are spending less, others are re-allocating their limited resources as they search for holiday presents as well as everyday items.

Spending your shopping dollars at shops and businesses in the Village of Los Lunas has become even more important this year with the changes in people's spending habits.

The gross receipts tax charged on many purchases is an important part of the income for the Village of Los Lunas. When people spend less then there may be less gross receipts tax paid and passed

on to governmental agencies.

More than fifty-two percent of the general fund revenues for Fiscal Year 2009-2010 are generated through gross receipts tax and property tax revenue created within the village limits. These monies provide needed services throughout the village.

The general fund pays for the services people depend on including the police and fire departments, municipal court, library and museum, parks and recreation, community development and street department.

This year it is even more important to support your local businesses which in turn pay Gross Receipts Tax to the Village to continue providing services in the community.

Work Set for Main/Highway 314

Work will begin soon on the improvements to the intersection of Highway 314 and Main Street, also known as Highway 6.

TLC Plumbing & Utilities was awarded the contract for the work at a November Village Council meeting after submitting the low bid of \$692,627.

Drivers need to be careful going through this busy intersection while the road work is going on.

Improvements/changes include:

- Adding a right turn lane from westbound Main Street on to northbound Highway 314.
- Adding a right turn lane from northbound 314 on to eastbound Main Street.
- Creating two left turn lanes from northbound Highway 314 to westbound Main Street.
- Improving and lengthening the left turn lane from eastbound Main Street to northbound 314.
- Adding a right turn lane from southbound 314 to westbound Main Street.
- Creating two left turn lanes from southbound 314 to eastbound Main Street.

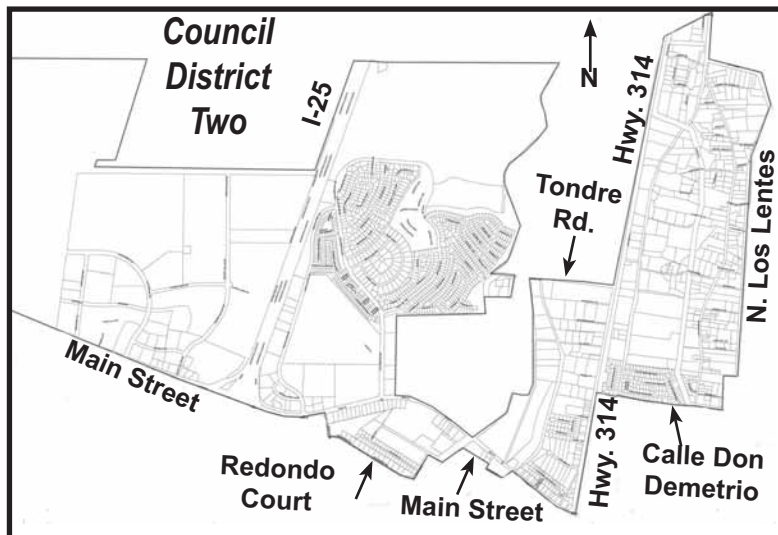


Time for Business Licenses

All businesses, whether Mom and Pop or multi-national, pay the same fee, \$25.

A license is required for "all persons, firms, corporations or associations of any character engaged in any of the various pursuits, businesses or occupations" in the village before March 15 every year at the latest.

Mondragon Retires After 23 Years of Service

Village of Los Lunas Community Development Director Art Mondragon retired November 30 after 23 years of service to the community.

Among the items under his guidance are the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance, the zoning map, the establishment of impact fees and main street overlay and the Drainage Ordinance.

When Mondragon began his career with the village, the municipality had 6,000 population. Now it is nearing 16,000.

During his years with the village, Mondragon accumulated a wealth of information about issues that concern the area, points out Village Administrator Peter Fernandez.

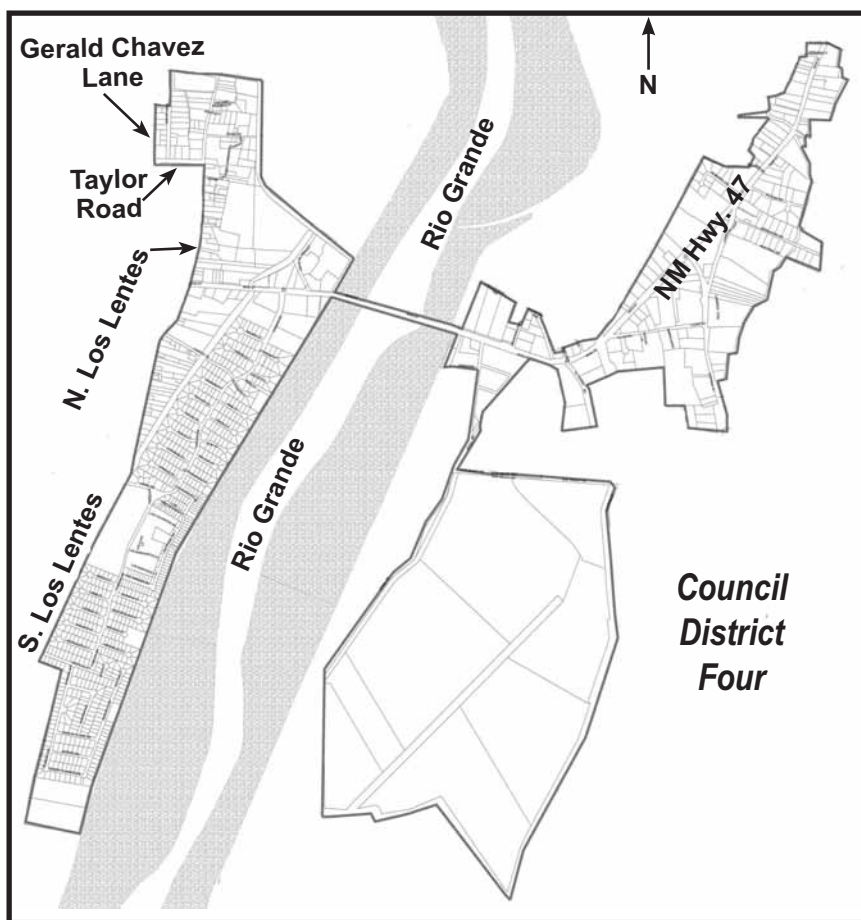
A huge knowledge source for the village is leaving with Mondragon's retirement. He has
