Lovato Named New Village Councilor

The Los Lunas Village Council has chosen Richard Lovato to serve out the term of Robert Vialpando as a member of the council representing District Four.

Vialpando is serving as mayor following the resignation of longtime Mayor Louis F. Huning for health reasons.

Lovato grew up in Los Lunas and graduated from Los Lunas High School in 1963. He went on to earn a degree in civil engineering from the University of New Mexico in 1972. He has worked for the City of Albuquerque and in the private sector and is now retired.

Since his retirement Lovato has been spending time maintaining his home and working in his yard.

Lovato will finish the remainder of Vialpando's term which ends in March 2010.

The 2010 election will include the election of a mayor, municipal judge and two council positions, District Two and District Four.

Administrator Fernandez At The Helm

Longtime village employee Peter Fernandez will serve as village administrator/clerk/treasurer following the resignation of Phillip Jaramillo. Fernandez was appointed to serve by the Village council until the March 2010 election.

Fernandez graduated from Los Lunas High School in 1967. He earned a degree in general business and accounting from New Mexico Highlands University and served in the Air Force for four years.

He worked in Denver, Colorado, for nine years before returning to Valencia County. He started at the Village of Los Lunas as a computer specialist and has worked as the financial services planner for the past 11 years.

Married to his high school sweetheart, Priscilla, the couple has three sons, Michael who lives in Albuquerque with his family; Jason, a resident of Arizona and who has twins with his wife; and John and his wife in Utah, both captains in the Air Force.

Peter Fernandez is currently serving as president of the Valencia County Chamber of Commerce.

Village Applies for Cops Funding

At the April 23 meeting, the Village Council approved applying for a grant to fund four new positions in the Los Lunas Police Department.

The grant is part of the 2009 Cops Hiring Recovery Program (CHRP).

If approved, the grant would fund the hiring of four new positions for three years.

At the end of the three years, the village would be required to keep the officers on the police force for at least 12 months.

18 Percent of Retail Space Vacant

About 18 percent of the retail space in the Los Lunas-Belen trade area is vacant, according to the retail development strategy conducted by Basile Baumann Prost Cole & Associates.

The company was hired by the village last fall to conduct the study looking at the current retail areas in Los Lunas.

Among the areas for future retail opportunity are the Interstate 25 Interchange and around the New Mexico Rail Runner Express Station as well as along Main Street in Los Lunas.

Strengthening the current healthy retail sites is strongly encouraged. Retail support should be encouraged by disseminating marketing information about the area.

All cell phones collected were donated to the Domestic Violence Organization. A representative from the Toys for Tots organization came from Albuquerque to collect the bicycles to be refurbished for needy children. Paint was collected by Belen for graffiti cleanup.

Marquez expressed her thanks to Boy Scout Troop 360, Los Lunas High School Volleyball Team, Trio See Club at the University of New Mexico Valencia Campus, students from San Clemente Catholic Church, community service workers from Municipal and Magistrate Courts, and the village staff who assisted as well as volunteers who wanted to participate in a good cause.

THE FOLLOWING ELECTRONICS CAN BE RECYCLED AT NO CHARGE: computers, monitors, computer peripherals (mice/keyboards), printers, copiers, scanners, fax machines, phones, backup batteries, laptops, gaming systems, batteries, VCR/DVD players and stereos.

TVs will be accepted for a \$6 disposal fee for 28" or smaller and \$11 for larger. Take the money to the cashier at the east end of the Village Administration Building, Don Pasqual and Main Street. Bring the receipt to the Transfer Station when you bring the TV.

Hard drives are wiped of information. Working computers are donated to non-profits or schools. Everything else is disassembled and recycled through carefully chosen local and national recyclers that comply with all local and federal laws and do not export.
