## LL Council Okays Contract With Fernandez To Serve As Administrator

Peter Fernandez will remain village administrator/clerk/treasurer after the village council approved a continuing contract with him at the March 25, 2010, meeting.

Fernandez has been serving in that position since the resignation of Phillip Jaramillo in April 2009.

Fernandez graduated from Los Lunas High School in 1967. He earned a degree in general business and accounting from New Mexico Highlands University and served in the Air Force for four years.

He worked for 21 years with the United States General Accounting Office in Denver and Albuquerque. He started at the village as a computer specialist and worked as the financial services planner for 11 years.

Married to his high school sweetheart, Priscilla,

the couple has three sons, Michael who lives in Albuquerque with his family; Jason, who lives with his wife and twins in Arizona; and John and his wife in Utah, both captains in the Air Force.

Peter Fernandez has been active in the community including serving as president of the Valencia County Chamber of Commerce.

## New Community Development Director Wants to Update Comprehensive Plan

Updating the Village of Los Lunas's Comprehensive Plan is a project that Christina Ainsworth, the new Community Development Director, is looking forward to working on.

Ainsworth arrived in March after eight years working for the City of El Paso.

At the City of El Paso she worked seven years as a city planner after starting as a plans examiner in Code Enforcement.

She grew up in El Paso where she graduated high school and then went to Yale University where she

earned a Bachelor's Degree in Architecture.

The Comprehensive Plan is a master plan that has a vision of the growth and development of Los Lunas. Comprehensive plans typically extend out 25 to 30 years to plan for a community's future.

The village's Comprehensive Plan was approved in 1999. Although it has been used, it has not been updated since then.

Public hearings will be held to gather community input for the update. Ainsworth said it is important for the public to be involved in the process which will probably start in late summer 2010.

We need everyone to join in taking ten minutes to complete and return their census form.

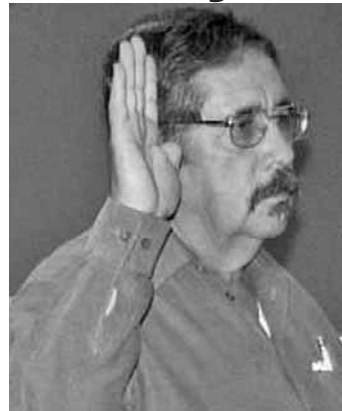
Census data help determine how more than \$400 billion per year in federal funding is distributed to school, state and local governments for services in our communities.

# Melnick Reappointed Police Chief

The Los Lunas Village Council has appointed Police Chief Roy E. Melnick to another year in that position. Melnick was first appointed in March 2009.

He says he looks forward to another 12 months and hopes that as much can be accomplished in the future as was the past year. Among the accomplishments:

- Reorganization with the promotion of five Sergeants and two Lieutenants.
- Specialty Assignments including School Resource Officer, Training Officer, Gang Task Force, Teen Court officer, Juvenile Drug Court Officer, Valencia County Resiliency Corps Officer and Drug Task Force Officer.
- Criminal Investigations Division added with two detectives.
- Renovated the police facility to utilize space more efficiently and so employees could be more efficient and productive..
- Implemented the LOCATER Program for the immediate dissemination of information regarding missing children locally, countywide, statewide and nationwide.
- Modernized the police vehicle fleet and reduced the number of vehicles thus saving insurance costs.
- Began updating the vehicle laptop computers program.
- Commissioned the Los Lunas School District School Resource Officers as police officers.
- Effectively dealt with critical events including two homicides that were quickly solved with arrests and a reported missing toddler.
- Authorized the writing and submission of grants in the amount of \$1,029,645 that were either received, or are pending with state and federal agencies.
- Purchased the latest police equipment and technology including GPS Tracking devices, digital video/audio recording systems, Panasonic mobile laptops, personal body digital video/audio recording systems, digital cameras, rifles, state of the art training equipment and the purchase of Ford Crown Victoria and Chevy Tahoe SUV police vehicles.

- Reduced the number of lawsuits filed against the department through increased training, accountability of personnel and supervisors and reorganization of duties and responsibilities and in the process of updating the policies and procedures.

- Increased community policing programs and implemented an educational component to issue warnings in lieu of citations for first time offenders.

- Reduced the overall number of crimes in the community. In 2008, 880 crimes were reported and in 2009, 797 crimes were reported.

- Reduced the number of citizen complains filed against officers..

## Canine and Officer Graduate From Canine Academy

Los Lunas Canine Officer Horacio Deanda and his canine Ricky have graduated from the New Mexico Department of Corrections Canine Academy.

Deanda and Ricky received training in several areas including basic handling, mock court scenarios, narcotics detection, felony stops, building searches, and classroom work exercises.

The training was physically demanding and both demonstrated a high level confidence, skill and protocol, said Los Lunas Police Chief Roy E. Melnick.

Deanda and Ricky are now on routine patrol in the Village. They are available for appearances in the schools, businesses and at community events.

# Summer Recreation Program Enrolling

The Parks and Recreation Department is taking registrations for the summer recreation program.

The summer program consists of two three week sessions for youths from the ages of six to 13 (or age five if kindergarten has been completed).

A proof of residency and birth certificate are required at the time of registration. Proof of residency can include one of the following: Village of Los Lunas water bill, PNM bill or New Mexico Gas Company bill.

Registration ends when the first 300 children are registered. Once the sessions are full then a child will be placed on a waiting list and contacted if participants withdraw from the program.

Registration fees are \$65 per child for a village resident and \$75 for county resident. Cash or credit/debit cards are accepted, but no personal checks.

The fee includes the first (June 7 - June 24) and second (July 11 - July 29) sessions. Both sessions are

Monday-Thursday 9 am. - 3 p.m.

Activities include kickball, flag football, basketball, archery, arts and crafts, soccer and volleyball. Field trips could include the Albuquerque Zoo, movies, fishing and Isleta Fun Connection.

## Don't Waste Water

From April 1 through September 30 spray irrigation is allowed in the Village of Los Lunas from 6 p.m. to 10 a.m on all properties.

Shut-off nozzles in the village are required on any hoses used for hand watering, vehicle or equipment washing or other outdoor uses.
