Live/Work Focuses On Home-Based Businesses; Meets Tuesday, April 19

The Live/Work Committee meets Tuesday, April 19, at the village Transportation Center, corner of Juan Perea and Courthouse Roads, beginning at 5:30 p.m.

The focus of the meeting will be developing a group of mentors who can help people who want to have a home-based business. Owners of home-based businesses as well as people interested in starting such a business are encouraged to attend.

The Live/Work program has three goals:

- To assist local residents in finding and initiating home-based work.
- To recruit new home-based workers from other communities to Los Lunas by focusing on people who can live anywhere and perform their work from home.
- To provide a network of service and support providers.

Village Home Occupation Ordinance Being Revised

The ordinance covering home occupations in the Village of Los Lunas is being revised to facilitate economic development in the community.

One of the revisions is the elimination of the need to obtain a conditional use permit for people who want to operate a home-based business.

The proposed revised ordinance includes a list of home occupations which do not require a conditional use permit. Those occupations cover a wide range from authors/composers/artists to real estate/insurance/sales agents to arts and crafts and many others.

Los Lunas Grows 48% in 10 Years

The 2010 Census figures show that Los Lunas grew from 10,034 in 2000 to 14,835 in 2010, an increase of 48 percent.

The growth in the village was the second largest in the Albuquerque metropolitan area. Rio Rancho was first with a 69 percent increase.

Belen's population increased from 6,901 to 7,268, a five percent increase. Bosque Farms decreased .7 percent from 3,931 to 3,904. Peralta's population is 3,660 and was incorporated since the 2000 census so there are no comparison figures.

The 2010 Valencia County population was 76,569, according to the U.S. Census figures. This is up 16 percent from the 2000 number of 66,152.

Village Comprehensive Plan Priorities Set

Following meetings with the Village Council as well as the Planning and Zoning Commission, work is proceeding on updating the village's comprehensive plan.

Priorities for the comprehensive plan include:

- Preserve rural character
- Manage growth sustainably
- Effective and proactive transportation planning
- Proactive economic development – including community branding
- Beautification of the community
- Focus on Transit Oriented Development for town center creation

At the suggestion of Village Councilor Richard Lovato, the plan will look at the development of a comprehensive solid waste program.

Village Community Development Director Christina Ainsworth said that all interested parties in planning for the community, including the schools and the county, will be asked to contribute to the comprehensive plan.

Pardon our Progress . . . An Update on Village Projects

The Village council says Thank You for everyone's patience in March when the traffic lights were changed over to newer models at the intersection of Main Street (Highway 6) and NM 314.

The Los Lunas police department helped with the traffic during the changeover, pointed out Public Works Director Jim Blasing.

During April final adjustments will be made to the new signals and railroad crossing facilities. The next phase widens NM 314 northbound and southbound. The new signals are timed for the rebuilt intersection so please be patient during the last phases of construction, which should be completed soon.

The Calle de Las Familias project should be finished this month.

The contractor is completing the landscaping on the American Reconstruction and Recovery Act (ARRA) project on the west side of NM 314. New pedestrian/signal improvements at Courthouse Road will be done as well as enhanced crosswalks. Benches and trash receptacles will be installed along the walkway.

Landscaping is being planted on the ARRA Project on the east side of NM 314. Light fixtures will be installed next, as well as guardrails. The enhanced crosswalk at Otero Street will be installed within the next couple of weeks.

The sewer force main replacement project is complete. The contractor is cleaning up the work areas.

The New Mexico Department of Transportation will be upgrading sidewalks to comply with American with Disabilities Act requirements on Main Street (Hwy. 6) between Don Pasqual and NM 314 this summer.

The Village Council and employees thank everyone for their support when projects are underway.

Summer Recreation

The Village will offer its an annual summer recreation program to the children in the Los Lunas School District during summer 2011.

To be eligible for the program a child must have completed kindergarten during the 2011 school year. The top age for the program is thirteen.

Recreation will be held Monday through Thursday, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Buses will only provide transportation to and from field trips There will no pick up and delivery of recreation participants.

The program will be offered in two sessions:

- Session I - June 13 to June 30, 2011
- Session II - July 11 to July 28, 2011.

Cost is \$40 per session. The program is held at the Daniel Fernandez Youth Center, 1103 Highway 314, on the south side of Los Lunas.

The Summer Recreation Program is a service to children In the Los Lunas School District. It is intended to provide education as well as healthy and wellness activities as a service.

The Los Lunas School District and Village of Los Lunas are not responsible for insurance coverage for the children. In case of an injury or accident, the parent or guardian is totally responsible for medical costs.

Work Begins Soon on Park

Work is expected to begin soon on additions to the community park located in Huning Ranch.

The village council approved awarding a contract for construction of new basketball courts, parking improvements which comply with the American Disabilities Act and an asphalt pathway.

HO Construction of Albuquerque was the low bidder for the job which drew 18 bids. The council approved \$164,118 for the work.

Huning Ranch/Sundance Park is planned to be twelve acres with tennis, volleyball and basketball courts, walking trail, picnic tables, a pavilion, landscaped gardens, two playgrounds and restrooms once it is completed.

The park is being developed as funding becomes available. It is located off of Huning Ranch Loop east.
