The Los Lunas Village Council extended the contract for the village's administrator for another year at the April 14 meeting.

Fernandez has served in that position since April 2009.

Village Summer Youth Program Hiring Workers

The Village is accepting applications for local youth to work for the Summer Youth Employment Program sponsored by the New Mexico Clean and Beautiful grant.

This year the work session will be the four weeks between July 11 and August 5.

Applications must be received no later than May 20 before 4 p.m. and are available at the village Administration Building, 660 Main Street NW.

Employment consists of outdoor environmental work which includes cutting weeds, picking up trash, and some landscaping.

Applicants must meet at least the following requirements:

- Must be a resident of the Village of Los Lunas and enrolled in public or private school. Proof is required.
- Must be fourteen to nineteen years old (students 14-15 must get a work permit which can be obtained at the orientation for those hired).

A Social Security card and school I.D. must be presented at orientation if hired.

Michael Romero - Officer of Year

Officer Michael Romero is the "Officer of the Year" for 2010 at the Los Lunas Police Department, said Chief Roy E. Melnick.

Romero was hired in May 2008 and graduated from the Department of Public Safety Academy in November 2008 where he received his police officer certification.

He served in the U.S. Army for 11 years where he achieved the rank of staff sergeant before receiving an honorable discharge.

He served in an artillery and infantry division, serving two tours in Iraq during Operation Iraqi Freedom. He was awarded a Purple Heart.

Romero went into law enforcement "to make a difference." As a patrol officer he works a day split shift. He hopes to eventually work in the gang or narcotics unit.

He has two sons who he spends time with when not on duty or working out at a fitness center.

He earned his Associate of Arts degree from Albuquerque Technical-Vocational Institute.

Water Conservation Important Inside

Water conservation is important both outside and inside the house. Water leaks indoors can mean higher water bills and no conservation. One of the major culprits for water leaks is the toilet.

One of the easiest ways to check for a toilet leak, says Los Lunas Public Utilities Director James Blasing, is to put 10 to 15 drops of food coloring (a blue, red or green is best) in the reservoir tank. After 15 minutes, check the toilet bowl for any sign of dye color. If there's color in the bowl, the toilet is leaking.

Leaks and noises are the most common problems with tank toilets and the two types of problems are often interrelated, although some leaky toilets are silent.

Many common toilet leaks can be fixed by making minor adjustments. For instance, a running toilet may be caused by an improperly adjusted float ball.

Two common culprits for toilet leaks are the valve seat, which may need to be cleaned, and the flapper, or tank ball, which may need to be adjusted, cleaned or replaced.

Taking care of problem leaks with the toilet could reduce your water bill as well as save water in a year when we have had little moisture.

New Police Officer Working in Village

Otto King has joined the village's police force.

He arrives after spending five years active duty in the United States Army and five years reserve duty. He was employed with the New Mexico National Guard just prior to being employed by the village.

He worked with the Demand Drug Reduction program which gives kids

an opportunity to stay busy while getting in shape and learning about drill and ceremony. He was also part of the New Mexico National Guard's search and rescue team.

King is slated to attend the Police Academy in Santa Fe New Mexico in June. Upon completion of the academy in November, he will be in a three month field training program. After successfully completing the program, he will be assigned to a patrol shift.

Four Village of Los Lunas police officers received medals presented by Police Chief Roy E. Melnick at an April council meeting. The medals commend the officers' work protecting area citizens.
