Village Council Plans For Future with ICIP

The Village Council has approved the Infrastructure Capital Improvement Plan (ICIP) for 2013-2017. What does that mean for the average citizen in Los Lunas? It means that the council is looking toward the future and planning for that future.

The ICIP is a list of projects that would improve life in the village if those projects are built. It is important to have the list ready should funding become available for the projects.

Top projects for the 2013 budget year are —

- Expansion of the wastewater treatment plant;
- Construction of a westside fire substation;
- Building a water line loop east of the Rio Grande;
- Extension of Morris Road; and
- Beautification of portions of Main Street.

Other 2013 budget year projects include work on municipal parks, railroad crossing quiet zones and expansion of the transportation building.

Top projects for the 2014 budget year include improvements to the municipal court/police department section of the administration building, street overlays and drainage for Los Morros Industrial Park.

Keeping you informed about Los Lunas projects

Work is progressing with the New Mexico Department of Transportation on the required environmental criteria for the right hand turn lanes on Main Street, also known as NM 6, at various intersections.

Construction is expected to begin in spring 2012 and last about seven months. The changes are on display at the village administration building lobby, 660 Main Street NW, and on the village website, loslunasnm.gov.

Special funding was received to revamp the intersection of Main Street and NM 263. This project should start in 2012 and will have to be worked around the Middle Rio Grande Conservancy District ditch having water most of the year.

Work has started on site and facility safety improvements to the village water well sites. Expected completion is March 2012.

The village's solid waste transfer station on Highway 6 west of the village is undergoing necessary

Mayor Didn't Heed Grandfather's Advice


Robert Vialpando well remembers spending what we now call "quality time" with his grandfather as Robert grew up in Los Lunas. One of the pieces of advice his grandfather gave him was "Never get involved with politics."

The man who is now mayor of Los Lunas laughs when he tells this story because he hasn't followed his grandfather's advice and is now serving his first full four year term as the mayor of the Village of Los Lunas.

Vialpando was appointed mayor in early 2009 when then-Mayor Louis Huning resigned due to illness. Vialpando ran for the office in March, 2010, and was elected mayor by the voters.

As he approaches his third year as mayor, Vialpando talks about his time in that office.

"I feel fortunate having the staff and department heads who serve at the village, especially village administrator Peter Fernandez," says Vialpando.

"When a citizen expresses a concern all I have to do is let the department head know and it is taken care of."

He adds that the village council works well together also which helps accomplish projects.

One of the village projects Vialpando is most proud of is the Transportation Center. "People from all over are impressed with the building," he says.

What is a difficult part of being mayor? Dealing with personnel issues, says Vialpando. He encourages these issues to be deeply investigated before decisions must be reached.

And the future for Los Lunas? Vialpando says he is looking forward to the construction of a west-side fire station. Staff is currently investigating funding sources for this construction.

He sees another Interstate 25 exit with a river crossing in the future to help alleviate some of the traffic problems on Main Street.

And there's the more utilitarian, a water line loop which will ensure water coming from the tap, even in an emergency situation.

Vialpando says he appreciates the support he receives from the citizens. "It's tough when we make decisions people don't like, but folks appreciate the work we do to make a better community."

Tips for Freezing Weather

The Los Lunas Water Department answered over 320 calls of frozen or broken water pipes during the February 2011 cold snap. Here's some prevention measures before weather turns cold:

- Wrap all exposed pipes located outside or in unheated areas of the home especially pipes that are in external walls or located in north side exposures.
- Remove garden hoses from outside faucets. Insulate outside faucets with styrofoam covers that can be purchased at hardware or home improvement stores.
- Cover vents around the foundation of your home where plumbing may be exposed.

Do NOT Flush These Items Down the Toilet

The Village provides water and wastewater service. The wastewater collection system conveys sewage to the treatment plant while maintaining an acceptable quality through the delivery process.

The Village Utility Department needs your help maintaining the quality of the sewage. The village system sometimes pumps waste to a higher elevation. Certain items in the pump lift station can cause damage to the equipment. The cost of repairs is paid

by the rate payers.

To avoid blockages and damages to private sewage pipes and the public system these items should not be flushed down the toilet: glass; metal; gravel, sand (Including aquarium stone) and coffee grinds; seafood shells; socks, rags or cloths; plastic; sanitary napkins or tampons; disposable diapers; kitty litter; explosives; flammable materials; lubricating oils, grease, cooking oil, paint and strong chemicals; and gasoline or diesel.

The Village of Los Lunas will host a recycling day Saturday, Nov. 5, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. The following will be collected:

- Electronics
- Cell Phones

- Paper - must be bagged
- Household Appliances
- Oil - must be free of water or other substances
- Cardboard - boxes must be flattened (Master Fibers)
- TVs - minimal charge for a 24" TV - \$5. Anything beyond that size will be \$10.
- Clothes
- Aluminum
- Metal
- Glass — must be in cardboard boxes
- Tires — no rims, no big tires (\$1.50/tire)
- Brass
- Steel
- Bicycles
- Copper
- Radiators
