Remember to Vote If You Are A Registered Voter in Districts 1 or 3

Early voting opened February 15 at the Village Administration Building, located at the intersection of Don Pasqual and Main Street. Registered voters in Council Districts One and Three may vote early from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on February 15 through March 2.

The polling site for the Tuesday, March 6, election is also the Village Administration Building where the polls will be open 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Only registered voters in Council Districts One and Three may vote in this election. The District One candidates are Helen Y. Cole and Amanda M. Perea. The District Three candidate is Gerard Saiz.

Being careful when putting the trash out creates a better looking and more livable Los Lunas.


Do not overfill trash cans. Excess trash may not go into the truck and end up on the street.

Los Lunas Annual Gross Receipts Tax Total




More than 200 Valencia County children, aged newborn to seventeen, are in protective custody with the New Mexico Children, Youth and Families Department (CYFD) due to abuse or neglect.

Both short and long term foster parents are needed for these children. Foster parents receive extensive support including reimbursement of monthly expenses, clothing allowance and medical coverage for the children, child care service if families work outside the home and other support.

Artistic Park Play Area Now ADA Accessible

The Artistic Park Playground, located at 901 Camino del Rey SW, has reopened after extensive renovations have made it safer and more accessible.

In 2009, the Village Council allocated \$20,000 to improve the playground structure and provide American Disabilities Act accessibility for all users. The project was planned in phases because additional financing was needed. In 2011, the money was secured to hire a certified playground contractor to install a fully 100 percent ADA accessible playground.

The playground is the first of this type in the Los Lunas park system. The floor material is made up of 100 percent recycled rubber. The rubber material is 18" x 18" tiles with a 3 inch sub cushion floor. This material reduces a head injury by absorbing the impact of a fall.

Michael Jaramillo, director of the village's Parks, Recreation and Street Department, invites all residents to visit the park.
