New Municipal Judge Excited About Job

The new Los Lunas Municipal Judge looks forward to the challenges of the position and to using his background to help him make decisions.

Henry L. Perea retired in 2010 having worked 24 years in the corrections industry.

After graduating from Los Lunas High School, Perea spent four years in the Air National Guard. He then went to work at what was then known as the Bernalillo County Detention Center.

The facility became the Metropolitan Detention Center. Perea stayed with the facility and worked his way up to Deputy Chief of Corrections, the position he was in when he retired.

"I'm very excited about the job as the municipal judge of Los Lunas," said Perea. He is the son of long-time Village Councilor Henry Perea.

Judge Perea points out he has been involved in Partners in Wellness, a helping organization housed in a building named for the judge's father which is located on Morris Road.

Medical Center Planned for LL; County Signs JPA with Belen

The Valencia County Commission voted in September to sign a Joint Powers Agreement with the City of Belen to commit all mill levy funds collected for a hospital in Valencia County to a facility in Belen.

This past summer Darin Miller, president of Oklahoma City-based Miller Architects, LLC, announced plans to build a hospital in Los Lunas called the Valencia Regional Medical Center.

A hospital / medical center in Los Lunas could be eligible for a portion of the mill levy funds.

In 2006 Valencia County voters approved a mill levy which would be used to operate a medical facility in the county. Collection of the tax began with the 2007 property tax bill.

Several other counties in New Mexico have a similar tax. Funding from Sandoval County's mill levy has been given to two medical facilities in the county -- Presbyterian's Rust Medical Center and UNM Sandoval Regional Medical Center.

No formal announcement has been made regarding a potential builder / provider of a hospital / medical center in Belen.

Darin Miller was in Valencia County in October to provide additional information about the progress of the Valencia Regional Medical Center including meeting with citizens in Los Lunas and Rio Communities.

The mill levy funds for a medical facility are under the control of the Valencia County Commission. The county commissioner representing most of Los Lunas is Mary Andersen. Other commissioners are Ron Gentry, Donald Holliday, Georgia Otero-Kirkham, and Lawrence Romero.

Village Council Plans For Future with ICIP

The Village Council has approved the Infrastructure Capital Improvement Plan (ICIP) for 2014-2017. What does that mean for the average citizen in Los Lunas? It means the council is planning for the future.

The ICIP is a list of projects that would improve life in the village if those projects are built. It is important to have the list ready should funding become available for the projects.

Funding comes from a variety of sources including legislative appropriations, grants, the village budget, and loans which are then repaid from the village budget.

Top projects for the upcoming budget year are —

- Expansion of the wastewater treatment plant;
- Construction of a westside fire substation;
- Building a water line loop east of the Rio Grande;
- Extension of Morris Road; and
- Reconstruction of Highway 314 south of Main Street.

Other projects include railroad crossing quiet zones, the Huning Ranch park, expansion of the Transportation Center, and park improvements to El Cerro de Los Lunas.

The form to Report a Crime will allow anyone to report something anonymously. However it is important to keep in mind that names are kept confidential if someone does sign off on the report.

Reports could be made about drug dealing, prostitution, or any other criminal activity that a person feels the Los Lunas Police Department should be made aware of.

Tips for Freezing Weather

The Los Lunas Water Department answers many calls regarding frozen or broken water pipes during the cold weather. Here's some prevention measures before the temperatures start dropping:

- Wrap all exposed pipes located outside or in unheated areas of the home, especially pipes in external walls or located on north side exposures.

- Remove garden hoses from outside faucets. Insulate outside faucets with styrofoam covers that can be purchased at hardware or home improvement stores.

- Cover vents around the foundation of your home where plumbing may be exposed.

Code Enforcement Division Helps Enhance Quality of Life

The Code Enforcement Division of the Village's Community Development Department enhances the quality of life and economy of Los Lunas by enforcing regulations that preserve and protect neighborhoods.

The division employs a building inspector/code enforcement supervisor and three code enforcement officers who are also trained as animal control officers.

They work together to investigate and prosecute violations dealing with the parts of the village's municipal code that cover signs, nuisances such as junk vehicles and lots with overgrown vegetation, housing standards, and adult entertainment, as well as residential and commercial zoning among other items.

Violations of the village ordinances regarding nuisances can include flat tires, dismantling of a vehicle, a wrecked vehicle, no licence plate on a vehicle, expired tags, and vegetation growing around vehicles.

Excessive growth of grass and weeds (four inches or higher) and accumulation of trash, junk, and debris may be considered a nuisance.

Code Enforcement deals with heavy trucks or vehicles parking on public streets which is prohibited. No vehicle over 80 inches in width may park on a public street for anything other than loading or unloading.

The Code Enforcement Division also deals with signs, building permits, animal control, and abatement of dangerous buildings.

To report a code violation call 505 839-3840 or go online at www.loslunasnm.gov. It is important to have a specific address, detailed description of the violation(s) and the time/date a violation takes place.
