## Renovations Around Main Street/Don Pasqual

If you're driving by the village administration building at Don Pasqual and Main Street over the next few months and wonder what's going on, here's what you need to know — the area is undergoing renovations that will make it more accessible and attractive.

The Village Council awarded a \$585,479 contract in early September to Altor Construction for concrete amenities and sidewalks as well as drainage, parking lot, and pedestrian improvements.

A second phase will add additional landscaping around the building and vicinity including new trees.

The first phase will enlarge the police department parking lot on the west side of the complex, repave the parking lot in the front of the building (southeast corner), and relocate the area for the flag poles.

Some of the improvements are being made in conjunction with the opening of the First Choice Family Health Care Center behind the Administration Building.

The Village recycling area remains by the Fred Luna Senior Citizen Center, located at 197 Don Pasqual NW. Items that can be recycled include newspapers, magazine, cardboard and plastics.

## New Facilities Improve Medical Care in Area

With the opening of the 21,582 square foot First Choice Community Health Care Center on Don Pasqual this month and the announcements of a clinic and a possible hospital in Los Lunas, the community is seeing improvements in medical care.

The First Choice Community Health Care received a grant for just over \$8.1 million to build and equip the facility. The funding was made available through the affordable health care act and was applied for through a capital development grant.

The new facility has 18 medical exam rooms, 10 dental rooms, and will provide mental health services. It is located north of the Village Administration Building.

Lovelace announced this summer that it expects to open a clinic in Los Lunas by January 1, 2013. The clinic would be accessible to anyone who is a member of the Lovelace Health Plan.

The opening of a clinic was prompted partially by the decision made by the Village Council to award the health coverage contract to Lovelace. The Village's 500 employees and their families are covered by Lovelace effective July 1, 2012.

An Oklahoma-based company, Miller Architects LLC, has said that it has the ability and funding to build an 80,000 to 90,000 square foot hospital in Los Lunas.

Darin Miller, president of the company, said that some of the major services the hospital will provide are between 30 and 40 inpatient beds, a 24-hour emergency facility with the necessary supportive services, an obstetrics unit, and surgery capabilities.

A spring ground breaking is possible with an estimated 18-month construction time table. It is possible the hospital could be open in January 2015.

No site or even general location has been announced for the hospital.

# **August Recycling Event Proves Very Successful**

The recycling event held August 18 by Keep Los Lunas Clean and Beautiful was a success with the following collected: cardboard, one ton; plastics, one-half ton; newspapers and similar products, one-half ton; metal/white goods, one-half ton; aluminum, fifty pounds; used oil, five gallons; car batteries, three; and 800 pounds of glass that was ground up.

Numerous electronic devices were collected by Enchantment Recycling and clothing items were also recycled.

A total of 116 vehicles went through the line on that clear and pleasant Saturday morning.

Many people enjoyed a lunch of cold drinks and hot dogs that day after finishing their work. Marie Marquez of the Keep Los Lunas Clean and Beautiful program coordinated the event. Other Village employees involved included Lori Kurtz, Adolph Lopez, Joe Garcia, Jason Marquez, Marcus Montoya, Joshua Chavez, Roberto Chavariz, David DeAnda and Tommy Gurule.

Marquez said that people's comments were: "these events are so nice," "it sure helps the community get rid of unwanted stuff," and "comes in handy for elderly people who can't drive far to recycle."

Small souvenirs prepared by Joshua Chavez of the Village's Solid Waste Department were passed out to participants. The souvenirs were a replica of a trash bin with recycling information.

Marquez thanked the recyclers who helped: Cemco Glass, Clothes Helping Kids and Enchantment Electronics. Thanks also go out to New Mexico Disposal for providing two large dumpsters for non recyclable trash.

The next recycling event, America Recycling Day, takes place November 17 from 8 a.m. to noon behind the Fred Luna Senior Citizen Center on Don Pasqual.

Given this definition, Los Lunas is making major strides toward establishing a leading community brand in New Mexico.

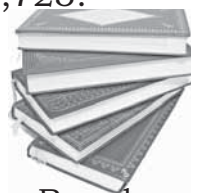
Branding is an ongoing process. It never sleeps, so to speak. These latest efforts are a good start toward building a recognized brand that everyone in the community will be proud of.

## Library G.O. Bond Issue “B” on November Ballot

If General Obligation Bond Issue B for \$9.7 million on the November 6, 2012, Ballot passes then the following money will come to our community libraries —

- The Los Lunas community library and its branch, the Museum of Heritage and Arts, will receive an estimated \$53,816.55.
- The Los Lunas School District libraries will receive an estimated \$64,723.
- Belen Public Library will receive an estimated \$43,573.
- Belen School District libraries will receive an estimated \$40,325.
- Bosque Farms public library will receive an estimated \$ 13,127.
- UNM/Valencia Campus library will receive an estimated \$21,514.



How does this affect you? The maximum size of the bonds is \$140.2 million. Based on current projections, the State Board of Finance estimates that this is the maximum bond size that can be issued while keeping the state property tax mill levy roughly flat at the current rate of 1.36 mills. If all three G.O. issues are approved by the voters in November 2012, the average cost to the owner of a property worth \$100,000 over a 10-year period will be \$8.04 per year. Of that \$8.04 average cost per year, \$6.88 is attributable to the higher education bond, \$0.59 to the senior facilities bond, and \$0.56 to the library acquisitions bond. Without voter approval of the bonds, the State property tax mill rate could be expected to decline slightly.

Los Lunas Library Director Cynthia Shetter points out that all libraries are providing more and more services in leaner times. Library services are essential to our community.

### **Grant Will Light Crime Scenes**

The Los Lunas Police Department received a grant in the amount of \$11,323 from the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program.

The grant funds will be used to purchase two state-of-the-art 3000 watt halogen platform electronic rise and pivot lights, which will be mounted on the top of the department's mobile command center and easily operated with the push of a button.

These lights will provide enough light to any crime scene so that officers can properly process the crime scenes and collect valuable pieces of evidence that may have been lost without the existence of the lighting. In addition, these lights will also be used during any special event or joint operation that may require the use of the mobile command center.

This lighting will provide an added safety feature for both citizens and officers working in or around the area of the command center.
