Support Still Needed for Valencia Regional Medical Center

Construction is still expected to start in summer 2014 with an anticipated opening date of winter 2015 for the Valencia Regional Medical Center (VRMC) on the west side of Los Lunas.

Information about VRMC is available on the village website at loslunasnm.gov/vrmc.

A mill levy has been collected in Valencia County since 2007 after voters approved the tax which is to be allocated to a hospital in Valencia County.

Allocation of mill levy funds to VRMC would result in a facility with more services. People are encouraged to contact Valencia County Commissioners to express support for allocating the mill levy to VRMC.

An easy way to communicate with Valencia County Commissioners is below.

The full \$55 million VRMC project would be 110,000 square feet with 85,000 square feet for a hospital and 25,000 square feet of clinic space. It is projected the full VRMC project would create 500 local construction jobs and 450 full-time medical jobs. The VRMC budget is estimated at \$40 million a year, including \$14 million for salaries and benefits.

Candidates File January 7; Election Held March 4

On Tuesday, January 7, 2014, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., candidates will file for office in the Village's municipal election. This is the only time that candidates may file so that the candidate's name appears on the ballot for the March 4, 2014, election.

Voters in the Village of Los Lunas will decide on a mayor and a municipal judge. Voters in Village Council Districts Two and Four will also be voting for a village councilor. All terms are for four years.

The certification of candidates will be completed by 5 p.m. Wednesday, January 8, with a list of candidates posted Thursday, January 9, by nine a.m. Candidates draw for ballot order Thursday, January 9, at five p.m..

Write-in candidates file Tuesday, January 14, between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. The names of write-in candidates do not appear on the ballot.

Certification of write-in candidates will be Wednesday, January 15, with the list of write-in candidates to be posted Thursday, January 16, by nine a.m. The last day to withdraw as a write-in candidate is Tuesday, January 28, also the first day to issue absentee ballots.

Voter registration closes Tuesday, February 4. Persons desiring to register should call the Valencia County Clerk's Bureau of Elections at 866-2080.

Early voting begins Wednesday, February 12, at the Village Administration Building, 660 Main Street NW, the corner of Main and Don Pasqual.

The last day for absentee ballots and early voting is Friday, February 28.

Election day is Tuesday, March 4, from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. The polling place is the Village Administration Building, 660 Main Street NW.

Only people living within the village limits of Los Lunas may vote in this election.

Warrant Amnesty for Municipal Court Defendants Ends Dec. 31

Anyone with a warrant issued by the Los Lunas Municipal Court can have it dismissed by appearing before the court and taking care of the original issues that led to the warrant. This must be done before Dec. 31.

Municipal Judge Henry Perea urges people not to take the risk of being apprehended in a warrant sweep or routine traffic stop during the holidays. A person with an outstanding warrant could be placed in the County jail, have a driver's license suspended, and be fined up to \$500.

Municipal Court takes place Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday at 10 a.m. or 1:30 p.m. (with the exception of observed holidays). This month Judge Perea will also conduct court Fridays at 10 a.m. or 1:30 p.m.

Judge Perea said, "I encourage people to take advantage of this opportunity to clear up a warrant before the holidays."

Recycling A Success

Although it was a dreary cold day, the America Recycling Event in Los Lunas was a success with 126 vehicles bringing recycling to the site on Don Pasqual.

Toss No Más t-shirts and car trash bags were given to those who brought recycling. Village employees Adolph Lopez, Jess Weston and Lori Kurtz, as well as Solid Waste Department employees, helped unload vehicles as they came through.

Clothes Helping Kids and New Mexico Computer Recycling took items for recycling.

The Village's glass crushing machine was busy the entire morning grinding 3,740 pounds of glass. Other recycling collected included 10 cubic yards of cardboard; five cubic yards of plastic; 500 pounds of metal; ten gallons of paint; three gallons of oil; 11 televisions; and three CRT monitors. A variety of clothing was also collected.

Volunteers and staff enjoyed hot dogs grilled by Community Services Director Michael Jaramillo.

Cleanups Change Schedule; Special Events for 2014

Village cleanups will be held on the following dates in 2014: January 11; March 15 in conjunction with the Great American Recycling Event; May 17; September 27 in conjunction with the Toss No Más Event; and November 15 with the American Recycling Event.

Keep Los Lunas Clean & Beautiful is coordinating the special events in the Village while the Parks, Recreation and Streets under the Community Service Department is coordinating the cleanups.

Renew Business Registrations Now

If you are operating a business in Los Lunas then it is time to renew your business registration or to purchase that registration, says Community Development Director Christina Ainsworth.

All businesses, whether Mom and Pop or multi-national, pay the same fee, \$25.

Registrations should be filed before December 31.

Registration is required for "all persons, firms, corporations or associations of any character engaged in any of the various pursuits, businesses or occupations."

Registrations are renewed annually. Village staff send out reminder letters in the latter part of the year to make it easier to renew.

Officers Supplied Survival Shields

The Los Lunas Police Department is the first police department in the country to purchase and deploy OS2 Officer Survival Shields.

Shields have been issued to all first-line police officers, supervisors and detectives in the department to increase the level of officer safety.

The shields will be used in conjunction with firearms, expandable batons, Tasers and OC spray training. Officers will use the shields in many different situations that they encounter on a daily basis.

Benefits of the shields include increased officer safety and protection, easy to deploy, provide additional protection, can be used by multiple officers, and only weighs three pounds.

LiveWork Meets Four Times in 2014

LiveWork Los Lunas will meet four times in 2014 — Feb. 18, May 20; August 19; and November 18.

Anyone is welcome to attend LiveWork meetings at the Los Lunas Transportation Center, corner of Courthouse and Juan Perea Roads, from six to 7:30 p.m. to learn about starting or improving a home-based or mobile business.

Holiday Safety Tips

Cooking and eating seem second nature during the holiday season. Here's fire prevention tips from Fire Marshal Jason Gonzales of the Los Lunas Fire Department to keep you safe.

- Never leave cooking unattended.
- Cuff sleeves and turn pot handles inward when cooking to avoid burn injuries.
- If your clothes catch fire, Stop, Drop, Roll.
- Never store combustibles in an oven or on top of the stove.
- When barbecuing, move the unit away from the house even in winter.
- Dispose of coals and ashes in metal containers, not in the Village's garbage containers.
