Mill Levy Funds Mean More Hospital Services

If the Valencia County Commission decides to allocate the hospital mill levy funds to Valencia Regional Medical Center in Los Lunas then VRMC will have the following additional services:

- Outreach programs for all Valencia County;
- Satellite facilities outside of Los Lunas in the county;
- Women's birthing services;
- Full service cafeteria and restaurant;
- Rehabilitation services;
- Increased inpatient hospital beds;
- Increased education programs held at VRMC;
- Increased overall services at the facility;
- Increased recruitment of speciality physicians to enhance services; and
- Additional physical facilities.

Construction is expected to start in summer 2014 on the facility which will be located west of Interstate 25.

A decision by the Valencia County Commission to allocate the hospital mill levy funds to VRMC would mean the additional and increased services could be included in the plans right from the start.

Contacting Valencia County Commissioners regarding the disbursement of the mill levy continues to be important for the medical center in Los Lunas.

To the left are instructions for an easy way to communicate with Valencia County Commissioners about supporting Valencia Regional Medical Center in Los Lunas with the mill levy funds approved by Valencia County voters in 2006.

None of these funds have been spent on any medical facility in the county although the money has been collected since 2007.

The full \$55 million VRMC project would be 110,000 square feet with 85,000 square feet for a hospital and 25,000 square feet of clinic space. It is projected the full project would create 500 local construction jobs and 450 full-time medical jobs. The annual budget is estimated at \$40 million, including \$14 million for salaries and benefits.

May Great Cleanup Month!

A total of 282 bags of trash were picked up in Los Lunas during May thanks to the help of several groups.

In early May 128 bags were picked up for the Keep Los Lunas Clean & Beautiful program. Then an individual performed community service hours by cleaning the I-25 ramps collecting 20 bags of trash. He cleaned other areas with 47 bags picked up.

An unidentified group conducted a cleanup on North Hwy #314 with 12 bags picked up.

Participants of the New Mexico Men's Recovery Academy Group picked up 54 bags of trash.

A community cleanup was held at the Huning Ranch Subdivision where 17 people helped as well as village staff with 21 bags of trash collected. Lunch was served at the Huning Ranch Park.
