Presentation Describes Valencia Medical Center

Darin Miller of Miller Development + Architecture described in detail the Valencia Regional Medical Center (VRMC) at a Feb. 20 Valencia County Commission meeting.

The presentation included renderings of the 110,000 square foot facility which would include 30 to 40 in-patient hospital beds, clinic space, an obstetrics unit, MRI and CT scan services, and an outpatient surgical unit.

The commission controls mill levy funds which could be committed to VRMC which is to be constructed west of Interstate 25.

The primary factor in making the medical center a reality for Valencia County and its residents is the commitment of the approximately \$14 million in hospital mill levy funds by the Valencia County Commission to the VRMC project.

The county commissioner representing most of Los Lunas is Mary Andersen. Other commissioners are Alicia Aguilar, Charles Eaton, Donald Holliday and Lawrence Romero. Letters of support for the medical center can be sent to the commission.

Home Building on Upswing in Village

National statistics show home building is on the upswing and Los Lunas is now part of those positive statistics.

New homes are now being sold in Rancho Valencia subdivision, located in the southwest part of the Village.

Morningstar Homes will build in the Casitas area of Rancho Valencia while Twilight Homes will be in the Haciendas section.

The Casitas homes will be 1,000 to 2,245 square feet and start in the \$90,000 range. The Haciendas homes will be 1,465 to 2,516 square feet and start at \$175,990.

Police Acquire \$50,000 in Parts

The Los Lunas Police Department has acquired \$50,000 worth of brand new spare parts for the department's Mamba Armored Tactical SWAT 12-passenger transport vehicle.

The parts were acquired at zero cost through the federal/state 1033 transfer program and included a diesel engine, transmission front and rear axles, front and rear springs, air conditioning condenser and evaporator, and 6 wheels.

These parts are exclusively manufactured for the Village's armored vehicle and will keep the vehicle running indefinitely, said Police Chief Roy Melnick.

The police department acquired the SWAT vehicle in April 2012 from the New Mexico State Police replacing the department's outdated, less reliable Chevy van SWAT vehicle with over 140,000 miles with no armor plating or glass.

The current Mamba SWAT vehicle has only 21,000 miles, and is armor plated, bomb proof, and bullet proof with armored glass. The sticker on the window when Los Lunas received the vehicle showed a value of \$380,000.

Further, this success creates greater attention from name-brand companies and new residents to consider Los Lunas as a future home for their businesses, a win/win for all of us.

Fire Department Conducts Fire Hydrant Maintenance

Los Lunas residents will see Village firefighters in their neighborhoods over the next months as the department conducts fire hydrant maintenance.

The goal of the program is maintaining public fire hydrants in a ready condition through flushing, inspection, lubricating, cleaning, and painting as recommended by the National Fire Protection Association. Hydrants needing repairs are reported to the water department for the necessary follow up.

Hydrant maintenance insures hydrants function correctly. Fire engines hold a maximum of five to six minutes of water for fighting fires. An improperly or non-functioning hydrant might cause an engine to run out of water which could endanger the lives of firefighters and increase the amount of fire damage.

The flushing of the hydrant sometimes results in a discoloration of the water coming from the tap which is caused by the water rushing through the pipe walls and dislodging sediment. The water is still bacteriologically safe even though there might be a discoloration.

If you see the discoloration then please be patient for 12 hours. If the water doesn't clear within 12 hours then call the water department at 839-3841.

Firefighters will still respond to any fire or medical calls that may occur while maintenance is taking place.

The firefighters will work in groups of two or four to facilitate emergency response. They usually work in two or four. For example, at a structure fire two firefighters operate the nozzle, maneuver the hose and enter the building while another firefighter operates the pump and a fourth firefighter commands the scene.

The Village currently has over 1,000 hydrants located throughout the municipal boundaries.
