

Council Looks to Community's Future With ICIP

The Village Council has approved the Infrastructure Capital Improvement Plan (ICIP) for 2015-2019 and that means the council, as well as Village staff, are planning for the future of the community

The ICIP is a list of projects that would improve life in the village if those projects are built. It is important to have the list ready should funding become available for the projects.

Planning Continues For Medical Center in Los Lunas

Planning of the design for the Valencia Regional Medical Center (VRMC) on the west side of Los Lunas continues by Darin Miller and his team of Miller Development + Architecture. Construction is expected to start in summer 2014 with an anticipated opening date of winter 2015.

A mill levy has been collected in Valencia County since 2007 after voters approved the tax which is to be allocated to a hospital in Valencia County.

Allocation of mill levy funds to VRMC would result in a facility with more services including birthing services as well as satellite services throughout the county.

People are encouraged to contact Valencia County Commissioners to express support for allocating the mill levy to VRMC.

An easy way to communicate with Valencia County Commissioners about supporting allocation of mill levy funds to the Valencia Regional Medical Center is below. No funds have been spent on any medical facility in the county.

Lovelace Health System has agreed to manage the new facility and its programs. Miller is working with Lovelace Health System on reviewing area studies about medical and hospital care to map out construction without mill levy support.

The full \$55 million VRMC project would be 110,000 square feet with 85,000 square feet for a hospital and 25,000 square feet of clinic space. It is projected the full VRMC project would create 500 local construction jobs and 450 full-time medical jobs. The VRMC budget is estimated at \$40 million a year, including \$14 million for salaries and benefits.

Funding comes from a variety of sources including legislative appropriations, grants, the village budget, and loans which are then repaid from the village budget.

Top projects for the 2015 budget year are —

- Capacity expansion of the wastewater treatment plant;
- Construction of a westside fire substation;
- Building a water line loop east of the Rio Grande;
- Extension of Morris Road; and
- Reconstruction of Highway 314 south of Main Street.

Other 2015 budget year projects include railroad crossing quiet zones, the Huning Ranch park, expansion of the Transportation Center, and park improvements to El Cerro de Los Lunas.

Police Awarded Bulletproof Vest Money

The Los Lunas Police Department has been awarded \$2,273 from the Bulletproof Vest Partnership (BVP) initiative.

BVP is a unique United States Department of Justice program designed to provide a critical resource to state and local law enforcement.

The program reimburses police departments up to fifty percent of the cost of body armor.

Police Chief Roy Melnick points out that "body armor is important to the safety of the officers of the Los Lunas Police Department. Officers may be faced with a deadly force encounter and having body armor could be the difference between life and death."

Village Voters Go To The Polls in March

All registered voters who live in the village limits may vote for the position of mayor and judge in the March 2014 municipal election. Registered voters in Council Districts Two and Four will also be voting for a village councilor in their districts.

You may only vote in this election if you are a registered voter in the village limits of Los Lunas.

People often believe that if their address is Los Lunas then they are in the village limits. This is not true. For instance, a person living in Meadow Lake in the foothills of the Manzano Mountains does not live in the village limits. Neither does someone in Tome east of the Rio Grande and south of Tome Hill.

If you are not registered to vote then contact the Bureau of Elections at the Valencia County Clerk's office, located in the Valencia County Administration building on Luna Avenue, or phone 866-2080.

Heating Tips To Keep Everyone Safe

Temperatures are dropping and heating homes and businesses will be important the next months. Here's some heating tips as part of the continuing series on fire prevention.

- Keep space heaters at least three feet away from all combustibles.
- Never leave space heaters unattended, turn them off while sleeping.
- Replace furnace filters regularly.
- Never use ovens or cook stoves for heating buildings.
- Clean lint from clothes dryers.
- Install a spark screen on fireplace openings.
- Have chimneys inspected and/or cleaned yearly.
- Install a spark arrester on the chimney.
- Burn only clean, dry firewood.
- Dispose of ashes in metal containers and water soak.
- Keep newspapers, other combustibles, and clutter away from water heaters and/or furnaces.

Remember that October is Fire Prevention Month.


