

Fire Prevention and Safety

Be Safe in Your Home and/or Business

This year's Fire Prevention Week is October sixth through twelfth with a focus on preventing kitchen fires, but Village Fire Inspector Jason Gonzales wants everyone to be safe from fire in their home and/or business.

More fires start in the kitchen than in any other part of the home, but practicing an E.D.I.T.H. (Exit Drill In The House) can help keep people safe in any building, whether occupied as a home or business.

E.D.I.T.H. involves

- Developing a home or business escape plan that includes two exits out of every room and having an outside meeting place such as a tree or mailbox.

- Practicing the escape plan with everyone who occupies the building.

- Using the nearest safe exit to escape.

- Escaping and then exiting away from any smoke.

- Crawling low to exit if a room is filled with smoke.

- Making sure everyone occupying the building knows how to call 9-1-1 in an emergency which includes stating your name, location, and the type of emergency.

Hospital planning continues as lawsuits are filed, adjudicated

The Village of Los Lunas has filed a complaint in 13th Judicial District Court against the Valencia County Commission and the City of Belen. The complaint was filed in response to the commission's decision to award mill levy funds to a health-care provider chosen by the City of Belen.

Village Attorney Larry Guggino contends that the New Mexico Hospital Funding Act does not allow the county to enter into a contract with a municipality when the county and the municipality are not going to jointly build or jointly operate a hospital or the city is not already operating a hospital.

In a separate lawsuit, 13th Judicial District Court Judge Violet Otero granted the Village of Los Lunas's motion to dismiss the City of Belen's request for an injunction against Los Lunas.

In April, Los Lunas councilors approved a resolution supporting a hospital in the Village. The resolution presented a side by side comparison of the Village's project and that of a competing hospital in Belen.

Belen then filed an injunction against the Village in an attempt to halt the distribution of the resolution, saying there was "blatantly false and misleading information in the document about the city's hospital project."

However, the court ruled that the resolution was legal and dismissed the lawsuit.

Darin Miller of Miller Development + Architecture and his team continue to plan and design Valencia Regional Medical Center (VRMC) on the west side of Los Lunas. Construction is expected to start in summer 2014 with an opening date of winter 2015.

Allocation of mill levy funds to VRMC in Los Lunas would result in a facility with more services including birth-

ing services as well as satellite services in the county.

The mill levy has been collected in Valencia County since 2007 after voters approved the mill levy which is to be allocated to a hospital in Valencia County.

People are encouraged to contact Valencia County Commissioners to express support for allocating the mill levy to VRMC.

An easy way to communicate with Valencia County Commissioners about supporting allocation of mill levy funds to the Valencia Regional Medical Center is below. No funds have been spent on any medical facility in the county.

Lovelace Health System has agreed to manage the new facility and its programs. Miller is working with Lovelace Health System on reviewing area studies about medical and hospital care to map out construction without mill levy support.

The full \$55 million VRMC project would be 110,000 square feet with 85,000 square feet for a hospital and 25,000 square feet of clinic space. It is projected the full VRMC project would create 500 local construction jobs and 450 full-time medical jobs. The VRMC budget is estimated at \$40 million a year, including \$14 million for salaries and benefits.

Police Acquire Vehicle To Help in SWAT Situations

The Los Lunas Police Department has acquired a vehicle at no cost for the SWAT Team from the Department of Defense DLA Disposition Services 1033 Federal Transfer Program.

The vehicle is a 2007 International MaxxPro Mine Resistant Anti-Ambush Protected (MRAP) with 8,300 miles, sticker value at \$658,000. The vehicle can withstand attacks from up to 50 caliber rifles and can transport up to six officers in the rear and two officers in the front.

This is the second vehicle the Los Lunas Police Department acquired from the 1033 Federal Transfer Program. In April 2012, the Los Lunas Police Department received their first SWAT vehicle, a 1996 Mamba with 21,000 miles on it, valued at \$380,000.

\$1 Invested in Public Library Yields \$5 Return

A recently completed Return on Investment study for the Los Lunas Public Library and its branch library, the Museum of Heritage & Arts, shows that for every \$1 invested in the library there is a \$5 return.

The study was based on the concept of what it would cost if library patrons purchased the materials and services themselves. The study was prepared utilizing the figures in the library's fiscal 2012-2013 year.

An example of this cost is that 22,523 adult hardcover books were borrowed at an average retail value of \$26.95 for a value of service of \$606,995.

A complete list of library services and their value as well as myriad other information are available in the Village of Los Lunas Public Library annual report available at the Village website, loslunasnm.gov under the library's section of the site.

The report also includes how the community uses the library and museum, what the library does for patrons, where the library gets its money, how the operational expenditures stack up compared to other local libraries, photos and information about the library's summer programs for kids, library online resources, membership policies, and information about what the museum has done.

The Los Lunas Solid Waste Division has a registered recycling drop off center at 197 Don Pasqual, north of the Fred Luna Multi-Generational Center. The drop off center is maintained Monday through Friday 7 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Trash is not to be left at the center. **No needles or syringes of any kind should be dropped off.** Items recycled at the center are:

- Cardboard (please break down)
- Plastics of all kinds (number one to seven)
- Paper products of all kinds
- Aluminum
- All metals
- Computers and all electrical devices
- TV's (there is a disposal charge of \$15 per set to help with the cost of removing heavy toxic metals).

Glass is ground once a month at the recycling center on scheduled weekends only.
