Martin arrived in Los Lunas in April 2012 after serving as city manager in St. Johns, Arizona, and assistant town manager in Strasburg, Virginia.

He attended school at Brigham Young University in Provo, Utah, where he earned a bachelor's degree in Spanish Translation and a master's degree in Public Administration.


and served as one of the department's public information officers.



- Keep lawns and weeds mowed a minimum of 50 feet surrounding buildings, as well as cleaning up debris and clutter from that radius on in to the building.

Make sure buildings, houses, and businesses have street numbers that are clearly visible from the street to help find you, a family member, office mate or neighbor.

Valencia County voters will be able to vote wherever is convenient in the June 3, 2014 Primary Election with a choice of 14 voting centers throughout the county.


