Interstate 25 Beautification

Entering Los Lunas from Interstate 25 at mile marker 203, both north and southbound, will be much more interesting when the interstate beautification project is completed.

Construction is set to begin in Fall 2014 and incorporates a metal tree sculpture (indicating the importance of agriculture to Los Lunas) with the Village's new welcome sign (these attractive signs can now be seen at the Village limits). Located at the interstate's off-ramps, both north and southbound, new landscaping will be placed around the welcome tree sculptures.

Metal artwork with neon lighting will be installed on both sides of the bridge, which will present the Village's slogan, "Small Community. Big Possibilities." People driving along the interstate will become better acquainted with what the Village has to offer.



This is Phase One of the project to beautify the entry ways to Los Lunas. This phase will cost \$1.2 million with funding primarily from the federal government through the State Transportation Department.

The Village is seeing additional funding for Phase Two which will include additional sculptures, landscaping and other improvements to the on-ramps for Interstate 25 leaving Los Lunas, both north and southbound.

Village Projects Will Improve The Community

The Village's slogan "Small Community. Big Possibilities." comes alive when we talk about the millions of dollars worth of projects to be accomplished in our community.

Many of the projects have been funded, and will be completed or started during the 2014-2015 budget year, which began July 1, 2014.

The Village's wastewater treatment plant capacity will be expanded with the installation of a second set of cassettes in the membrane bioreactor (MBR) facility. This facility uses a combination of a membrane process like microfiltration or ultrafiltration with a suspended growth bioreactor, state-of-the-art technology widely used in municipal wastewater treatment plants. Project cost is \$1.9 million.

We appreciate your patience and understanding as we make these improvements. Please use caution around construction crews.

The Carson Drive job has been awarded to Star Paving, and includes new traffic signs, roadway markings, center turn lane, and a mill with inlay. Desert Fox LLC has the contract for the Los Cerritos project between Main Street and Highline Road. It includes sidewalk and pavement improvements as well as new striping.

Recreational areas or buildings scheduled to undergo improvements include the Trans-

portation Center (\$1.2 million), Fred Luna Multigenerational Center (\$600,000), River Park (\$92,000), the Sports Complex on Morris Road (\$235,000), and the remainder of \$475,000 in improvements to Enchantment Little League Fields started last year.

Other projects the Village is working on include upgrading the Village wells (\$304,200), purchasing a recycling commercial bailer (\$345,000), fleet maintenance fuel system line compliance (\$50,000) and digital pump system (\$55,000), regional vital communications project (\$125,000); new fire department exhaust and extraction system (\$40,000), digester cleaning project (\$134,000), purchase of a glass grinder for recycling (\$130,000), and artistic landscaping enhancements to the I-25 interchange at Main Street (\$1.4 million). As you can see it will be another busy fiscal year but we are excited about the progress we are making and appreciate your patience and understanding as we make these improvements. We remind you to please use caution around construction crews.

Museum Features Saints and Orphans

Old ways meet new to express over 400 years of Hispanic New Mexican devotional art in “Our Saints Among Us.” The exhibit is scheduled to open July 12 through October 25 at the Museum of Heritage and Arts, located at the corner of Main Street and Luna Avenue.

The exhibit is derived from the private collection of Barbe Awalt and Paul Rhetts. It includes works in the forms of santos, retablos, bultos, colcha, tinwork, and other media that depicts saints and other traditional themes. More than 24 artists from New Mexico will be featured.

Novelist and Humanities Scholar Alison Moore, along with singer/songwriter Phil Lancaster, combine audio-visual elements, historical fiction, and musical ballads into a collaborative performance that brings the Orphan Train movement alive. This event takes place Saturday, July 26 at 7 p.m. at the Los Lunas Transportation Center, located at the corner of Juan Perea and Courthouse Roads.

The multimedia presentation tells the story of the 250,000 orphans and unwanted children, who were put on trains in New York between 1854 and 1929 being sent all over the United States to be given away. The presentation is sponsored by the Village Museum of Heritage and Arts.

The museum continues its Crafts for Kids Wednesday series in July.

The veterans also met with elected officials from our state while in Washington, D.C.

A special presentation about this event was made to the Village Council in May.

The Honor Flight Network program flies veterans to Washington, D.C., where they tour the World War II Memorial, Arlington National Cemetery, the Iwo Jima Memorial, the National Vietnam Veterans Wall, and the Korean War Veterans Memorial.

Survey Shows Community Business Preferences

Nearly 400 people have answered the Village's economic development survey about what businesses people would like to see in the community.

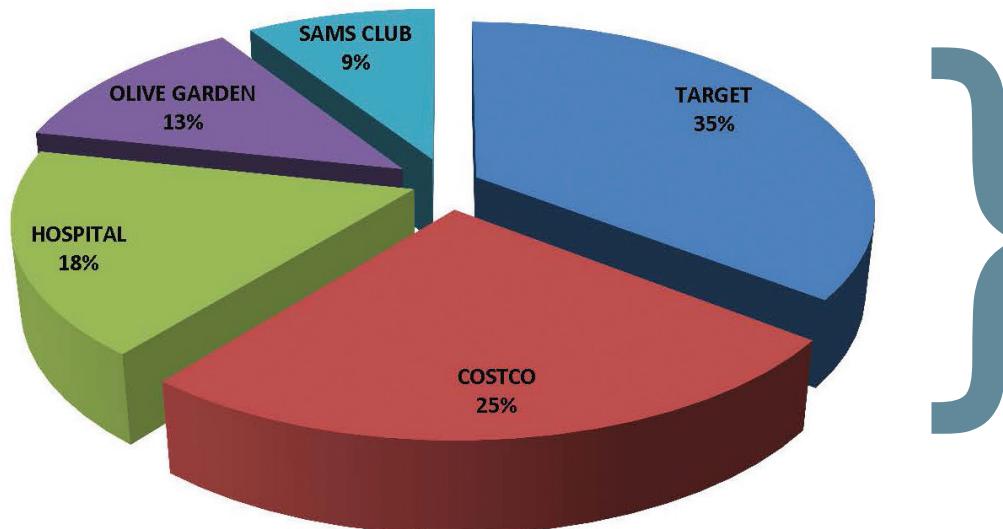
Here are the results so far:

- **Restaurants** - Olive Garden, 35%; Golden Corral, 20%, Red Lobster, 18%; Furr's, 14%; & Flying Star, 13%.

- **Clothing** - Kohl's, 34%; Ross, 25%; Target, 17%; JC Penney, 19%; & Old Navy, 11%.
- **Supermarkets** - Trader Joe's, 34%; Whole Foods, 32%; Sprouts, 22%; Costco, 7%; & Target with pharmacy/grocery, 5%.
- **Ethnic Restaurants** - Italian, 56%; Greek, 22%; East Indian 9%; Chinese, 7%; and Asian/Thai, 6%.
- **Fast Food** - Chic-Fil-A, 37%; Long John Silver's, 17%; Church's Chicken, 16%; Whataburger, 15%; & Dairy Queen, 15%.

- **Quick Take Out** - Einstein Bros. Bagels, 32%; Keva Juice, 25%; Wing Stop, 15%; Wing Basket, 13%; & Satellite Coffee, 11%.
- **Health Care** - hospital or emergency room, 64%; 24-hour urgent care, 28%; UNM clinic or clinics, 5%; pediatric urgent care, 2%; & Lovelace Women's Health, 1%.
- **Educational** - CNM, 40%; UNM branch, 28%; Sylvan Learning Center, 13%; swimming natatorium, 10%; & vocational school, 9%.
- **Cultural Centers** - museum, 27%; night/dance club, 25%; gallery/art, 22%; jazz club, 15%; & library expansion, 11%.
- **Big Box Stores** - Costco, 34%; Target, 34%; Sam's Club, 21%; Cabela's, 6%; & Bass Pro Shop, 5%.
- **Manufacturing** - solar, 34%; wind energy plant, 19%; cabinet manufacturing, 17%; automotive, 16%; & Tesla, 14%

Top Five - Target, 35%; Costco, 25%; hospital, 18%; Olive Garden, 13%; & Sam's Club 9%.
