## Scouts, Employees Improve Recycling Center


## Do Not Block These Intersections

In an effort to improve traffic flow on Main Street (NM Highway 6) between Don Pasqual and Highway 314, the New Mexico Department of Transportation has put up Do Not Block Intersection signs to facilitate people turning left or wanting to enter Main Street.

The Do Not Block Intersection signs tell motorists to leave the area clear at the Main Street intersections with Sichler and Sandoval on the south side of Main Street and Munoz on the north side. An additional Do Not Block area is the west entrance to The Luna Mansion.

These signs are up on Main Street and motorists should already be leaving these intersections open to help with the traffic flow.

The Do Not Block Intersection signs are not time sensitive so the intersections should be left clear at any time of the day or night.

# Bond B Helps Libraries

General Election Day is Tuesday, November 4, and included on the ballot is General Obligation Bond “B” which would add \$261,242 to the budgetary coffers of Valencia County libraries, says Los Lunas Public Library Director Cynthia Shetter.


If passed, Bond “B” would allocate \$10.8 million for New Mexico libraries. State sources estimate that the actual cost to taxpayers for Bond “B” is \$0.65 per \$100,000 of the assessed value of a home.

The Los Lunas Public Library would receive \$53,164 if Bond “B” passes, Los Lunas School District, \$77,501; UNM-Valencia Campus Library, \$25,547; Bosque Farms Public Library, \$12,911; Belen Public Library, \$44,974; and Belen Consolidated School District, \$47,145.

The Village Council passed a resolution supporting Bond B at its Sept. 25 meeting.

Library Director Shetter points out that in just one day in the 77 public libraries in New Mexico:

- 23,159 people walk through the doors;
- 25,271 books, movies, DVDs, and more are borrowed;
- 4,641 people use computers; and
- 3,737 reference questions are answered.
