More Jobs Coming to Los Lunas

At a ground breaking ceremony for Accurate Machine & Tool Company held in late August, Governor Susana Martinez announced 250 well-paying jobs will be coming to the Los Lunas area at the company.

Accurate Machine & Tool Company is moving from Albuquerque to Purple Sage Road in Los Morros Business Park west of Interstate 25.

The company manufactures metal tool components, precision medical products, custom one-of-a-kind products, and does on-the-spot machining.

Accurate also works on weapons for the United States military and is one of very few companies in the country which does so.



The Village Council is expected to approve revenue bonding worth up to \$30 million which will help Accurate Machine & Tool Company construct, equip and operate a 107,500 square foot manufacturing plant. Jobs are expected to pay an average of \$18 per hour.

Industrial revenue bonds have to be created and organized under a sponsoring government, but that government, in this case Los Lunas, is not responsible for bond repayments.

Company officials say the 250 jobs will be created within five to seven years. Construction of the new building is expected to create additional temporary jobs.

The company was looking at moving to Amarillo, Texas, but state officials developed a package to keep Accurate Machine & Tool Company in New Mexico.

The package includes a \$400,000 Local Economic Development Act grant and lower tax incentives along with eligibility for job training reimbursements.

New Canine and Handler

Los Lunas Police Detective Santiago Beyal has been selected as the new canine handler for the department.

Beyal graduated from Los Lunas High School in 1999 and enlisted in the U.S. Army. He served two tours in Iraq and, upon his return, joined the Los Lunas Police Department where he is now a seven-year veteran. He

climbed the ranks from patrol to detective, a position he has held for the last three years.

Beyal has served on the department's SWAT team as team sniper. He holds an associate's degree in criminal justice.

He replaces recently retired Horacio Deanda who served as canine handler since October 2009 with his canine partner, Ricky. Ricky

has been decommissioned and is now the property of Deanda.

The new canine is being purchased through K-9 Services in Edgewood. The canine has not been selected yet, but will be a dual purpose canine, used for tracking and apprehension along with narcotics detection.

Courthouse Road Work

Work begins soon on improvements to Courthouse Road after the Village Council awarded a \$749,757 contract to G. Sandoval Construction for the job.

The project consists of landscaping, American Disability Act sidewalk accessibility, bicycle lane improvements, benches and trash receptacles as well as new traffic signs and roadway improvements.

The New Mexico Department of Transportation and the Federal Highway Administration granted the Village \$772,472 for Courthouse Road improvements.

ICIP Plans for Village Future

The Infrastructure Capital Improvement Plan (ICIP) for 2016-2020 has been approved by the Village Council and that means the Council, as well as Village staff, are planning for the future of the community.

The ICIP lists projects that would improve life in the Village if those projects are built. This list must be reviewed every year so that the Village is ready should funding become available for any of these projects.

Funding comes from a variety of sources including legislative appropriations, grants, the village budget, and loans which are then repaid from the village budget.

Top projects for the 2016 budget year are —

- Capacity expansion of the wastewater treatment plant;
- Construction of a westside fire substation;
- Building a water line loop east of the Rio Grande;
- Extension of Morris Road; and
- Reconstruction of Highway 314 south of Main Street.

Other 2016 budget year projects include improvements to Huning Ranch Park and the Museum of Heritage & Arts, railroad crossing quiet zones; and construction of Phase Three at the Transportation Center.
