G.O. BOND, TWO COUNCIL DISTRICTS ON MARCH 1, 2016 ELECTION BALLOT

Voters in the Village will be able to vote on a General Obligation bond question while voters in Council Districts One and Three will also elect one councilor in each district on March 1, 2016.

The bond issue question is “shall the Village of Los Lunas issue up to \$5,795,000 of general obligation bonds, to be repaid from property taxes, for the purpose of providing fire protection, including purchasing apparatus for fire protection and providing, enlarging, and improving fire protection equipment and facilities?”

The village has had construction of a new fire station on a 2.6-acre village-owned site on Sand Sage, located west of Interstate 25, as a priority for years.

In addition, Village Fire Chief John Gabaldon says the village needs to

purchase a fire truck with more aerial capabilities.

Because General Obligation bonds affect property taxes, nonresidents who own property within the Village limits are eligible to vote on the G.O. Bond question on Election Day.

However, they must contact the Valencia County Clerk to express their desire and certify their eligibility to vote.

VILLAGE STREETS TO BE IMPROVED

Franklin's Earthmoving Inc. will be working on the following Village streets:

- Garden Avenue Southwest
- Wanda Court Southwest
- Reeves Place Southwest
- Los Cerritos Road Northwest (north of Highline Street)

Ten bids were received for the roadwork ranging from \$289,000 to \$414,297. Franklin's was low bidder.

VILLAGE DISPOSES OF ITEMS

The Village periodically disposes of items that are obsolete, not usable, damaged, or worn out.

These items range from bulldozers to police cars to much smaller items, and everything in between. Many items go up for public auction. Others are disposed of in a variety of ways, including as scrap, such as a burnt bulldozer.

Shopping in Los Lunas helps the community provide the services that keeps our community thriving.

More than fifty percent of the Village's general fund revenues are generated through gross receipts tax and property tax revenue.

The general fund pays for the services people depend on including the police and fire departments, municipal court, library and museum, parks and recreation, community development, and streets, as well as many others.

NOVEMBER RECYCLING EVENT

The Village's November American Recycling event resulted in the collection of a variety of recyclables.

Keep Los Lunas Clean & Beautiful partnered with the Village Solid Waste and Fleet Maintenance Division to make sure the 152 vehicles with recyclables were handled efficiently.

ITEMS RECYCLED INCLUDED:

- Cardboard - 10 bins, which equals 2,500 pounds (4 cubic yards)
- Plastic - 5 bins, which equals 600 pounds (4 cubic yards)
- Glass - 2 bins, which equals 736 pounds (2 cubic yards)
- Metal - 4 cubic yards
- TVs -13
- Motor Oil - 22 gallons
- Paint - 49 gallons
- Car Batteries - 2 batteries
- Household cleaners - 3 gallons
- Clothes Helping Kids collected 370 pounds of clothing.
