## Housing Survey Results

**The results of a survey conducted to find out the public perception of housing issues in Valencia County have been released.**

The survey was also designed to supplement a housing needs assessment of Valencia County.

The survey was conducted electronically and by paper with 458 surveys tallied. The paper surveys were handed out at area schools, senior centers, and other establishments.

Forty-one percent of respondents live in Los Lunas with the others spread out across the county. The other communities include Bosque Farms, 17%; Belen, 14%; El Cerro-Monterey Park, 13%; and Valencia, 11%.

Communities with less than ten percent are Meadow Lake, Rio Communities, Casa Colorado, Rio Communities-North, Tome-Adelino, Peralta, Jarales, and Los Chavez.

Some survey questions and responses are:

- How many people live in your house? One or two people, 44%; three to four, 37%; and more than five, 19%.



- What is your annual income? Over \$50,000, 26%; less than \$15,000, 23%; \$15,001-\$20,000 and \$30,001-\$40,000, both 14%; \$20,001-30,000, 13%; and \$40,0001-\$50,000, 9%.
- What type of home do you live in? Single family, 57%; mobile/manufactured home, 36%; townhouse, 4%; and apartment, 3%.
- What do you pay per month in mortgage or rent? Both less than \$300 and more than \$900 had 23%; \$501-600, 13%; \$601-\$700, 11%; \$300-\$400, 10%; \$701-800, 9%; \$801-\$900, 7%; and \$401-\$500, 4%.
- Do you own or rent your home? Own, 76%; and rent, 24%.
- If you rent, are you interested in buying a home? Yes, 49%; no, 51%.
- Is anyone disabled in your household? Yes, 24%; no, 76%.
- Are there any seniors living in your household? Yes, 43%; no, 57%.
- Is there a lack of affordable housing in Los Lunas/Valencia County for renters? Yes, 37%; no, 5%; and don't know, 58%.
- Is there a lack of affordable housing in Los Lunas/Valencia County for owners? Yes, 31%; no, 10%; and don't know, 59%.

Survey results will be incorporated into the Los Lunas/Valencia County Affordable Housing Plan being developed to determine the housing needs of the community. More survey information is available at the village website [loslunasnm.gov](http://loslunasnm.gov).

# Time to Clean Up Property

**Now's the time to clean up your property before temperatures rise.**

The Village Municipal Code prohibits the accumulation of debris, refuse, garbage, trash, or similar material on property when the accumulation constitutes a detriment to public health and a fire hazard.

Residential garbage pickup is once weekly which facilitates keeping property clean.

Two free special pickups of trash and debris in the amount of a large pickup truck load per pick up are allowed per year per address with a Village garbage account.

# Park Improvements Continue

Recently finished park work includes a complete overhaul to Neighborhood Park at 1151 Park St SE.

The improvements took three years with three phases. Estimated cost was \$300,000. With the support of businesses, contractors, and the Village Community Services Department, the project was done for \$220,000.

The most recent work was a new parking lot and landscape improvements.

Improvements to Daniel Fernandez Park, 1103 Highway 314 SW, include replacing the 32-year-old asphalt and paving a dirt area in the horseshoe complex.

Work should be done for spring as landscaping, curb, and turf work is finished. In addition, walls have been painted and the irrigation system adjusted.

The work cost \$82,000 with the Community Services Department pitching in.
