OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE TRAINING CENTER NOW OPEN

In partnership with the New Mexico Game and Fish Department Off-Highway Vehicle Program, the Village of Los Lunas Open Space Division obtained \$30,000 in grant funding to plan, design, and construct the Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV) Training Center in River Park, 1601 Main St. SE.

This now-open facility is the first in New Mexico. The OHV Training Center duplicates outdoor terrain or obstacles found in New Mexico.

OHV safety classes begin with hands-on outdoor classroom certified instruction.

Then students can ride the course using the lesson learned to navigate through the obstacles while being evaluated by an instructor.

The OHV Program provides off-high-

way motor vehicle recreation that recognizes the importance of New Mexico's cultural, historic, and resource values while also ensuring public safety.

New Mexico has new requirements for OHVs designed to protect the safety of users and ensure responsibility and sensitivity in OHV use.

New Mexico State Law requires an OHV rider under 18 years of age carry an OHV safety permit to ride

on New Mexico publicly-owned land which includes state parks. Participants completing the class and passing the final exam will be issued an OHV safety permit.

RENEW YOUR BUSINESS REGISTRATION NOW

Doing business in the village?

Then you need to purchase or renew your registration for that business, says Community Development Director Christina Ainsworth.

All businesses, whether multi-national or Mom and Pop, pay the same fee, \$25.

A registration is required for "all persons, firms, corporations or associations of any character engaged in any of the various pursuits, businesses or occupations," says the Village Municipal Code.

Renew or purchase your registration before Dec. 31.

75 POUNDS OF MEDICATION COLLECTED

The service was free and anonymous; officers were not allowed to ask questions or log any information.
