CodeRED NOW AVAILABLE HERE

CodeRED is coming to the Village of Los Lunas and Valencia County.

CodeRED is a free emergency notification service provided to all resi-

dents in Valencia County that sends emergency information through phone calls, text messages, emails, and social media.

CodeRED keeps people informed of local events that may immediately impact people's safety.

Among the event notifications sent are missing children, emergency preparedness, emergency evacuation notices, wildfires, public health crisis, and criminal activity.

Area residents are encouraged to

register cell phones for this service.

Home and business locations will be verified during the enrollment process so notifications that directly impact homes or businesses can be delivered.

Funding comes from a variety of sources, including legislative appropriations, grants, the village budget, and loans repaid from the budget.

CAPITAL OUTLAY PROJECTS FOR 2015-2016 INCLUDE:

- Improvements to the Fred Luna Multigenerational Center, \$1.3 million.
- Improvements to the Transportation Center, \$1.09 million.
- Two new police cars, \$112,000, with specialized equipment.
- New ambulance, \$75,754 plus a gurney with a power mechanism, \$37,014.
