## BICYCLE MASTER PLAN FOR VILLAGE

The Village of Los Lunas has developed a Bicycle Master Plan for the community.

The Bicycle Master Plan is intended to improve the connectivity between existing bicycle features and to encourage designated bikeways where such do not exist.

The Village has three types of bikeways:

- Multi-purpose path which provides a completely separate right-of-way for use by bicycles, equestrians, joggers, etc. with cross flow by motorists minimized.
- Bike lane which provides a striped lane for one-way bike travel on a street or highway.
- Shared use which shares use with pedestrian or motor vehicle traffic.

The Master Plan discusses extensively the bikeways in

the Village as well as safe use of the different bikeways.

The Bicycle Master Plan map shows the current status of Village bikeways as well as detailing the direction the Village intends to take with bicycle routes.

Developing bikeways does not solve all bicycle-related problems, but properly designed bikeways can positively impact bicyclists' and motorists' behavior.

## LAND USE IN THE SAN CLEMENTE LAND GRANT

At 2 p.m. on Saturday, August 27, Dr. David E. Stuart will talk on "600 Generations of Changing Land Use in the San Clemente Land Grant" at the Museum of Heritage and Arts, located at the corner of Main Street and Luna Avenue.

Stuart is an internationally recognized anthropologist whose most cited books are Prehistoric New Mexico, Anasazi America, The Guaymas Chronicles, and the recently released Ancient People of the Pajarito Plateau.

He earned his PhD in anthropology from the University of New Mexico and served many years at UNM as associate provost for academic affairs.

Stuart will present several public lectures in Santa Fe during the coming year on "The Archaeology of New Mexico: Lessons on Land Use, Resources, and Cultural Institutions for Our Modern World."

In Week Six academy lead instructor Fares Martinez made Yokoyama the class leader.

The academy staff recognized Officer Yokoyama for his leadership.

Los Lunas Police Chief Naithan Gurule told the Village Council that Yokoyama's leadership represents the positive and strong reputation of the Los Lunas Police Department and the Village of Los Lunas that LLPD officers work so hard to continue.

## DO NOT BLOCK THESE INTERSECTIONS

Traffic flow is improved between Don Pasqual and Highway 314 when motorists pay attention to the Do Not Block Intersection signs.

Do Not Block Intersections signs tell motorists to leave the area clear at the Main Street intersections with Sichler and Sandoval on the south side of Main Street and Munoz on the north side.

An additional Do Not Block sign is at the west entrance to the Luna Mansion.

The Do Not Block Intersection signs are not time sensitive so the intersections should be left clear at any time of the day or night.

Drivers turning at these intersections find it easier and safer when those intersections are not blocked.
