Lots of activities are available for adults and children in the Village of Los Lunas this summer.

The Los Lunas High School Pool, located off Los Cerritos Road, is open to the public until August 6. Hours and costs can be found on the village website, loslunasnm.gov.

At the library Wii gaming alternates with the Lego Club for children on Tuesdays at 10:30 a.m.

Wednesdays at 10:30 a.m. library events include Mark Pfetzer on June 15; Tall Paul, June 22; Kevin Kinane, June 29; Liz Mangel, July 6; Magical Michael Steel, July 13; and internet safety with the Los Lunas Police Department, July 20.

Thursday library activities include craft projects and movies. Museum crafts are held Fridays at 10 a.m. except for June 17 which is LLPD Safety Day and July 29 which is Los Lunas Fire Department Safety Day. At the Museum of Heritage and Arts "Just Marilyn . . ." features the work

of award-winning artist Marilyn Drake through June 30.

An exhibit marking the 300th anniversary of the San Clemente Land Grant opens July 9 at the museum, running through Sept. 17.

Ground was broken in May for the School of Dreams Academy Charter School which is moving to 906 Juan Perea Road SE this summer.

This location is part of the El Molino redevelopment site just south of the Transportation Center / New Mexico Rail Runner Express station.

This is a public/private partnership with the Village of Los Lunas and the developer, Lohman Development, that is attempting to bring a mixed-use infill development to the central core of the Village along Highway 314.

The creation of a pedestrian activity center in the area is one of the project's goals.
