WATER CONSERVATION PLAN

The Village Council has adopted a new water conservation plan.

The plan updates the 2006 water conservation plan reflecting changes in the Village water supply, water system, and technology.

The plan also deals with increasing costs for items such as supplies, infrastructure, power, and labor.

In addition, the plan references:

- Drought
- Protecting the water supply for future needs (growth)
- Short-term vs. long-term view
- Supply and demand components
- How public input was obtained through an online survey
- The conservation principle of use only what you need!

The Conservation Plan was designed to address the requirements of both the Office of the State Engineer (OSE) and the Water Trust Board (WTB).

As part of the effort to conserve, village residents should avoid wasting water.

Following Municipal Ordinance 8.24.040 Water Waste Restrictions will help with that conservation.

The Village Water Conservation Plan is available on the Village website, loslunasnm.gov, under the Public Works Department.

FACEBOOK TO CONSTRUCT SECOND BUILDING

Facebook officials have announced a second 460,000-square-foot building will be constructed on the west side of Los Lunas.

In October 2016, work began on the first phase of the data center in Los Lunas — one building and an admin space.

This first space is expected to be in service in late 2018.

The second building will bring the total square footage to 980,000 and is expected to open in 2020.

VILLAGE SEEKS GRANT FOR ROUTE 66 EXHIBIT

The Village is applying for grant funding from the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) to plan and design Route 66 exhibits for the proposed museum and visitors' center at the Old Country Inn site.

The site is on the south side of Main Street (Highway 6) just west of The Luna Mansion.

Village staff plans to partner with the School of Architecture at the University of New Mexico to have students design and build the proposed exhibit.

RAIL SWITCH, SPUR INSTALLED

Construction on a 1,400-acre rail-served industrial park on the far west edge of Los Lunas has moved forward with the installation of a rail switch and spur.

Project developer, Rio Real Estate Investment Opportunities, says the new switch and spur mean the venture is one step closer to transforming New Mexico's transportation and logistics industry.

The industrial park is designed for large land users, such as third-party logistics operations, as well as sites for manufacturing, warehouse and distribution opportunities, and has a commitment from the BNSF Railway to provide direct service to the 1,400-acre rail park.

Located in far west Los Lunas on the north side of NM 6, the park has convenient access to I-40 and I-25.

The site sits on a BNSF main line known as the Glorieta subdivision and is considered a central connection between southern California and Chicago.

The rail switch and spur connect the BNSF line to New Mexico's largest rail-served industrial park.

"This site is a key asset in regional efforts to diversify the economy", said Los Lunas Mayor Charles Griego. "It is important that we look at bringing jobs to Central New Mexico."

The Village Council annexed the rail park land in July 2016.

NATURAL ENERGY AT RECYCLING CENTER

The Village Council has voted to install the Wiltech Technology, Inc., (WTI) 100% Off-Grid Poly-GEN™ and Vertical Access Wind Turbine Renewable Solar Power System at the Village recycling center on Don Pasqual.

This first United States installation gives the Village an environment of energy independence because the system is powered by and operated completely from natural energy – the sun and the wind.

The WTI system features a vertical integration mounted solar panel configuration which harnesses the direct and indirect energy of the sun.

The solar panels are mounted vertically on a pole so no massive amount of land space is used.

A WTI system designed to produce two megawatts of power utilizes less than one acre of land space.

The WTI system works on or off the grid or as a combination of both and lasts for up to 25 years.

It also allows unused stored energy to be returned to the grid.

GOODWILL INDUSTRIES COMING TO LL

Officials of Goodwill Industries will break ground on a site this fall where they will construct new facilities.

A new 14,000-square-foot structure will be built just north of Bank of the West on Desert Willow Road on the west side of Interstate 25. It is expected to open in Spring 2018.

In addition to a retail facility, Goodwill will offer job training and several other services.

It will employ 95 people.

There is the potential for Goodwill to add 100,000 more square feet to the facility.
