NEW FIRE STATION UPDATE

In March 2016, Village voters approved the General Obligation Bond to fund Fire Station #2 in Los Lunas plus new equipment.

If all goes according to plan, the new station will be up and running by Spring 2018.

The station will be on Sandsage off Highway 6/Main Street, west of I-25, on 2.3 acres purchased by the Village in 2006.

Currently the station is in the design phase.

The station is expected to have office space, conference and training rooms, dormitory area, laundry facilities, exercise area with equipment, rest rooms, storage space, and four or five bays for emergency equipment.

The schedule calls for the project to go to bid in April. Hopefully, construction will start in May or June.

New equipment to be purchased includes a ladder truck, a first for the Village.

The \$125 registration fee includes greens fees, golf cart and staging plus breakfast and lunch.


Sponsorships are available ranging from \$150 hole sponsorship to the \$5,000 title sponsorship.

73.52 TONS OF GLASS

The Village's glass recycling program successfully ground 73.52 tons of glass in 2016, exceeding the projected goal of 36 to 40 tons for the calendar year.

Village officials said the glass grinding was accomplished with a minimal downtime of equipment and no overtime.

The program goal is to double the 73.52 tons in 2017.

The ground glass is used in landscaping around the village. Glass can be taken to the village's recycling center on Don Pasqual, as well as paper products, cardboard and plastics.

WATER AND THE VILLAGE

With Facebook and Niagara Bottling Company arriving in Los Lunas, people have raised questions about water in the community

This is the first of a three-part series in the Village newsletter about water and water rights.

The Village of Los Lunas has sufficient water rights to meet the needs of residential and commercial customers as well as the initial demands of Facebook and Niagara Bottling Company.

The Village currently obtains its water from four wells with plans for a fifth coming online in 2018.

In the future, the Village may need to drill a sixth well.

The wells are located west of, but not far from, the Rio Grande, with the supply produced partially from water stored in the aquifer, and partially from a reduction in river flows.

The aquifer that the Village relies upon has a large volume of storage so that the wells can supply projected demand until at least 2050 and likely beyond.

In 2016 Los Lunas pumped 2,461 acre-feet of water (about 800 million gallons, or an average of about 2.2 million gallons per day) to supply water to residential and commercial users.

The water system is continuously upgraded so the water can be treated and distributed.

Upgrades are also made to the wastewater treatment system.

To protect its investment in water, the Village monitors outside interests using the same aquifer. Such monitoring helps protect the Village and the Village water supply.
