EARLY, ABSENTEE AND MARCH 6 VOTING

Early voting begins Wednesday, Feb. 14, at the Village Administration Building, 660 Main St. NW, and ends Friday, March 2 for the 2018 Village municipal election.

Registered Village of Los Lunas voters can vote for mayor and municipal judge.

Candidate for mayor is Charles Griego.

Candidates for municipal judge are, in ballot order, Henry L. Perea and Avilio Chavez.

Voters in Village Council District Two and Four can also vote for a village councilor. Council candidates are:

District Two: Gino M. Romero.

District Four: Paulette S. Montoya.

Election day is Tuesday, March 6. The polling place, open 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., is the Village Administration Building, 660 Main St. NW, corner of Main Street and Don Pasqual.

Voters may also vote absentee.

The last day for absentee ballots to be issued is Friday, March 2.

VILLAGE CONTINUES ADDITIONAL INTER-CHANGE EFFORTS

Village of Los Lunas officials continue their work on obtaining funding for creation of a second I-25 interchange and an east-west corridor.

Los Lunas and other area officials attended a presentation about this project at a New Mexico House Transportation Committee meeting in late January.

Main Street in Los Lunas (NM 6) is currently the only exit from Interstate 25 into Los Lunas.

Another interchange and corridor could improve traffic flow, the access to high growth areas, and the efficiency of emergency response within the Village of Los Lunas as well as throughout the area.

The current Main Street route through Los Lunas provides the only crossing of the Rio Grande within a seventeen-mile stretch.

Studies show a new interchange south of Main Street would decrease eastbound Main Street traffic by about 43% if completed from I-25 to NM Highway 47.

OUTDOOR ADVENTURES PROGRAM

INCREASES TO WATER/SEWER RATES

A reminder — Village water and sewer bills sent in February 2018 reflect a slight increase.

The increases are:

- 0-2000 gallon water usage increase of \$1.71 or \$23.14 base rate; and
- 0-2000 gallon sanitary sewer increase of \$2.17 or \$29.25 base rate.

Water and sewer usage per thousand above 2000 gallons will have no increase to the current calculation of \$4.25 per thousand for water and \$3.75 per thousand for sewer.

Village water usage charges are based on a metering system.

The Village residential sanitary sewer usage is determined by taking the average water usage from November through February and shows in the April statement.

Village commercial sanitary sewer usage is determined as equal to the water meter reading.

Customers should keep in mind that the water and sewer bill also generally includes the charge for garbage pickup in addition to the water and sewer charge.

The increase is part of a five-year plan approved by the Village Council in December 2014.

KING OF THE HILL MARCH 10

The annual King of the Hill 5K/10K and Half Marathon trail run is Saturday, March 10, 2018, starting at El Cerro de Los Lunas Trailhead, located 3 miles west of I-25 on Highway 6.

The 5K proceeds along the Bowl Trail on the west side of El Cerro de Los Lunas on a mostly flat course with a few small hills.

The 10K begins on the same route as the 5K and then diverts up a steep hill to meet the Overlook Trail, which offers breathtaking views of the Rio Grande Valley and the Sandia and Manzano Mountains.

Runners descend the hill and meet back up with the 5K course to finish.

The 10K has approximately 700 feet of elevation change.

The Half Marathon has a 2,100-foot elevation gain/loss covering the 10k overlook trail and continuing to the eastside of Los Lunas Hill.

CELEBRATING 90 YEARS

Watch for historical info about the Village In honor of the 90th anniversary of Los Lunas as a municipality in 2018.

On July 10, 1928, the Valencia County Commission met at the Valencia County Courthouse and approved the incorporation of the Village of Los Lunas.

At the first election of village officials, held August 7, 1928, Antonio J. Archuleta was elected mayor. Trustees elected were Joseph F. Tondre, Fred D. Huning Sr., Abelino A. Gutierrez, and Jesus Maestas. G.C. Luna was elected clerk.

Notary public F.C.H. Livingston swore in the elected officials. He was supposed to swear in Simon Neustadt as city treasurer, but Neustadt died before he could take office. Climaco Aguirre was appointed city treasurer to fill the unexpired term.

Mayor Archuleta appointed Juan Luna as Village Marshall; Roberto G. Sanchez, Justice of the Peace; and F.C.H. Livingston, village attorney.

At the first council meeting ordinances adopted concerned Rules and Order of Business; Ordinances; Village Seal; and Occupational Tax.

NEW SUBDIVISION ORDINANCE OKAYED

The Village Council has approved a revised subdivision ordinance after a year of public meetings and discussion regarding the ordinance.

The ordinance is meant to assure harmonious and orderly development of the Village and the surrounding area as well as promote health, safety, morals, and general welfare.

In addition, the ordinance is intended to secure equitable treatment of all subdivisions by providing uniform procedures and standards to be used by subdividers, the Village Planning and Zoning Commission, and the Village Council.

Anyone wanting to subdivide land into two or more parts, or to amend or vacate a plat for any previously subdivided land, will furnish a plat of the proposed subdivision, amendment, or plat, prepared by a surveyor, and will comply with the subdivision ordinance requirements.
