Election day is Tuesday, March 6, 2018.

The polling place, open 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., is the Village Administration Building, 660 Main St. NW, corner of Main Street and Don Pasqual.

Voters may also vote absentee or early.

Early voting begins Wednesday, Feb. 14, 2018, at the Village Administration Building and ends Friday, March 2, 2018.

The last day for absentee ballots to be issued is Friday, March 2, 2018. Voter registration closes Tuesday, Feb. 6, 2018.

MAIN STREET CONSTRUCTION

TLC Plumbing is scheduled to install storm water drains on Main Street between Don Pasqual and NM 314 through the end of February.

INCREASE TO WATER/SEWER RATES FOR 2018

Village of Los Lunas water and sewer bills sent in February 2018 will reflect a slight increase in the base rate as part of a five-year plan approved by the Village Council in December 2014.

The rate adjustment ensures the Village generates adequate revenue to meet existing water and sanitary sewer operational and maintenance costs; increasing costs for water supply treatment, sanitary sewer treatment, water distribution and sewer collection system maintenance; and proactive management for planned water and sewer system capital improvement projects.

The 2018 increases are:

- 0-2000 gallon water usage increase of \$1.71 or \$23.14 base rate; and
- 0-2000 gallon sanitary sewer increase of \$2.17 or \$29.25 base rate.

Water and sewer usage per thousand above 2000 gallons will have no increase to the current calculation of \$4.25 per thousand for water and \$3.75 per thousand for sewer.

This year, 2018, is the fourth of the five-year plan.

The fifth, and final year of the plan, is 2019 when the water rate increase will be \$1.85 and the sanitary sewer increase will be \$2.34.

Village residential and commercial users are charged for the water used per a meter reading.

Village residential sanitary sewer usage is determined by taking the

average water usage from October through February and is reflected in the March statement for February services.

Commercial sanitary sewer usage is determined as equal to the water meter reading.

Customers should keep in mind that the bill for water and sewer also generally includes the charge for garbage pickup in addition to the water and sewer charges.

COMMERCIAL CONSTRUCTION

The Facebook Data Center is under construction, but there are several smaller commercial construction projects underway in the Village as well as other economic news.

Just east of the Chevron Gas Station at the intersection of Grant Boulevard and Main Street a new strip mall is being built.

Across the street, in front of The Home Depot, two new eateries are under construction, Jersey Mike's Subs and a second Burger King.

Work is complete on the Aaron's Rent to Own east of Murphy's Gas. The store will move to this location from the site in the Smith's Shopping Center in January 2018.

Goodwill Industries of New Mexico is building a 14,500 square-foot facility at 201 Desert Willow Road which will create as many as 20 jobs.

LLPD OFFICER GRADUATES FROM FBI ACADEMY

Los Lunas Police Lieutenant Frank Lucero graduated from the Federal Bureau of Investigation National Police Academy (FBINA), Class #270 Section 5, in Quantico, Virginia, in December 2017

The FBINA is a professional course of study for U.S. and international law enforcement managers nominated by their agency chief for their demonstrated leadership qualities.

The FBINA consists of an extensive 10-week program that offers classes in law, behavioral science, forensic science, understanding terrorism/terrorist mindsets, leadership, communication, and health/fitness.

Officers participate in a wide range of leadership and specialized training.

Lieutenant Lucero is an 11-year veteran of the Los Lunas Police Department. He began his LLPD career in November 2006, as a Patrol Officer. In 2009, he was promoted to Patrol Sergeant.

In 2015, he was promoted to his current position as Lieutenant of the Criminal Investigations Division.

VILLAGE WINS AWARDS

The Village of Los Lunas has won two awards from the New Mexico Water and Wastewater Association (NMWWA).

The Village won Good Housekeeping Awards for Activated Sludge Plant 20 years and older, and for Mechanical Plant 20 years and younger.

Village wastewater staff will accept the awards in late January 2018.

BICYCLE MASTER PLAN APPROVED

The Village Council has approved the Bicycle Master Plan for the community.

The plan improves the connectivity between existing bicycle facilities and encourages designated bike-ways where such do not exist.

The plan helps define and explain the roles of each bikeway facility with key design elements for each option.

A bikeway primarily provides, but is not limited to, bicycle travel. Bikeways can include:

- A multi-purpose path which provides a completely separate right-of-way (paved or unpaved) for use of bicycles, equestrians, joggers, hikers, etc., with cross flow by motorists minimized.
- A bike lane which provides a striped lane for one-way bike trails on a street or highway.
- Shared use which provides for shared use with pedestrians or motor vehicles. This typically has "shared lane" pavement marking.

All three of these bikeways can currently be found in the Village.

The bicycle plan includes a Bicycle Master Plan map.
