VILLAGE COUNCIL SETS PRIORITIES

The Village Council has approved the following Strategic Priorities for the next four years for the community:

- Interstate 25 Interchange and East-West Corridor Project
- Quality of Life Improvements
- Evaluate the current staffing levels of the Police and Fire Departments
- Evaluate and improve the Village infrastructure
- Evaluate possible options for expansion of the Village Hall, Public Library, and consider other facility improvements.

The Village Council also has approved the Fiscal Year 2018-19 Interim Budget.

The \$76 million budget is the spending plan for the Village of Los Lunas from July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019.

VILLAGE HAS NEW TOURISM PLAN

The Los Lunas Village Council has approved a strategic tourism plan, with the goal of creating a thriving tourism sector and outdoor recreation industry.

Village officials hope to collaborate with other county governments to build a tourism network for visitors and residents alike based upon attractions in Valencia County.

The plan, along with a brand for Los Lunas tourism, "Los Lunas — The Road Less Traveled," was created with the belief that developing the tourism industry will enhance the quality of life for residents and visitors as well as complement economic development now taking place.

The Village began with economic development when the Village embarked on its branding strategy entitled, "Small Community, Big Possibilities."

The first phase was retail and industrial jobs recruitment, and now the last phase is the tourism plan. The Village will work with local businesses and services to draw tourists to the area.

The tourism brand promise is, "Los Lunas is the personable place that shares memorable and 'soul-feeding' adventures that visitors simply love."

The plan calls for a roadmap brochure so visitors can follow site to site.

The aim is to attract new businesses to support the emerging tourism industry and attract new visitors, extend their stays, as well as engage the Village's businesses and residents with information and tools to become brand ambassadors.

Another strategic priority includes attracting the tourism infrastructure to deliver a first-class tourism experience.

A Route 66 Museum and Visitors Center, on land purchased west of the Luna Mansion, is part of the tourism plan.

The Village is partnering with New Mexico True, the state tourism brand, to collaborate on many strategic tourism initiatives so the Village can maximize its branding reach and better leverage financial resources.

SLUDGE AS COMPOST

Sludge is not usually a topic of conversation for the family.

Village officials, however, have figured out a way to repurpose the sludge produced by the Village's water and sewage treatment processes.

Currently the sludge is taken to a 220-acre site off HWY 6 west of Los Lunas.

There is a limit to how much sludge can be handled there and the site now has a 15-year life expectancy.

A new process used by the Village turns the sludge into a cake product which can be used for composting or be taken to the landfill.

Use for composting is preferred and the Village intends to use the new product initially as a soil amendment in the Village parks and wherever else it can be used on Village property.

Eventually the material may be available to the public.

Village Public Works Director Michael Jaramillo points out that the new sludge process is another way the Village is working to make a more efficient community.

THIRD NM 314 PROJECT

A third NM 314 improvement project is currently in the design phase.

This project will improve NM 314 from Main Street/HWY 6 north to about James Street.

Work includes sidewalk improvements, a new trail, safety fences around the railroad track, and pedestrian bridges over the Otero Ditch.

The project is expected to cost about \$1.7 million with \$1.45 million of that funded by the New Mexico Department of Transportation Transportation Improvement Program and the remainder by the Village of Los Lunas.

The project will go to bid this summer with an anticipated start date of April 2019.

Work is expected to begin soon on the NM 314 Bike and Pedestrian Improvement Project at the intersection of NM 314 and Morris Road.

The reconstruction of the NM 314 and Courthouse Road intersection is also in the design phases.

SWIMMING POOL OPEN

The Los Lunas High School swimming pool is open through Saturday, August 4, on Mondays through Saturdays.

A variety of activities is offered including aqua aerobics, lap swimming, swimming lessons, and infant-parent classes.

Private pool parties may be booked subject to the availability of the pool.
