VILLAGE COUNCILWOMAN DIES

Village of Los Lunas Councilwoman Paulette Sanchez-Montoya died April 15, 2018, at her Los Lunas home with her family at her side.

Councilwoman Sanchez-Montoya was first elected to the District Four council seat in March 2014. She was re-elected in March 2018.

A native of Los Lunas, Sanchez-Montoya, 61, graduated from Los Lunas High School in 1974.

She was retired from the Central New Mexico Correctional Facility and had also worked at Walmart.

Sanchez-Montoya is survived by her husband, Arthur Montoya Jr., her mother, Paula C. Padilla; son Steven Walker, wife Sonia and children; daughter Paula Jean (PJ), her husband Noah Aragon and their sons; stepson Jeffery Montoya; stepdaughter, Sheila Knight and her son.

She is also survived by her brothers and sisters; as well as nieces and nephews; and other relatives.

BRAZILIAN JIU-JITSU NOW IN LL

Looking for a different exercise routine?

How about Brazilian jiu-jitsu which is now offered in Los Lunas?

Brazilian jiu-jitsu is a martial art and combat sport system focusing on grappling, and especially ground fighting.

Brazilian jiu-jitsu promotes the concept that a smaller, weaker, person can successfully defend themselves or another against a bigger, stronger, heavier, assailant by using proper technique and leverage, and taking the fight to the ground.

Once the fight is taken to the ground, then joint locks and chokeholds are applied to defeat the opponent.

All ages can participate in Brazilian jiu-jitsu as a sport, or a method for promoting physical fitness.

It can also build character in young people and eventually become a way of life.

CELEBRATING 90 YEARS

(Historical info in honor of the 90th anniversary of Los Lunas as a municipality in 2018.)

Electricity came to the Village of Los Lunas in the early 1930s. The New Mexico Power Company supplied the power first which was later replaced by the Public Service Company.

Water and sewer facilities came to the Village in the late 1930s when the population was listed as 513.

During the 1950s and 1960s, the Village welcomed various businesses, service and social clubs, modern school buildings, and parks and recreation areas.

PLATEAU NOW OFFERING SERVICE

Plateau Communications is now offering services over an advanced fiber optic network in Los Lunas.

These services include an ultra-fast one gigabit per second (Gbps) internet connection, paired with crystal clear high definition TV and home phone service.

One gigabit per second (Gbps) is a 1,000 megabits per second (Mbps) connection.

For the service, Los Lunas has been divided into zones. Residents in zones need to pre-register for Plateau fiber services.

When a zone meets 100% of the pre-registration goal, Plateau will build fiber throughout that zone.

Zone 1 in Los Lunas has already qualified. Construction is in progress, with service available in the near future.

A \$10 fee is charged when pre-registering, which will return a \$20 credit on the first Plateau invoice after service begins.

To pre-register and find answers to Frequently Asked Questions about these services, go to plateaufiber.com.
