WORK STARTS ON NEW BRIDGE

Work has begun on building a new bridge across the Rio Grande in Los Lunas. Current project work is clearing out brush and trees in construction areas.

The New Mexico Department of Transportation bridge project area is on Main Street / NM Hwy 6 between milepost 35.231 (Carson Drive intersection) and milepost 35.819 (Edeal Road intersection) with a total project length of 0.5819 miles and a structure length of 966 feet.

The existing bridge is the only Rio Grande river crossing in Los Lunas, and is one of only two primary river crossings in Valencia County.

The current bridge will remain in place while the new one is constructed. The project is expected to take about two years.

FNF, Inc., is the contractor for the project with a contract total work bid of \$18,490,159.75.

VILLAGE PROJECTS UPDATE

The Village of Los Lunas has 57 projects throughout the community in the process of design or construction. Here are a few of those projects.

- NM Hwy 314 Sports Complex Improvements – budgeted for \$475,000; this project includes new landscaping, shade structures around the gazebo, a trail, and Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) improvements. Construction to start December 2019.
- River Park and Bosque Open Space Improvements – \$70,000; signage, shade structures and playground; start December 2019.
- General Park Improvements – \$200,000; playground and fencing at Chester Skinner Park, shade structures at Artistic and Heritage Parks, fencing at Buena Vista Park; project started.
- Local Street Improvements – \$1,000,000; improve roadway conditions of Don Frederico Road, Tome Hill Road, Vaisa Road, Coronado Street, and Taylor Road; construction ongoing.
- Main Street Improvements Canal to Los Cerritos – \$150,000; landscaping improvements on Main Street between Canal and Los Cerritos Road on north side to include sidewalk replacement, irrigation, trees, plants, rock, and park benches; scheduled to start April 2020.
- NM 314 Bike/Pedestrian Improvements (Main St to James St) – \$1,850,000; sidewalk, multipurpose path, lighting, irrigation, and landscaping improvements on both sides of NM Hwy 314 between NM Hwy 6 and James Street; scheduled to start January 2020.

KFC REMODEL IS 19 YEARS LATER

Nineteen years ago the owners of the Los Lunas KFC opened a restaurant on a lot on Sun Ranch Village Loop near the intersection of Main Street / Interstate 25. The area was almost barren.

Today there are restaurants, shops, a Walmart Super Center and other businesses plus many houses in the area and that KFC Restaurant held a grand opening for its remodel in mid-November, almost nineteen years to the day of the original opening.

The Los Lunas KFC remodel features touches of Colonel Sanders, the creator of KFC almost seventy years ago. The remodel style is called American Showman and Los Lunas is the third New Mexico restaurant to undergo this particular remodel.

A new innovation at the Los Lunas store will be Football Nights on Mondays, Thursdays and Saturdays with two big screen televisions to watch the games while eating.

KFC menu items include Kentucky Fried Wings, Spicy Famous Bowl®, boxed meals, tenders, nuggets, and other choices. There's a variety of sides, desserts, and beverages.

The Los Lunas KFC has 30 employees, seats 38 people, and is open 11 a.m. to 9 p.m. seven days a week. It is located at 2264 Sun Ranch Village Loop SW, phone 505 866-1624, website kfc.com.

The store is operated by Velda and Anthony Lovato and their son Shane Lovato. Velda is the daughter of Leo Gabaldon who opened the first KFC in Valencia County in Belen. The Los Lunas KFC is now the only store in Valencia County.

DON'T LET YOUR VEHICLE BE STOLEN PART II

In November's newsletter Village Police Chief Naithan Gurule offered a few tips to avoid "Warm-Up Theft," stealing a car that has been left running and unattended to "warm-up."

Here are those tips to keep you from being left out in the cold:

- Never leave the vehicle title in your car. If stolen, it makes it easier for the thief to dispose of your vehicle. It can also make you a target for identity theft.
- Install a mechanical locking device commonly called a club, collar, or j-bar that locks to the steering wheel, column, or brake.
- If your vehicle has an alarm or other anti-theft device, USE IT.
