RIGHT TURN LANE & OTHER ROAD PROJECTS

Work begins this month on turning the north parking lot of the Blake's Lotaburger at the intersection of Main Street / NM HWY 6 into a right turn lane from Main Street onto NM HWY 314.

This project should facilitate traffic. Expected completion is late April.

Several other road projects are in the works for the Village.

The intersection of Courthouse Road and NM HWY 314 is in the design stage of a realignment. Courthouse on the east side will line up with Colonial Avenue on the west side of NM HWY 314 when the project is completed.

This project will be paid for by federal funds as part of the Highway Safety Improvement Program. The realignment work is expected to begin in October 2019 with six months to complete.

Also in the design stage are improvements to NM HWY 314 north from Main Street to approximately James Street. This work on NM HWY 314 will include ADA sidewalks, drainage, and curbing.

The Village hopes to eventually continue improvements to NM HWY

314 between James Street and Trujillo Road and then on to Griego.

The improvements to NM HWY 314 on the south side of the Village will be completed soon and also include sidewalks, drainage and curbing.

Sequoia Landscaping has the contract to continue the beautification of the Village's Interstate 25 Exit 203.

Landscaping similar to that on the exit ramps off I-25 south and northbound will be placed on the ramps onto south and northbound Interstate 25.

Work is currently proceeding on the extension of Camelot Boulevard to Morris Road.

The construction includes a new concrete ditch crossing, streetlights, storm water retention, and a new base asphalt roadway.



NEW LLFD LADDER TRUCK

The new Los Lunas ladder truck arrived in the Village just in time for Christmas.

Acquiring the ladder truck and constructing the new fire station on Sand Sage Road were made possible by Village voters approving a General Obligation bond issue in March 2016.

WATER/SEWER RATES INCREASE IN 2019

Village of Los Lunas water and sewer bills sent in February 2019 for January 2019 services will reflect a slight increase in the base rate as approved by the Village Council in December 2014.

This will be the fifth year of a five-year rate-based increase in utilities approved by the Village Council.

The base water rate of 0-2000 gallons will increase by \$1.85.

- Current base of \$23.14 will increase to \$24.99 for customers inside the Village limits and from \$32.50 to \$34.35 for customers outside the Village limits
- The calculated rate over the base will remain at \$4.25 per thousand gallons.

The increase to the base sewer rate calculated at 0-2000 gallons average will be \$2.34.

- Current base of \$29.25 will increase to \$31.59 for customers inside the Village limits and from \$38.58 to \$40.92 for customers outside the Village limits.

• The calculated rate over the base will remain at \$3.25 per thousand gallons.

There will be no rate increase for solid waste / garbage.

February services, which will be billed mid-March, will reflect each residential customer's new calculated sewer rate, using the months of October 2018 through February 2019 water use.

Customers should keep in mind that the bill for water and sewer also generally includes the charge for garbage pickup in addition to the water and sewer charges.

LOS LUNAS HISTORY TIDBITS

Los Lunas has a rich and colorful history. Located on the San Clemente Grant, it was given to Don Felix Candelaria in 1716, two years after his mother petitioned for the land. Shortly after Don Candelaria received the grant, the Luna family made claim to the grant and then took possession.

Antonio Jose Luna was born in 1808 and is sometimes referred to as the father of Los Lunas. He became a civic and political leader and married Isabella Baca, daughter of a prominent family from Belen.

Antonio and Isabella's son, Salomon, married Adelaida Otero, granddaughter of Antonio Jose Otero of Valencia. This formed a union of two powerful and rich Republican families who controlled and dominated the future of Valencia County for almost a century.

Through the influence of the Luna family, the county seat moved from Tome to Los Lunas in 1876.

When the Santa Fe Railroad arrived in Los Lunas, the railroad depot was built which facilitated the movement of livestock, hay, supplies and general merchandise. The depot was also used for telegraph communications as well as passenger and baggage service.

In 1928, the Village of Los Lunas incorporated with Antonio J. Archuleta as the first mayor. Electricity arrived in the Los Lunas area in the early 1930's. Water and sewer facilities came to the village in the late 1930's when the population was listed as 513.

For many years, Los Lunas Village Hall was located in the building which is now the public library.

In the mid-1990s, the village administration and police
