WATER REPORT AVAILABLE

The Village of Los Lunas 2018 Annual Water Quality Report / Consumer Confidence Report will be available this month on the Village website, loslunasnm.gov.

The report provides details about where the Village's water comes from, what it contains, and how it compares to standards set by the New Mexico Environment Department / Drinking Water Bureau (NMED / DWB).

Village Public Works Director Michael Jaramillo says, "The Village is committed to providing this information about water quality. We want everyone to be aware of what is in the municipal water."

TENNIS COURTS IN HUNING RANCH

The Village Council approved awarding the contract for construction of a tennis complex at Huning Ranch Park to TLC Plumbing & Utility for a low bid of \$794,450 plus New Mexico Gross Receipts Tax.

The complex includes six lighted tennis courts and landscaping. Lights will be on a timer system.

Construction is supposed to be finished by the fall.

The courts will be available for anyone to use.

PARK AND RIDE, SECURITY MEASURES FOR JULY 4

The Village is offering a park and ride and will be instituting security measures for July 4, 2019, events at Daniel Fernandez Park.

People can park for free in the parking lot at the Village Administration Building and the parking lot at First Choice Community Healthcare and also at Los Lunas Elementary School.

The Village Administration Building is at the intersection of Main Street / NM HWY 6 and Don Pasqual Road. First Choice Community Healthcare is directly to the north of the Village Administration building.

Los Lunas Elementary is at 800 Coronado NE, off North Los Lentos.

Los Lunas Schools buses will pick up passengers at Katherine Gallegos Elementary across from First Choice Community Healthcare and at Los Lunas Elementary.

Buses will run from the school parking lots from 3:30 p.m. to after the fireworks end and sixteen buses will be available at the end of the event to take people to the parking lots.

The last bus from the parking areas to Daniel Fernandez Park will be at 8:30 p.m.

This year people attending the July 4 events at Daniel Fernandez Park will go through a security check point where they will be scanned for weapons and alcohol, both of which are not to be brought in the park. Those taking the buses from the free parking will be scanned before getting on a bus.

In addition to weapons and alcohol not being allowed in the park, coolers cannot be brought in either. People can bring in food and bottled water.

People can park at the Enchantment Little League area, Los Lunas Sports Complex, and the Transportation Center which are all in the vicinity of Daniel Fernandez Park.

Come out and watch the Thursday, July 4, 2019, parade on Main Street / NM HWY 6 that starts at 9 a.m. and goes from the Heritage Park area west to the intersection with Don Pasqual Road.

Live entertainment begins at 4 p.m. at Daniel Fernandez Park. This year's musical artists are the Nathaniel Krantz Band, Nosotros, The Gershom Brothers, and Black Pearl Band of New Mexico.

NEW AREA BUS SERVICE

Rio Metro's transit service in Valencia County is growing, and to offer customers more flexibility, a new "deviated fixed route" has been added.

Bus Route 210 provides service along NM HWY 6 and NM HWY 47 between Los Lunas and Bosque Farms, serving the area on a regular schedule and also deviating up to 1/4 mile from the route by reservation.

Route 210 operates approximately every 45 minutes from 5:20 a.m. to 7:55 p.m. Monday through Friday.
