CENSUS COMPLETE COUNT COMMITTEE

The U.S. Census determines the allocation of \$1.5 trillion in federal spending, and New Mexico officials estimate that a 1% undercount would cost the state more than \$700 million in federal aid over a decade.

That's why people involved with Valencia County's "complete count" committee are working on providing kiosks with computer access to internet connections at public places for people to fill out census forms.

People will be able to fill out census forms online, by phone, or by mail which could make being counted in the U.S. Census easier for the about 41% of state residents who live in hard-to-count areas. The 41% is the largest proportion of any state in the nation.

The Valencia County Complete Count Committee has been at two events to start Census 2020 outreach.

The committee partnered with the Los Lunas Fire Department in the Christmas Electric Light Parade to hang banners from the ladder truck and hand out pencils. The committee was helped with this project by the Valencia High School baseball and softball teams.

The committee had a booth at the Village Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony, where committee members talked to folks to make sure they know how important the census is to the state and Los Lunas.

Valencia County Complete Count Committee members plan on being at other events to tell people about the importance of Census 2020.

GROSS RECEIPTS TAX RATE HAS INCREASED

The gross receipts tax collected in the Village increased by 0.3625% effective Jan. 1, 2020, after the Village Council approved the increase.

The new total rate is 8.675% in the Village.

It is anticipated the tax will generate more revenue and make up for the loss of reduced amounts of hold harmless revenue from the state.

The state has estimated that the tax would generate an additional \$2.2 million per year to help provide services throughout the Village.

Of the new 8.675% gross receipts tax, 5.125% goes to the state. The village portion of the tax is 2.175% with the increase. The county portion of the GRT tax is 1.375%.

GRAFFITI IN THE VILLAGE

Removing graffiti and repairing the damage it causes costs community tax dollars. Properties can be devalued and business owners can lose customers from the negative image that graffiti generates. Graffiti can send the message that a community is having problems.

You can help reduce graffiti by immediately reporting all graffiti sightings. The faster graffiti is cleaned up, the less it appears.

Village graffiti removal paint crews are on the job five days a week to eradicate graffiti on public and private property. The crews either remove graffiti through water blasting or use paint matching for graffiti paint-overs.

To report graffiti anywhere within the Village limits, call the Los Lunas Police Department at 505 865-9130 or fill out the Graffiti Removal Request form under Forms and Applications on the Village website, loslunasnm.gov.

When the form is filled out, both the Village Facility Maintenance and Solid Waste Divisions receive the form. Facility Maintenance deals with graffiti on Village-owned property and Solid Waste deals with all private property.

Village Public Works Director Michael Jaramillo said handling graffiti removal service this way improves response times for that removal.
