FOURTH OF JULY PARADE, EVENTS CANCELLED

The Village of Los Lunas annual Fourth of July parade on Main Street and events at Daniel Fernandez Park are cancelled due to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

The Number One priority of everyone at the Village of Los Lunas is the health and safety of the community. All options and contingencies are considered when making decisions such as cancelling a major special event.

Parks and Recreation Department staff is developing summer youth / adult camps that meet New Mexico public health order guidelines. These will consist of daily and bi-weekly no-contact camps where social distancing and proper sanitizing protocols can be followed.

Baseball Camp and Volleyball Camp are scheduled for June. Each camp costs \$20 per session per child and only one session per child. Campers must reside in Los Lunas.

More camps will be scheduled during the summer.

The 2020 Summer Recreation Program was cancelled. Daniel Fernandez Recreation Center opened when allowed to under the public health order.

RECORD YOUR SUMMER READING TIME AND WIN AWESOME PRIZES!!

The Summer Reading Program at the Los Lunas Public Library rewards YOU for reading and learning during summer break. Keep track of the minutes you spend reading between **June 1 – July 31** and be entered in weekly prize drawings, and in a grand prize drawing at the end of the summer.

You must read at least 10 hours total between June 1 – July 31 to be eligible for the grand prize drawing.

Participate in online programs and at-home activity challenges, and write book reviews and guest blog posts to receive bonus entries. **Readers of all ages** are invited to stretch their imagination with the Los Lunas Public Library this summer!

Prizes: gift cards, bikes, books, school supplies, exercise equipment, t-shirts, thermoses, and MORE!

To be entered into the Los Lunas Public Library weekly prize drawing, keep track of the minutes you spend reading each week and submit your reading log to the library!

Here's how it works:

Starting June 1st, record the minutes you read Monday through Sunday. To be eligible for the weekly prize drawing, read for at least 60 minutes during the week. Then, report the minutes to the library by the following Tuesday at 8 a.m.

Prize drawings will take place every Saturday at 10:30 a.m. on Facebook Live. (You do not need to watch the video to receive your prize. All winners will be notified via phone or email.) All entries into weekly programs will be re-entered into the drawing for grand prizes the first week of August. Participants must read at least 10 hours during the months of June and July to be eligible for the grand prize drawing.

For example:

Log reading minutes: Monday, June 1 – Sunday, June 7

Turn in reading log: by Tuesday, June 9 @ 8 a.m.

Drawing for prizes: Saturday, June 13 @ 10:30 a.m.

Log reading minutes: Monday June 8 – Sunday, June 14

Turn in reading log: by Tuesday, June 16 @ 8 a.m.

Drawing for prizes: Saturday, June 20 @ 10:30 a.m.

Fill this form out every week to be entered for the weekly prize drawing! Due by 8 a.m. the Tuesday following the week for which you recorded your reading.

Paper Forms:

Available via Curbside Pickup. Call the library 505 839-3850 to request paper reading logs and set up a time to pick them up.

Log your reading every week to be entered into weekly prize drawings. Paper reading logs must be turned in to the **LIBRARY BOOK DROP** by 8 a.m. the Tuesday following the week for which you recorded your reading.

LOCAL FACEBOOK GRANTS TOTAL \$210,000

Seventeen Valencia County nonprofits and schools will receive grants in 2020 from Facebook to support their work.

Facebook's Community Action Grants address needs in Valencia County by putting the power of technology to use for community benefit, connecting people online or off, and improving STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) education. 2020 Facebook Los Lunas Data Center Community Action Grants recipients are:

- All For Animals, Inc., \$10,644, support county-wide animal welfare and control through specialized software and rugged laptops for outdoor use.
- Belen Consolidated Schools, \$23,600, fund a STEM lending library in the Belen District to ensure teachers have the science and technology resources needed for student success.
- Civil Air Patrol, \$7,500, support Civil Air Patrol search and rescue efforts, disaster relief, and STEM / aerospace education.
- Community Wellness Council, \$1,990, support community wellness classes that promote behavioral health, healthy eating, and prevention of substance abuse and domestic violence.
- Crossroads for Women, \$7,000, provide laptops and software to support teaching computer and workplace technology skills to women in need.
- La Promesa Elementary School, \$8,000, support the school with a SMART technology display and presentation equipment.
- Los Lunas Public Schools, \$23,600, fund a STEM lending library in the Los Lunas District to ensure teachers have the science and technology resources for student success.
- Los Lunas Public Schools, \$32,020, support STEM education in the Los Lunas District with Makerspace equipment and virtual reality headsets.
- New Mexico HOSA-future health professionals, \$9,000, support health science education at the high school level, including professional development and training for science teachers.
- Rio Communities Optimist Club, \$9,570, technology and teacher grant for a multi-day STEM camp using LEGO WeDo and LEGO Mindstorm robotics kits.
- School of Dreams Academy (SODA), \$15,000, support expansion of the SODA Junior Botball program, instilling STEM values in students through robotics demonstrations and competitions.
- Sundance Elementary School, \$13,800, support science exploration kits at Sundance.
- TNT Boxing and Mentoring Club, \$12,180, provide computers and internet access to Valencia County youth mentorship programs.
- University of New Mexico Valencia (UNM), \$16,000, support summer youth STEM camps at UNM Valencia, teaching skills such as coding, game design, robotics, digital media, and career exploration.
- Valencia County Amateur Radio Association, \$9,800, assist the association in providing support to emergency response agencies, participating in county events, and providing communications support.
- Valencia County Partnership for a Work Ready Community, \$5,296, support career, technical, job skill, workforce development, and education programs in Valencia County.
- The Wright Choice Learning Center, \$5,000, support pre-K STEM education in Valencia County with computers, monitors, and tablets.

Last year, nearly \$170,000 was given out to various Valencia County groups who submitted applications in the fall. This year, the 17 non-profits and schools were awarded \$210,000.

DO NOT WATER 10 A.M. TO 4 P.M.

Village Public Works Director Michael Jaramillo reminds Village water customers that outside trees, plants, and turf should NOT be watered between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.,

Watering should be done between 4 a.m. and 10 a.m. and / or 4 p.m. to 11 p.m. when the water treatment plant is more efficient using the water received.

Village ordinance 8.24.040 (Water Restrictions) states that starting April 30 and ending September 30, plants, trees or turf should not be watered during the hours of 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Watering during the heat of the day increases water loss.
