The COVID-19 Pandemic has changed all our lives in many ways.

Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham has temporarily ordered New Mexicans to shelter-in-place creating new lifestyles. Some businesses have had to close their doors with owners hoping to reopen and stay open. Restaurants serve only to-go or curbside food, no sitting in dining rooms.

Eventually there will be a move back to normal, or to what has been called the "new normal". It will probably be a slow move to that new normal while officials figure out how to prevent a possible resurgence of the coronavirus.

As businesses and restaurants operate in the new normal, owners and workers will be depending on customers to help them keep the doors open.

Village Economic Development Manager Ralph L. Mims reminds people to shop in Los Lunas and Valencia County. "When you shop locally you help the whole community," said Mims.

Watch for the opening of businesses in Valencia County. Show your support.

As you show support, remember that the Village of Los Lunas continues to provide its usual services, but with some changes to protect people from the coronavirus.

VILLAGE IMPROVEMENTS CONTINUE

Despite the COVID-19 Pandemic, the Village has finished several projects that improve the lives of citizens of Los Lunas and the surrounding area. These include:

- General Park Improvements – fencing completed around Buena Vista Park. New playground equipment to be installed at Chester Skinner Park.
- Fleet Maintenance Building Addition – new metal building addition finished to the Village fleet maintenance shop.

- Camino del Rey Improvements – repaved roadway from Angel Wings to Castillo Road, including replacing non-conforming ADA sidewalks and storm drainage.
 - Parking Lot / Drainage Improvements – repaired Los Cerritos Park parking lot (south side) and repaired storm drains at Sandoval, Schmidt, Otero, and Sichler Roads.
 - Right-of-Way Improvements – Morris Road and Camelot Improvements near prison have been completed.
 - Waste Water Treatment Plant Effluent Tank – prepared groundwater discharge permit application for use of effluent water for construction purposes plus designed and constructed new effluent loadout station.
 - North Waterline Loop Phase II – ran 1.5 miles of 18-inch waterline and 2-inch fiber optic conduit on the north side of Los Lunas.
 - Water/Sewer Extensions – extended sewer service to a property within the Village limits on Sichler Road.
 - Recycling Center Solar Power Project – installed new solar system at Village Recycling Center on Don Pasqual.
- Projects expected to be completed this spring or summer include:
- Huning Ranch Park Tennis Courts – six new tennis courts with appropriate lighting and landscaping at Huning Ranch Park.
 - Daniel Fernandez Park – a splash pad will be available for use this summer.
 - Sports Complex – shade / trellis structure around gazebo, landscaping, a trail, and ADA improvements.

LIBRARY, MUSEUM OFFER LOTS TO DO

Sheltering-in-place may not have been easy, especially with the Los Lunas Public Library and Museum of Heritage and Arts closed to protect people from COVID-19. But the people at the library and museum came up with creative and entertaining ways to deliver services.

Facebook posts of At Home with Ronda videos features gardening tips. It has a following with comments of how Ronda is inspiring people to plant gardens to keep fit and mentally balanced during the quarantine.

Some other library staff projects —

- Created video tutorials on accessing Mango Languages and posted on Facebook.
- Set up online gaming platform in JackboxTV where people can play against each other in Jeopardy-like games.
- Meditation music posted which was created and edited by staff member Manuel Mora.
- Posted free ebook and movie sites on Facebook.
- Posted free exercise videos from YouTube and area gyms on Facebook.
- Posted miscellaneous content of interest to Facebook patrons.

Among the Museum of Heritage and Arts projects —

- Online tutorial posted on Facebook about accessing HeritageQuest, an online genealogy database accessible with a library card.
- Digital presence created to highlight the current museum exhibit, "Wonder Women of the Rio Abajo," via Facebook.
- Researched local history and posted photos and biographies of local and state interest.
- Set up an online Quarantine Art Show to help record this historical pandemic event.
- Researched German POW camps and WWII for future exhibits and presentations.
- Researched and posted on Facebook content of interest to patrons.
- Researched and prepared for the June New Mexico Navy exhibit.

Library and museum staff researched and posted many items of interest to patrons on Facebook. The blog has many activities, videos, and things to do.

Tens of thousands of people have been reached via the internet, says Village Library Director Cynthia Shetter. She commends the library staff for "stepping up to the plate" when the coronavirus pandemic hit Los Lunas and New Mexico.

The library's circulation and cataloguing system are web-based so staff has been able to catalogue from home.

FILL OUT CENSUS FORM

For the first time ever, the U.S. Census is available online.

Everyone needs to fill out the Census form which helps to determine congressional representation, federal funding for road and infrastructure projects, and a variety of programs like Medicaid and SNAP.

An undercount of just 1% of Valencia County's residents in the 2020 Census could result in a loss of over \$22 million dollars for the area over the next decade.

MEMORIAL RUN AND WALK NOW 2021

The 9th annual Believe in Heroes Memorial Run and Walk has been scheduled for Saturday, June 5, 2021, after being cancelled in 2020.

The event, presented by Los Lunas Invested in Veteran Events (L.I.V.E. Inc.), has raised over \$100,000 for veteran organizations such as VFW, Blue Star Mothers, and American Legion.

Participants can choose from adult 5k/10k; rucksack 5k; 65+ 5k/10k; student 13-17; and Kid K for 12 and under.

WORK ON NM HWY 314

Work has begun on a bike and pedestrian path extension on NM Hwy 314 north of NM Hwy 6 / Main Street.

Project work includes sidewalk, multipurpose path, lighting, irrigation, and landscaping on both sides of NM Hwy 314 between NM Hwy 6 / Main Street and Romeroville Road (previously known as Ellen).

The Village Council awarded Star Paving Inc. the contract for the job in the amount of \$2,671,381.92 without New Mexico Gross Receipts Tax in November 2019. The project did not start until April 2020 due to weather delays.

The project is funded through the New Mexico Department of Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) with 80% federal funds and 20% local funds.

YOUR VILLAGE SEWER BILL

The average calculated sewer rates are reflected in the April Village utility statement.

This charge is calculated using water usage from October through February inclusive.

The meter reads for this time period result in a calculated average and are charged according to the sewer rate increase effective January 1, 2016.

FLUSH ONLY TOILET PAPER

The Village Public Works Department reminds everyone to flush only toilet paper in the toilet.

Do NOT flush sanitary napkins, paper towels, wash rags, baby wipes, unpaid bills, junk mail, a pet goldfish, or anything but toilet paper down the toilet.

LLPD ENFORCES RULES FOR OHVS

The Los Lunas Police Department monitors and enforces the regulations for off-highway vehicles (OHV) on public roadways and private property.

Officers point out that New Mexico law prohibits the operation of OHV/ATV's on public roadways, sidewalks, ditches, the bosque, and private property without the consent from the property owner.

No municipality in Valencia County allows OHV/ATV's to be operated legally on public roadways.

OHV/ATV equipment requirements:

- Safety helmets. All off-highway motor vehicle operators and passengers under the age of eighteen shall wear safety helmets that comply with state and federal safety standards.
- Eye protection. Unless the off-highway motor vehicle has a protective windscreen, all off-highway motor vehicle operators and passengers must wear eye protection.

People who see an OHV/ATV operating illegally should call the Valencia County Regional Dispatch Center with a description of the OHV/ATV, operator, and location at 505 865-9130.

Anonymous tips can be submitted through the LLPD's "STOPit" mobile application available on all smart phones. (enter access code: loslunaspd)

PAY YOUR VILLAGE UTILITY BILL ONLINE

The Village's online bill payment option can save time and provide more flexibility in paying the Village utility bill.

With an Internet connection and an email address, the utility bill can be paid online. It's fast, it's easy, and there's no need to write a check each month or find a stamp to send the payment.

The Village has partnered with Xpress Bill Pay, for online bill payment.

When you sign up for online bill payment you get a unique password to access your personal account at the Xpress Bill Pay site. Every month a reminder email is sent to let you know when your bill is online.

Then log in and view your bill, which looks like the paper statement.

Select a payment type, credit card, debit card, or electronic funds transfer, enter the information, and you're done.

It's easy, and only takes a few minutes each month.
