LOS LUNAS TEAM COMMITTED TO SERVING LITERACY VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

The Village of Los Lunas Council and Executive Leadership Team are committed to serving the residents and businesses that call Los Lunas home.

The growth of our Village and attracting new businesses to the area provides jobs for our residents, and taxes to pay for the Village's needed services including road upgrades, the Public Library and Museum of Heritage & Arts, police and fire departments and outdoor amenities.

- Worked with various developers on new home subdivisions

The Valencia County Literacy Council is seeking volunteer tutors.

VILLAGE RECOGNIZED AS ENERGY EFFICIENT

The Village of Los Lunas has been recognized as a Business Energy Efficiency Star Award Winner for outstanding participation in the PNM Business Energy Efficiency Programs in 2020.

The Village submitted a rebate application on behalf of the recent I-25 High Mast LED Lighting Project. PNM provided a rebate in the amount of \$23,205.30.

The decision to replace the high pressure sodium light fixtures (yellow light) with LED light fixtures will obtain a 2.18-year return on investment (ROI). In addition, the 106,614 kWh savings were enough to power 16 homes a year and removed 59 metric tons of carbon dioxide from the air with a savings of 34,970 gallons of water.

Village Public Works Director Michael Jaramillo thanked Village employee Ray Marquez for taking ownership of this project and making sure it was completed as planned. In addition, thanks to Dominic Garcia with Facility Solutions Group for providing the technical expertise and installation of these new fixtures.

Since 2007 PNM energy efficient programs have given customers almost \$100 million back in rebates and saved almost 44.5 billion kilowatt hours of electricity, enough to power approximately 660,000 homes for a year.

Helping business customers save money by becoming more energy-wise is an important part of what PNM does. These programs have kept an estimated 2.7 million metric tons of carbon dioxide out of the air and saved 1.5 billion gallons of water.



MUNICIPAL COURT

Providing adjudication of all violations of all Village Ordinances and criminal offenses

- Arraigning persons cited for Municipal Ordinances

VILLAGE HAS PHASED REOPENING PLAN

The Village COVID-19 phased reopening plan is intended to define coordinated strategies for preparedness, response, and reopening actions related to COVID-19 within the Village of Los Lunas.

This phased reopening plan will support the existing New Mexico Department of Health plans by applying their principles to the specific needs and challenges of COVID-19.

The Village of Los Lunas is committed to providing a safe and healthy workplace for all employees and residents. To ensure the Village has a safe and healthy workplace, the Village Team has developed a COVID-19 phased reopening plan. The goal is to mitigate the potential for transmission of COVID-19 in workplaces and community, and that requires full cooperation among staff and management.

Only through this cooperative effort can the Village establish and maintain the safety and health of staff, workplaces, and residents. Management and staff are responsible for implementing and complying with all aspects of this COVID-19 phased reopening plan.

COVID-Safe Practices (CSPs) and Social Distancing in the Workplace

1. Continue to encourage teleworking to the greatest extent possible.
2. Arrange workplace to provide for six feet of distance between individuals wherever possible.
3. Stagger work schedules of employees to allow for less frequent person-to-person contact in the workplace wherever possible.
4. Close common areas where personnel are likely to congregate, like breakrooms.
5. Have staff meetings or training done remotely whenever possible.
6. All Village Employees are to wear face coverings while at work when in contact with the public or co-workers.
7. Train all employees on daily cleaning station with prior approval.

AN EASY WAY TO PAY YOUR VILLAGE UTILITY BILL

The Village's online bill payment option saves time and offers more flexibility in paying the utility bill.

With an Internet connection and an email address, you can pay your utility bill online. It's fast, it's easy, and you no longer have to write a check each month or find a stamp when it's time to send in your payment.

The Village has partnered with Xpress Bill Pay, a provider for online bill payment systems.

When you sign up for online bill payment you get a unique password to access your personal account at the Xpress Bill Pay site. Every month the Village sends you a reminder email that your bill is online.

Then, log in through your Web browser and view your bill, which looks like the paper statement you're familiar with. Select a payment type - credit card, debit card, or electronic funds transfer - enter the information, and you're done.

It's that easy, and it only takes you a few minutes each month.

SAFETY TIPS WHEN CROSSING THE STREET

There's plenty of opportunities to walk in the Village, points out Police Chief Naithan Gurule, that include crossing the street. Here's some safety measures,

Stop at the curb or the edge of the road if there is no curb.

Stop and look left, then right, then left again for moving cars before you step into the street.

If you see a car, wait until it goes by. Then look left, right, left again until no cars are coming.

If a car is parked where you are crossing, look to make sure there is no driver and that the car is not running. Go to the edge of the car and look left-right-left to see if cars are coming.

When no cars are coming, walk — do not run — across the road. Keep looking left-right-left for cars while you are crossing.
