INTERCHANGE PROJECT MOVING FORWARD

The much-anticipated Los Lunas / I-25 interchange construction project is one step closer to reality.

Senators Martin Heinrich and Ben Ray Luján announced \$25 million in grant funding for the project from the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) for the Village of Los Lunas, through DOT's INFRA grant program.

The funding will be used to design and construct a new interchange on I-25 at Morris Road, a river crossing, four signalized intersections, and approximately four miles of four-lane highway.

Los Lunas has experienced heavy commuter traffic and this interchange will relieve congestion caused by traffic, railway crossings, and construction.

In the Village, the new construction will relieve traffic on NM Hwy 6, which will allow for more efficient trips / access to services along NM Hwy 6 (Main Street). It will also relieve congestion and improve safety allowing Emergency Medical Services a quicker response time.

In Valencia County, it will provide a needed east-west corridor for daily work commuters who are trying to get from the east side of the Rio Grande to Interstate 25 to head to Albuquerque for work and back home in the evening.

"This new interchange will provide another bridge crossing over the Rio Grande and will function a lot like Paseo del Norte in Albuquerque providing a corridor with minimal interruptions to allow commuter traffic a more efficient transportation network," said Greg Martin, Village Administrator.

Martin added, "Additionally, it will reduce traffic for visitors coming to the area. We are grateful to the senators for helping us attain this funding, as well as for the hard work and assistance of our state and regional partners, including the New Mexico Department of Transportation, which has allocated and committed a significant portion of the remaining funding needed to complete this project."

The INFRA grant program is designed for states to complete large-scale projects that address national and regional highway and bridge infrastructure issues – beyond the scope of other discretionary programs.

Groundbreaking is anticipated to take place in the fall of 2022. The project will cost approximately \$120 million.

VILLAGE IMPROVEMENTS CONTINUE WITH PROJECTS

As we drive around the Village we see various projects being worked on. Some projects might be considered minor, like sidewalk repair. Other projects could be called major, such as the rebuilding of road intersections.

Projects are not always visible to the public like improving computer technology or improving the waste water treatment plant.

Other projects are not the responsibility of the Village, such as the Courthouse Road and NM Hwy 314 realignment project (state), or miscellaneous fiber optic line installation projects (private companies).

Funding for Village projects comes from a variety of sources, including the Village budget, grants, loans, and state funds.

The Village has more than 60 projects in some stage of completion. Here are five of them:

- Daniel Fernandez Park Improvements - Design and partial construction of improvements to Daniel Fernandez Recreation Center - including a new (second) gymnasium.
- Sports Complex Improvements - Install lights and artificial turf on two ball fields.
- NM Hwy 314 Bike / Pedestrian Improvements - Romeroville Road to Griego Road (Phase three of improvements already made from Morris Road to James Street, including trail, lights, landscaping, etc.).
- South Los Lentes Road Improvements - Aspen Drive to Morris Road (Roadway improvements, including ADA sidewalks, lighting, and storm water drainage).
- Central NM Rail Park Sewer Line and Water Line Extensions (To extend Sewer and Water Service to the Central NM Rail Park).

POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

This is the second in a two-part series about the 2020 Village of Los Lunas Annual Police Department Report.

The first half appeared in the July 2021 Village newsletter which is available at loslunasnm.gov.

DWI in Los Lunas:

During this last year, the Police Department made 88 arrests for DWI, a 14.7% increase in DWI arrests since 2019.

The DWI Unit accounted for under half of these, 33 DWI, 37.5 percent of the police department's arrests. Patrol accounted for 55.7% of the department's DWI arrests and the department's DWI Traffic Unit accounted for 6.8% of the Department's DWI arrests.

In 2019, Saturday between 11 p.m. and midnight was the peak time for DWI arrests.

In 2020, the peak time was Saturdays between 10 and 11 p.m. Thursday, Friday and Saturday between 7 p.m. and 3 a.m. also had the majority of DWI arrests in Los Lunas.

The DWI Unit's schedule adjusts according to the needs of the community and is dependent on statistical data.

DO NOT WATER 10 A.M. TO 4 P.M.

Village Public Works Director Michael Jaramillo reminds Village water customers that outside trees, plants, and turf should NOT be watered between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

Watering should be done between 4 a.m. and 10 a.m. and / or 4 p.m. to 11 p.m. when the water treatment plant is more efficient using the water received.

Village ordinance 8.24.040 (Water Restrictions) states that starting April 30 and ending September 30, plants, trees or turf should not be watered during the hours of 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Watering during the heat of the day increases water loss.

VILLAGE LIBRARY CELEBRATES 55 YEARS

In 1959 the Belen Women's Club created a branch of the Eastern Valencia County Library System in Los Lunas with a donation of over 300 books housed in the Valencia County Courthouse on the northwest corner of Luna Avenue and Main Street.

It was then moved to the teacher's apartment complex on Luna Avenue where the Los Lunas Middle School Gym is presently located.

In 1965, the Village Council granted the library the entire west side of the Village's community building located on the southwest corner of Main Street and Luna Avenue that was built in the 1930's as a Works Progress Administration project at the request of librarian Ruth Tondre and community members.

At that time, Mayor Howard. C. Simpson and Councilmen Felix C. Marquez, Telesfor T. Archuleta, William L. Place and Reuben Sais recognized the community's need for a free public library.

The Council approved Ordinance No. 63 to establish and maintain the Los Lunas Community Public Library effective August 17, 1966.

With these modest beginnings, the Library's collections grew, along with the community, to the point that another building at 460 Main Street, NE (formerly known as the Bernie Gonzales Health Clinic) was purchased in 1987 when NM Hwy 6 was widened.

In 1988, under the direction of Carmen M Jaramillo-Campos, the property was renovated, and the library moved to its present location.

Since that move, the library has added four additions. First was a reading room and program room on the northwest side in 1992. Second was the southwest computer lab in 1997.

Then a magazine room (now the teen room) on the northeast was added on with a fourth addition completed in 2003 on the west that expanded the parking lot as well.

With the resignation of Ruth Tondre in 1971, Lisa Mitchell was appointed Librarian.

There have been several Librarians: Sylvia Aragon; Katherine Gallegos and Carmen M. Jaramillo-Campos. Mrs. Jaramillo-Campos was the library director for 27 years when she retired in June 2004. Cynthia J. Shetter is the current Library Director.

On February 29, 2008, the Los Lunas Public Library held the grand opening of its first branch library, the Museum of Heritage & Arts, located under the downtown water tower at the corner of Main Street / NM Hwy 6 and Luna Avenue.

The museum came about after a series of events that catapulted the library staff into a new realm of history, preservation, technology, culture and more.

This is the story of the rise of a small branch library that is striving to be a premier digital research library and cultural outlet for its community.
