## RECYCLING FOR THE HOLIDAYS IN THE VILLAGE

The holidays always seem to generate more "trash" than is generated other times of the year. That makes the Holiday Season a good time to recycle as much as possible which is easy to do in Los Lunas.

The Village Recycling Center is a state-registered drop-off recycling center located just north of the Fred Luna Multigenerational Center on Don Pasqual Road.

The Village of Los Lunas Recycling Program began in 1993.

The Recycling Center accepts:

- Cardboard (no chipboard/wax board)
- Plastic (#1 and #2 only)
- Aluminum
- Metals
- Paper
- White goods (i.e., washers, dryers, stoves, water heaters, refrigerators)
- Glass
- Paints are accepted at the transfer station with prior approval from the Solid Waste office.
- Oils accepted at the transfer station with prior approval.
- Electronics
- TV's: all TV's cost \$20, not just the monitors that contain a CRT.

Plastic bags should not be left in the recycling bins.

## DANIEL D. FERNANDEZ HONORED

The bridge in Los Lunas over the Rio Grande has been dedicated as the Daniel D. Fernandez Veterans Memorial Bridge.

VFW Post 9676 has created a bridge fund to assist with the initial cost of fabrication and installation of the plaques and any future costs of maintaining the memorial and tributes to Daniel D. Fernandez and all veterans.

At its July 15, 2021, meeting in Las Cruces, the New Mexico State Transportation Commission unanimously voted to name the NM Hwy 6 / Main Street river bridge "Daniel D. Fernandez Veterans Memorial Bridge" after the local Medal of Honor recipient.

Fernandez was a U.S. Army specialist 4th class who died on February 18, 1966, while serving during the Vietnam War. He threw himself on top of a grenade to save his comrades while they were rescuing another wounded soldier.

Fernandez's name is also on a park, the local VFW Post 9676, and the former Daniel D. Fernandez Intermediate School.

U.S. President Lyndon B. Johnson posthumously awarded Fernandez's family with the Medal of Honor in 1967.

Naming the bridge in Fernandez's honor was brought up in 2015 when several Valencia High School National Honor Society members presented a petition to the Los Lunas Village Council with 75 signatures supporting the bridge be named in Fernandez's honor.

The council unanimously approved the name change in 2017.

The students and their sponsor, Lori Kastelic, wanted to raise awareness of Fernandez and build a memorial in a public place.

The \$18.7 million reconstruction of the bridge essentially concluded this year.



## QUILTING PRESENTATION

The Valencia County Historical Society, with the Village Museum of Heritage & Arts, is sponsoring a pre-recorded lecture on quilting by local master quilter Roberta Scott.

The presentation is available on the Los Lunas Museum of Heritage and Arts Facebook page beginning Dec. 8, 2021.

The presentation features examples of several unique quilts by Valencia County quilters and includes a discussion about techniques and local resources for all levels of quilting expertise.

Stitching fabric and padding together, a process commonly known as quilting, may date as far back as 3,400 BCE.

Everyone interested in quilting is encouraged to log on to this fascinating presentation.

## MOVE OVER FOR EMERGENCY VEHICLES

Not all “work zones” on the road involve construction, but all workers on the road deserve attentive and cautious drivers -- especially in emergency situations, points out Village Police Chief Naithan Gurule.

New Mexico’s Move Over Laws are intended to protect workers performing their necessary duties on New Mexico roadways.

As soon as drivers see flashing emergency lights, they should reduce their speed and increase the distance from the vehicle in front of them. This increases visibility and the ability to safely react to whatever situation is ahead.

On multiple-lane highways, change lanes away from the emergency vehicle if it is safe to do so to provide a safer space for workers and help traffic see the emergency vehicle.

If it is not safe to change lanes, drivers should reduce speed at least ten miles per hour under the posted speed limit, move as far away as possible within their lane, and proceed with caution.

Motorists should not stop in the road because this can cause a chain reaction of rear-end collisions.

As you drive, look well ahead and watch for these vehicles:

- Police vehicles
- Ambulances
- Fire trucks and rescue equipment
- Highway maintenance vehicles
- Utility service vehicles
- Vehicle recovery equipment such as tow trucks.

# HISTORY OF THE MUSEUM OF HERITAGE & ARTS

In 2004, New Mexico State Senator Michael Sanchez appropriated \$50,000 to the Los Lunas Public Library to purchase equipment to record the oral histories of area residents. The equipment was purchased, and the Mayor and Council hired area historian Patty Guggino to start collecting these histories.

As the collection grew, Mayor Louis Huning, Councilwoman Cecilia Castillo, Councilmen Charles Griego, Gerard Saiz, and Robert Vialpando recognized the need for a home for the collection.

It was decided to refurbish and renovate the Agustin Archuleta Building, a Works Progress Administration (WPA) building located under the downtown water tower. Work began in the spring of 2007.

In discussions with Village Administrator Phillip Jaramillo, Library Director Cynthia Shetter agreed that the new branch should be a cultural resource center for the community.

Not only would the branch house the oral histories and the library's southwest research collection, but art exhibits and other cultural endeavors as well.

A bank of computers would be installed for genealogical research to enhance the oral history project.

James Fernandez was hired in the fall of 2007 to coordinate the project. He worked with library and village staff as well as volunteers not only to build the collection but to create and book exhibits for the museum.

The endeavor has been a success.

To date the museum has collected over 150 oral histories and thousands of photos as well as artifacts for the collection. In addition, more than thirty local and traveling exhibits have been displayed.
