TEST AND VACCINATE

It's now been a year since the COVID-19 pandemic began its deadly march around the world.

People want this dreadful pandemic to end, as soon as possible. People want life to return to some form of "new and improved" normal.

For this to happen, we need Valencia County out of its current "red" designation, and into the so-called "green" designation (as of Feb. 1, 2021). For that to happen, we need to increase COVID-testing beyond just those with symptoms, and we need all to get vaccinated when the opportunity is presented.

You can still register for a COVID test at curative.com, see illustration page 2. There is also a less intrusive saliva test available, allowing more people to get tested, on a quicker basis.

You can order a kit sent to your home at vaulthealth.com, and perform the test in the safety and convenience of your own home.

Either way, we encourage you to get tested, regardless of your current health status, because healthy people without symptoms need to be tested frequently to bring the Valencia County infection rate below the 5% gating criteria.

Once we hit that target, Valencia County should be able to begin "re-opening."

Also, please register for and please get vaccinated against this debilitating and deadly disease.

Herd immunity is the eventual cure for re-starting our economy, schools, services, and former ways of life, and achieving that goal requires all recommended people to participate in the immunization process.

Go to cv.nmhealth.org/covid-vaccine to register and get in line for when the opportunity occurs for your demographic to be vaccinated.

Eventually our entire community and society will need to work on recovery. But it will require every individual doing their part. Please consider taking these two actions, as soon as possible.

JUBILEE TIME CAPSULE

Jubilee Los Lunas, a retirement community off NM Hwy 6 on the west side of Los Lunas, now has a buried time capsule on the property which is scheduled to be opened in 20 years.

Residents put a variety of items in the time capsule before burying it on New Year's Eve 2020.

A special ceremony was held at Jubilee that evening attended by variety of people including the mayors of Los Lunas, Belen, Rio Communities, and Bosque Farms.

The burying of the time capsule was also part of a documentary filmed by Eric Metzger, an award winning documentarian. The film is a conglomeration of more than 25 cinematographers who filmed the everyday lives of people under the Donald J. Trump presidency.

COLD WEATHER PRIME TIME FOR WARM-UP THEFTS

The term "Warm-Up Theft" is a widely used term among car thieves to describe the stealing of a car that has been left running and unattended to "warm-up."

During the winter months, many motorists are tempted to leave their vehicle running to warm up the interior prior to getting behind the wheel. However, this practice is one that causes two problems.

First, leaving a car unattended and running is a violation of the Village of Los Lunas Municipal Code Ord. 12-12-18, which can result in up to a \$500 fine and, second, the practice of leaving your vehicle running and unattended provides for a quick and easy target for car thieves.

Following these simple tips will help keep you from being left out in the cold:

- Never leave your car running or the keys in the ignition when you are away from it, even for "just a minute."
- Keep valuables out of sight or in the trunk. Purses, credit cards, and cell phones in plain view only help attract thieves.

VALENCIA COUNTY MASTER GARDENER PROGRAM

The Valencia County Extension Master Gardener (VCEMG) program, sponsored by the Cooperative Extension Service, New Mexico State University, is going on now.

The program serves the educational needs of Valencia County's urban (non-commercial) horticultural community.

Local experienced gardeners are provided specialized horticultural training in exchange for a minimum of 40-hours of volunteer service throughout the following year as directed by the Extension Agriculture Agent or Interim VCEMG Agent Advisor.

The program offers an opportunity for experienced gardeners to gain research-based knowledge, while sharing their knowledge and expertise in the community.

WORKFORCE TRAINING CENTER IN LOS LUNAS

Construction of a new workforce training center in the Village of Los Lunas is expected to begin early in 2022.

The new training center will be located at 1020 Huning Ranch East Loop SW, directly west of La Vida Felicidad.

The center will offer classes and training focused on manufacturing and industry as well as soft skills that local business owners say are needed in the workforce. Also offered will be hands-on training for skills such as welding and computer.

Plans for the center include a large bay area where the university can bring in equipment such as large plastic injection molds so students can use machines that are on factory floors.

The Small Business Development Center will have space at the training center. SBDC will also maintain its offices at the UNM-Valencia campus in Tome.

The center will be built on nine acres donated to the University by the Huning Ltd. Partnership. The new campus, which is west of Interstate 25 and south of NM Hwy 6, is roughly halfway between NM Hwy 6 and the future I-25 interchange connecting a new roadway to NM Hwy 47.

DRIVE-IN THEATER TO OPEN

The Los Lunas Drive-In Theater was scheduled to open the first weekend in February.

The number of cars at the drive-in is limited due to continuing mass gathering restrictions.

There were concessions as well as a food truck during the opening weeks.

The drive-in theater is located at the former Badlands BMX Park on NM Hwy 314. Construction was completed in November.

LIBRARY CURBSIDE PICKUP RETURNS

The Village Public Library has resumed contactless curbside pickup.

To help stop the spread of COVID-19, the library will remain closed to the public and will open in phases as the New Mexico Department of Health relaxes restrictions.

If you would like to participate in curbside service, please follow these steps:

Step one - Place your items on hold here: <https://www.loslunaspubliclibrary.org> or call 839-3850 for staff assistance.

Step two - library staff will prepare the items you requested and will call you to arrange a pickup date and time.


Step three - On your assigned pickup date, arrive at the library at the assigned time.

Choose a designated pickup parking space. These curbside spaces will be marked 1 through 4. After you have parked, call the library at 839-3850 and let staff know what space number you are in.

Library staff will bring bagged items to your vehicle. Please have your trunk or back door open so staff can easily drop off items with no contact.

Please note: Staff will practice social distancing and will not accept returned books at curbside. This helps conserve personal protection equipment as well.

Returning books should be placed in the book drop located next to the front doors of the Los Lunas Library.
