COVID-19 VACCINE AND THE VILLAGE

Efforts to combat COVID-19 in the greater Los Lunas area started on Dec. 18, 2020, and continue today.

As of Feb. 22, 2021, the Los Lunas Fire Department estimates the department has been involved in administering nearly 5,700 doses of the Pfizer vaccine. An increase in the weekly average is anticipated in March and it is hoped it continues.

"Large distribution sites are up and running throughout Valencia County thanks to a team of professionals comprised of Los Lunas Fire Department, Valencia County Fire Department, Los Lunas Parks and Recreation, Los Lunas Schools Nursing and Security staff, Belen Schools Nursing and Security staff, and the unsung heroes from the local public health offices," said Village Fire Chief John Gabaldon.

"We have had support from several other agencies not listed and wish to thank everyone for their commitment to our community," Gabaldon said.

TRAFFIC SAFETY FACTS

For more than two decades, speeding has been involved in approximately one-third of all motor vehicle fatalities. In 2017, speeding was a contributing factor in 26% of all traffic fatalities.

Speed also affects your safety even when you are driving at the speed limit but too fast for road conditions, such as during bad weather, when a road is under repair or in an area at night that isn't well lit.

Speeding endangers not only the life of the speeder, but all the people on the road around them, including law enforcement officers, points out Village Police Chief Naithan Gurule

Speeding is more than just breaking the law. The consequences are far-ranging:

- Greater potential for loss of vehicle control
- Reduced effectiveness of occupant protection equipment
- Increased stopping distance after the driver perceives a danger
- Increased degree of crash severity leading to more severe injuries

The Village of Los Lunas Facility received the New Mexico Water and Wastewater Association (NMWWA) Section Presidents Award for Most Improved Facility at the NMWWS virtual awards ceremony the end of January.

Former Village employee Steven Freeman received the NMWWA Outstanding Lab Analyst Facility Operator of the Year Award.

WWTP supervisor Craig Byers received the NMWWA Caroline Martinez Achievement Award. This award is presented to an individual who best demonstrates a significant or outstanding achievement or accomplishment during that year.

Byers demonstrated his outstanding accomplishments with his leadership and management of the Village wastewater treatment facilities. Byers had operational responsibilities in the management of a new sludge management facility and the effluent load-out station.

Byers has been elected president-elect by the NMWWA.

PROPERTIES NEED ATTENTION?

Junk cars, weeds, accumulations of junk or trash are eyesores and in violation of Village of Los Lunas ordinances.

The Code Enforcement Division does routine patrols through neighborhoods and commercial areas in the Village limits year round, but code enforcement officers do not always see everything.

RECYCLING IN THE VILLAGE

The Village of Los Lunas Recycling Program began in 1993.

With time and with dedicated staff, the community now has access to a state-registered drop-off recycling center located just north of the Fred Luna Multigenerational Center on Don Pasqual Road.

The Recycling Center accepts:

- Cardboard (No chipboard/wax board)
- Plastic (#1 and #2 only)
- Aluminum
- Metals
- Paper
- White goods (i.e. washers, dryers, stoves, water heaters, refrigerators)
- Glass
- Paints are accepted at the transfer station with prior approval from the Solid Waste office.
- Oils accepted at the transfer station with prior approval.
- Electronics
- TV's: all TV's cost \$20, not just the monitors that contain a CRT. Plastic bags should not be left in the recycling bin.

This is the second in a series about what makes the Village of Los Lunas work.

The Village of Los Lunas Public Works Department consists of five divisions. Each division plans and directs the implementations of goals, work objectives, and work standards within their assigned responsibilities.

The responsibilities, activities, and services include street maintenance, solid waste collection, waste water treatment, fleet maintenance, water sewer production and distribution; in addition, to street light, right-of-way, traffic lights and sidewalk maintenance.

The Public Works Department goal is to plan, develop, maintain, and construct the Village of Los Lunas infrastructure. This includes road surface management, storm water collection, water distribution and sanitary collections systems in support of current and future development and growth within the Village.

The Department is dedicated to maintaining and improving the quality of life in the Village of Los Lunas.

Public Works Department special projects are the I-25 Interchange and East/West Corridor Project.

DRIVE-IN THEATER OPEN

The Los Lunas drive-in theater is open.
