BEST OFS IN LOS LUNAS

Daniel D. Fernandez Memorial Park was voted "Best Park" in the "Best Of" Valencia County 2021 sponsored by the Valencia County News-Bulletin.

The News-Bulletin pointed out that "for more than 40 years the park has been a go-to spot for many local events. It contains numerous sports and outdoor facilities such as tennis courts, soccer and baseball fields, horseshoe pits, and a new splash pad which opened to the public for the first time this past summer."

The park is located at 1103 NM Hwy 314, phone 505 839-3845.

For the second year in a row, Los Lunas Fire Chief John Gabaldon was voted Best Firefighter in Valencia County.

Gabaldon was first hired as a career firefighter with the department in 1988. He became chief in 2016.

Other 2021 "Best ofs" associated with Los Lunas include:

Teofilo's Restaurant won for Best Sopaipilla, Best Green Chile and Best Salsa. The restaurant, located at 144 Main St. NE, phone 505 865-5511, was opened in 1985 by Pete and Hortencia Torres. Their daughters, Johnnah Torres and Joell Himeur, now operate the business.

JARAMILLO PRESENTED PLAQUE

At the final 2021 Village Council meeting, Los Lunas Mayor Charles Griego presented outgoing Village Councilor Phillip Jaramillo with a plaque commemorating his time serving the citizens of Council District Four and the citizens of Los Lunas.

Jaramillo was appointed to the Council District Four seat in May 2018 following the death of Councilwoman Paulette Sanchez-Montoya in April 2018. He served on the council until Dec. 31, 2021.

EMPLOYEE NOW CERTIFIED

Village Water Superintendent Scott White has met the requirements for utility operator certification adopted by the New Mexico Water Quality Control Commission pursuant to the Utility Operator Certification Act.

White is now certified as a Utility Operator authorized to operate and maintain Water Supply Level 4 by the New Mexico Environment Department.

In addition, White will be the first certified Water Supply Level 4 operator within the Village of Los Lunas.

A level 4 operator ensures water quality is produced and delivered to the community by experts in their field of expertise.

LOCAL DWI PROGRAM

This is the first part of a series about the local DWI program.

The Village of Los Lunas / Valencia County Local DWI (VLL / V C LDWI) program is administered through the Village of Los Lunas as the fiscal agent and serves all of Valencia County. DWI stands for Driving While Intoxicated.

The program funded the following components in Fiscal Year 2019: Compliance, Coordination, Planning and Evaluation, Enforcement, Prevention, and Treatment.

Screening is a component that is self-sustained, but is also provided through the DWI Program.

The VLL / VC LDWI program partners with the Rocky Mountain Offenders Management Systems (RMOMS) to oversee alternative sentence services and Valencia Shelter Services for the Domestic Violence services.

LDWI Funding:

- \$437,881.00 = Distribution Grant
- \$86,000 = Grant
- \$119,096 = Administrative In-kind
- \$13,125.00 = Collected Fees

Village of Los Lunas / Valencia County LDWI Data Between 2014 and 2019 --

- In 2019 Valencia County was responsible for 5.3% (388 of 7,214) total DWI arrests in New Mexico.
- Alcohol-related motor vehicle traffic crash deaths decreased from a rate of 6.8 in 2013-2017 to 3.9 in 2014-2018. This rate is lower than the state rate of 5.3.
- The number of alcohol-related crashes in Valencia County reduced between 2017 and 2018 by 12 crashes (53 to 41) with DWI-alcohol-involved crashes decreasing steadily in Valencia County since 2015 with 58 crashes to 41 crashes in 2018.
- Alcohol-involved teen fatalities have remained at zero since 2015.
- In 2019, the District Court had 35 cases with a 45.7% conviction rate.
- In 2019, the Magistrate Courts had 353 cases with a 43.6% conviction rate.

DWI PLANNING COUNCIL

The VLL / V C LDWI Program has a very active and supportive DWI Planning Council which advocates for community collaboration to increase conviction rates, successful outcomes in probation / compliance, access to effective treatment, and the implementation of evidence-based prevention activities, programs, and policies community wide.

The Planning Council has twelve members representing more than six categories including courts, law enforcement, health council, the Department of Health, clergy, and the Juvenile Justice Board.

General Board membership has active representation from Magistrate Courts, St. Matthew's Church, law enforcement, the Community Wellness Council, the Department of Health, Youth Development Inc., DWI Drug Court, Valencia Shelter Services, Office of Substance Abuse Prevention.

Also, Full Circle Recovery, NM Veterans Administration, Juvenile Justice Board, TNT Boxing and Youth Mentoring, VLL / VC Police Athletic League, NM Mothers Against Drunk Driving, and community members.

GRAFFITI IN THE VILLAGE

Removing graffiti and repairing the damage it causes costs the Village of Los Lunas precious tax dollars.

Area properties can be devalued and business owners can lose customers from the negative image that graffiti generates. Graffiti can send the message that a community is having problems which is not good for that community.

You can help reduce graffiti by immediately reporting all graffiti sightings. The faster graffiti is cleaned up, the less graffiti that appears.

Village graffiti removal paint crews are on the job five days a week to eradicate graffiti on public and private property. The crews either remove graffiti through water blasting or use paint matching for graffiti paint-overs.

To report graffiti anywhere within the Village limits, call the Los Lunas Police Department at 505 865-9130 or fill out the Graffiti Removal Request form under Forms and Applications on the Village website, loslunasnm.gov.

When the form is filled out, both the Village Facility Maintenance and Solid Waste Divisions receive the form. Facility Maintenance deals with graffiti on Village-owned property and Solid Waste deals with all private property.

Village Public Works Director Michael Jaramillo said handling graffiti removal service this way improves response times for that removal.
