# META COMMUNITY ACTION GRANTS HELP COMMUNITY

Meta's 2022 Valencia County Community Action Grants recipients have been announced.

Meta was formerly known as Facebook.

Through the Data Center Community Action Grants program, Meta provides funding for nonprofits and schools to support the long-term vitality of Valencia County.

Meta funds projects that help put the power of technology to use for community benefit, to connect people online or off, and to improve STEM education.

Meta congratulates the 2022 Los Lunas Data Center grant recipients and thanks them for their impactful work!

Recipients are:

All for Animals, \$14,000, to provide technology to help connect area residents to the animal shelter's services.

Belen Public Library, \$6,000, to provide STEAM tools to help align the local workforce's skills with small business needs.

CASA Partners 4NMKids, \$6,765, to provide technology equipment to enhance and support child advocacy for kids in foster care.

Dennis Chavez Elementary-Belen, \$14,000, to supply classroom technology to empower interaction and collaboration for in-person and virtual learning.

Explora, \$15,000, to deliver STEAM programming through Family Science Events, classroom explorations, and Explora@Home STEAM Learning Kits throughout Valencia County.

Kids Korner Preschool & Daycare, \$4,800, to provide technology to bridge STEM engagement with students, parents and the community.

La Promesa Elementary, \$8,800, to supply technology to enrich classroom learning experiences and professional development with interactive displays.

Lending A Paw Club at LLHS Tigers Official, \$8,000, to support the development of a free, community-based thrift store for students and the community at large.

Los Lunas Schools STEM Nights, \$35,000, to fund monthly STEM family nights throughout the district.

Los Lunas Schools for Podcast Studios, \$3,600, to support the development of podcast studios at each middle school in Los Lunas.

NM MESA, \$5,000, to promote equity in STEM virtual content by adding closed captioning and language translations.

Rio Grande Elementary (Belen), \$15,000, to provide computers and tablets to enhance student and family technology education in and out of the classroom.

Rural Education Advancement Program (REAP), \$17,500, to help bring the Junior Botball Challenge interactive STEM program to middle and high school students and staff throughout Valencia County.

School of Dreams Academy (SODA.), \$25,200, to provide technology tools to help students research for and excel at STEM competitions.

Friends of Whitfield Wildlife Conservation Area, \$6,650, to support the Farm to Table Camp, focusing on building intergenerational links between agriculturists and youth in Valencia County.

Valencia County Literacy Council, \$16,000, to expand outreach, programs and volunteer tutoring to improve literacy in the community.

Valencia Shelter Services, \$9,000, to support the Safe Survivor Communication Program for individuals and families

## BUSINESS INCUBATOR HELPS

The Valencia County Business Incubator is now helping people start and grow their businesses.

The Valencia County Business Incubator is housed in Rio Communities City Hall and uses space at the UNM-Valencia Workforce Training Center in the Village of Los Lunas for client intake meetings.

It was 2017 when people first considered a countywide business incubator. It was early 2018 when a USDA-funded feasibility study was completed.

The study found a small business incubator was feasible in Valencia County, specifically when it came to edible products. A mixed-use kitchen incubator would also be needed.

The incubator is open to anyone in the county and is headed by the Village of Los Lunas and the City of Rio Communities.

The goal of the incubator is to help people who have a business in mind turn their ideas into that successful business or more than one business.

## HERO REMEMBERED

Daniel Fernandez Memorial Park & Recreation Center was dedicated in 1972 in honor of Daniel D. Fernandez.

Daniel Fernandez was born on June 30th 1944 and grew up in Los Lunas. Daniel Fernandez was awarded the Medal of Honor for his actions in Hau Nghia Province, Republic of Vietnam. In February 1966 (at age 22) Daniel Fernandez threw himself on a live grenade sacrificing his life to save the lives of the soldiers around him.

## TAKE CARE DURING HOT SUMMER

Warm weather has arrived for the summer. It's time to be aware of the leading safety and health risks that increase during the summer months thus decreasing injuries and deaths at homes and workplaces.

Anyone can be at risk for a heat-related illness.

Follow these summer safety tips, like taking extra breaks and drinking lots of water. Moderate your exposure to heat. Take extra steps to avoid being outside for long periods in the sun and heat, especially during the peak hours of the strongest ultraviolet (UV) rays, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Dehydration is a safety concern during summer months. Be sure to drink enough liquids throughout the day, as our bodies can lose a lot of water through sweat.

Use a sunscreen 30 minutes before going out. Reapply sunscreen every couple hours after swimming or working in the heat. Limit sun exposure during the peak of the day.

Stay in shade when possible. Do not leave children or pets in vehicle.

Remember to always have adult supervision for children whether in the pool or playing around water. Having someone to help is essential if an emergency should occur.
