CHANGES FOR RIO METRO VALENCIA IN LL

The Rio Metro Valencia is now booking times. Passengers can call 5 a.m. to 3 p.m. plus book up to two weeks in advance to schedule a ride.

In addition, Rio Metro has initiated a new medical route to Albuquerque. Rio Metro will take anyone to any medical facility or physician's office in Albuquerque.

To meet the needs of passengers, pick up times are 6:30 a.m. and the return will be 2 p.m. Appointments should be scheduled for 9 a.m. or later and be ready to return by 2 p.m.

RECREATION CENTER EXPANSION

Wondering what's going on at Daniel Fernandez Memorial Park Recreation Center?

A \$6.3 million 19,000 square-foot expansion is what is going on. Contracted to do the job is T.A. Cole and Sons which had the lowest bid.

The expansion to the Recreation Center includes a second gymnasium, three program rooms, additional restrooms, a new entry, and office space for staff. The expansion also includes infrastructure for a future aquatic center.

The project required the removal of the tennis courts to the north of the existing recreation center, but the football and softball fields remain. The expansion takes the building to the southern edge of the splash pad.

The project is funded with a combination of state and local money with \$300,000 coming from capital outlay awarded by the state legislature and the remainder from the village's general fund. Daniel Fernandez Memorial Park Recreation Center is used by many people in the community. For instance, there are about 40 volleyball teams that use the center for practices and games and, with the additional gym, more teams can be formed and more practice time allocated.

NEW DEPUTY POLICE CHIEF

Cassandra Kanyuck is now Los Lunas Police Department Deputy Police Chief.

Kanyuck succeeds former LLPD Deputy Chief Charles Files who left for a new position in Washington, DC.

Kanyuck was promoted to deputy chief in June after working with the department since 2011, and within law enforcement since 2007.

Kanyuck came to New Mexico from South Dakota, getting her start at the Laguna Police Department in 2007, and moving onto the Isleta Police Department before being hired in Los Lunas.

FIRE WON'T WAIT. PLAN YOUR ESCAPE

The National Fire Protection Association® (NFPA®) has announced "Fire Won't Wait. Plan Your Escape™" as the theme for Fire Prevention Week, October 9-15, 2022, reinforcing the critical importance of developing a home escape plan with all members of the household and practicing it regularly.

October 2022 is the 100th anniversary of Fire Prevention Week, the nation's longest-running public health observance on record.

This year Fire Prevention Week capitalizes on its milestone anniversary.

The theme, "Fire Won't Wait. Plan Your Escape." addresses challenges that remain.

Home, the place people feel safest from fire, is where people are at greatest risk, with 74 percent of all U.S. fire deaths occurring in homes. When a home fire does occur, it's more likely to be serious; people are more likely to die in a home fire today than in 1980.

Village Fire Department Chief John Gabaldon points out today's homes burn faster and hotter than they used to, minimizing the amount of time people have to escape. In a typical home fire, you may have as little as two minutes to get out from the time the smoke alarms sound.

The Fire Prevention Week 2022 theme, "Fire Won't Wait. Plan Your Escape." promotes potentially life-saving messages that can mean the difference between life and death in a fire. Developing a home escape plan with all members of the household and practicing it regularly ensures that everyone knows what to do when the smoke alarm sounds and uses that time wisely.

Key messages behind the "Fire Won't Wait. Plan Your Escape." include:

- Make sure your home escape plan meets the needs of all family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.
- Smoke alarms should be installed inside every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of your home. Smoke alarms should interconnect so when one sounds, they all sound.
- Know at least two ways out of every room, if possible. Make sure all windows open easily.
- Have an outside meeting place a safe distance from your home where everyone should meet.
- Practice your home fire drill at least twice a year with everyone in the household, including guests. Practice at least once during the day and at night.

DON'T BE SCAMMED

As our community, state and country continue to cope with the COVID pandemic there are unscrupulous people conducting scams.

Be on the lookout for people conducting those scams. Individuals may knock on your door or call you on the phone making claims about testing for COVID or any number of things.

If someone arrives at your residence claiming to be something you think they are not, do not open the door, but contact the police immediately.

OPEN SPACE RECEIVES GRANT

Village of Los Lunas Open Space has been awarded a grant of \$15,995 from the New Mexico Outdoor Equity Fund for the 2022 grant cycle.

The grant will be used for a program that consists of four separate outdoor recreational adventures that correspond to the different seasons.

The following trips will consist of ten or twenty youth: a half-day rafting trip, a full-day ski trip, a fishing trip, and a camping trip. These trips include all associated costs, including transportation, meals, equipment, and lodging when appropriate.

Los Lunas Open Space personnel will accompany the youth and help with the educational aspects needed for each activity while encouraging the child to become a steward of the outdoors.
