FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS OF THE VILLAGE'S AUDIT

The Village's finances are audited every year with the Village Council presented financial statements also every year.

A representative from the auditing firm, Pattillo, Brown & Hill L.L.P. presented Fiscal Year 2022 statements to the Village Council in March as required by Section 2.2.2.10.M.(4) of 2.2.2 NMAC Audit Rule 2021 Requirements for Contracting and Conducting Audits of Agencies.

Financial highlights of the report show that as of Fiscal Year 2022, the village reported a total of \$255 million in assets which is composed of: cash, \$6 million; investments, \$1 million; receivables \$18 million; capital assets \$163 million; and deferred outflows, \$7 million.

The assets of the village have increased approximately \$35 million, the primary reason for the increase is cash increasing \$13 million and capital assets increasing \$26 million in FY22.

Village revenues increased approximately \$14 million in FY22 due to an increase in gross receipts taxes of approximately \$11 million.

In FY22 expenditures increased approximately \$5 million because of the adjustment related to Public Employees Retirement Association funding and RHC actuarial reports which were approximately \$3 million higher than the amount in FY21.

There was also an increase in public safety of approximately \$2 million.

Village liabilities for FY22 total \$83 million comprised of the following: accounts payable, \$6 million; accrued, \$2 million; long term debt, \$36 million; net pension liabilities, \$17 million; net OPEB liability, \$10 million; and deferred inflows \$12 million.

VILLAGE PLANNING AND ZONING

The Village of Los Lunas Planning and Zoning Commission is the appointed board of five members that hears land use cases in a public forum for the Village.

The Commission can review and decide on some matters relating to planning and zoning within the Village. However, other land use cases, such as zone changes, are recommended for approval or denial by the Commission to the Village Council for final approval or denial.

Each Commissioner is appointed by the Mayor of Los Lunas and affirmed for a two-year term by the Village Council. There is one at-large member and four district members, each representing an individual Village district.

All Commission districts follow the same boundaries as the Village Council districts.

Planning and Zoning Commission hearings are generally held on the first and third Wednesday of each month at 6 p.m. in the Village Council Chambers. For meeting information, please visit the Village Calendar.

Then, log in through your Web browser and view your bill, which looks like the paper statement you're familiar with.

Select a payment type - credit card, debit card, or electronic funds transfer - enter the information, and you're done.

It's that easy, and it only takes you a few minutes each month.

BELIEVE IN HEROES RUN

The 11th Annual Believe in Heroes Memorial Run fundraising running event begins at 7:30 a.m. Saturday, June 3, 2023.

This annual 5k, 10k race and kids k fun run begins and ends at the Starlight Theater parking lot on Huning Ranch Loop.

The event is presented by L.I.V.E., Inc., (Los Lunas Invested in Veteran Events) and raises funds supporting various veteran organizations in Los Lunas and Valencia County such as the VFW, Blue Star Mothers, American Legion, Military Order of the Purple Heart, and Wounded Warrior Project to name a few.

The total elevation gain on the 10K course, which starts at 7:30 a.m. June 3, is 141 feet to the highest point above Los Lunas. The course circulates through the Huning Ranch neighborhood and then back east ending at the Starlight theatre.

The 5K course has a total elevation gain of 85 feet. This course loops through the Huning Ranch neighborhood. This is a fast course finishing back at the Starlight Theater. Rucksack participants run or walk with a backpack weighing a minimum of 35 pounds.

The children's fun run event takes place right in front of the Starlight Theater.

Past events have raised over \$125,000 for veteran programs.

After the race refreshments will be available for participants.

Awards will be presented to the male and female top three finishers of each age group in ten-year increments.

OVER 300 CHALLENGE EL CERRO

Nearly 350 runners registered for the seventh annual King of the Hill Race making the event the biggest race in the event history.

There are four events to the race -- 5K, 10K, 10K rucksack race and the half marathon.

In the 5K the top three finishers were Isaac Gonzales of Los Lunas, Mario Hernandez, Albuquerque; and Sergio Jurrado, Los Lunas.

In the 10k the top three finishers were Ryan Roanhorse, Ryan Lasadee, and Matthew Hubbard, all of Albuquerque. In the half marathon, the top three finishers were Jeff Cuno, Patrick Goschke and Brett Winegar.

Rucksack top three were Clifford Matthews of Albuquerque, Irvin Vasquez of Los Lunas, and Demetria Vasquez of Albuquerque.

OPEN SPACE RECEIVES AWARD

The Village of Los Lunas Open Space Division is among 47 organizations to receive an Outdoor Equity Fund award in 2022. The division was granted \$15,995 to spend on four separate outdoor recreational adventures.

The intent of the award is to teach youth what it means to be stewards of the land.

The Outdoor Equity Fund was created to enable all New Mexican youth equitable access to the outdoors. It is sponsored by the New Mexico Outdoor Recreation Division, a division of the New Mexico Economic Development Department.

The grant supports programming that provides outdoor experiences that foster stewardship and respect for New Mexico's land, water, and cultural heritage.

For many, all 18 and younger, these transformational outdoor experiences are the first time they've participated in these kinds of outdoor recreation.

Two excursions have been held so far – a fishing event and a skiing excursion, both to accommodate about 20 kids.

These trips include all associated costs, including transportation, meals, equipment and lodging when appropriate. Los Lunas Open Space personnel accompany the youth and help with the educational aspects needed for each activity while encouraging the kids to become stewards of the outdoors.

Village staff work with teachers and counselors at schools to help choose who should go.

THE ORIGIN OF THE NAME LOS LUNAS

"A Cultural & Economic History of Los Lunas" was written by Los Lunas Library and Museum Director Cynthia Shetter and can be found on the Village's website loslunasnm.gov. This newsletter will run excerpts from Shetter's writing.

The Village of Los Lunas is located within the San Clemente land grant, one of the oldest land grants made in the Río Abajo, or lower Rio Grande valley of New Mexico. Mateo de Sandoval y Manzanares was granted the tract of land before the expulsion of the Spanish during the Pueblo Revolt of 1680.

Shortly after Don Diego de Vargas re-established Spanish authority in Nuevo México in 1693, the Manzanares heirs returned to Nuevo México and his daughter Ana de Sandoval y Manzanares, widow of Blas de la Candelaria, successfully petitioned Governor Felix Martinez to grant her the land in 1716 (U.S. House of Representatives, 1882).

Soon after the restoration of her land claim, Ana de Sandoval y Manzanares named her son Feliciano "Félix" Candelaria as her heir to the land, which he maintained for eighteen years.

Although the grant was originally awarded to the Manzanares family, Los Lunas derives its name from Domingo de Luna a descendant of Capitán Diego de Luna. Capitán Luna was a native born New Mexican and described as tall, with a long face and long straight hair (Chavez F. A., 1954).

Capitán Luna was sixteen years old at the time of the 1680 Pueblo Revolt and fled with family members to the exile settlement of Corpus Christi de Ysleta just south of El Paso. He was listed as a member of La Cofradía de La Conquistadora (Brotherhood of the Conqueress) in 1689 and in 1692 he was ordered to assemble his men for the first Entry of Vargas into New Mexico (Chavez F. A., 1954).

In 1697, his daughter, María Gregoria Luna (1669 – 1746), had a son Antonio de Luna who is believed to have been the illegitimate son of Cristóbal Baca II (1635 – 1697) (Shetter, 2021) (HGRCNM, 2019).

Antonio de Luna (1697 – 1729) married María Jacinta Peláez in 1718 in Albuquerque and they had seven children. Baptismal records from San Augustine de Isleta place their son Domingo de Luna (1719 – 1773) in the San Clemente area as early as 1747 (FamilySearch, 2020). Domingo de Luna began acquiring portions of the San Clemente grant in 1747 and 1748 from Bonafacio Jollanga (Joyanga) (Twitchell, 1914) and Domingo's wife, María Josefa Lucero, inherited a small parcel of cultivated land near Tomé from her parents. The 1786 estate records for Domingo's son, Antonio de Luna (1748 – 1779), who was killed interstate at the hands of Apache on the ninth day of June 1779, is one of the earliest known references depicting the area as Los Lunas.

The document reads: "a tract of land in the said place of Los Lunas, the boundaries which are on the North lands of Los Lentes, on the South lands of Bernardo Padilla, on the East the Río del Norte [Rio Grande], on the west the Rio Puerco (Arteaga, 1784)". The court proceedings went on to state that on September 4, 1784, Miguel Lucero, a relative of Antonio de Luna's mother, was granted guardianship of Antonio's heirs, José Enrique, María Josefa, Antonio de la Encarnación, and Jose Bruno.
