VILLAGE CONSIDERING AN AQUATIC CENTER

Village officials are gathering information to find out what people want to have in an aquatic center in Los Lunas.

In December 2023, a brief meeting was held to address what the public desired in an aquatic center. A brief survey has also been available online for the community to provide input. Visit www.loslunasnm.gov to find the survey linked to the homepage of the Village website.

Community planners say that not having a swimming pool, including recreation, competitive and therapeutic facilities, has been a long-standing concern.

The December 2023 meeting was led by Evan Eleff, a partner with Sports Facilities Advisory, and Kevin Post, a representative of Counsilman Hunsaker, an aquatic planning and design firm. The Village commissioned these companies to explore the possibilities of an aquatic center.

At the meeting, Eleff and Post presented their process for developing aquatic centers and what kind of amenities the space could offer, including lap lanes and water slides.

Pools are vital to the health and safety of a community, said the meeting leaders.

Aquatic centers can also provide a wide variety of uses and multigenerational opportunities to participate in different activities like swim teams and clubs, group exercise classes, birthday parties, and more.

Three main phases must be accomplished before submitting a final report to the council in early or mid March. They are currently in the first phase, which involves market analysis and community engagement.

At the meeting, members of the public said Belen's pool is the closest option around for kids to utilize in the county, so an aquatic center is something the community needs. The idea of an indoor/outdoor option was widely received and those in attendance said a facility that could be used year round is ideal.

Eleff emphasized to the attendees this project is bigger than just Los Lunas, as an aquatic center will be beneficial for people from surrounding communities as well.

To further engage the community, the consultants created an online survey to learn more about the public's preferences and what they rank as most important in the facility. The estimated cost to construct the aquatic center is around \$20 million, so the more community engagement the survey receives the more momentum there will be to move the project forward.

COUNCIL APPROVES WATER LEASE

The Village Council has approved the lease of up to 921.328 acre-feet of water rights on a year to year basis for no more than five years to the New Mexico Interstate Stream Commission.

The Interstate Stream Commission will use the pre-1907 Rio Grande Surface water rights for deposit into the Strategic Water Reserve to benefit threatened or endangered species and to ensure continued compliance with the state's Rio Grande Compact obligations.

ROUTE 66 LEADS TO INCORPORATION

"A Cultural & Economic History of Los Lunas" was written by Los Lunas Library Director Cynthia Shetter and can be found on the Village's website loslunasnm.gov. This newsletter runs excerpts from this history.

The arrival of the years immediately following the Great War of 1914 – 1918, America embarked upon a massive national undertaking to exert its newfound vitality and strength. America bristled with youthful energy during the decade. The Rio Abajo area was no exception. In 1925, a stretch of automobile highway was completed in Los Lunas.

This road was part of a circuitous route that ran from Santa Rosa to Romeroville, southwest of Las Vegas, before turning south to Santa Fe and then down to Los Lunas.

Fred D. Huning, Sr. was instrumental in overseeing the paving of this portion of highway. As the highway construction work was ongoing, on Armistice Day in 1926 the establishment of the United States Route 66 was realized. This new National highway was popularly known as Route 66 or the Mother Road. Travelers were making the trek from the east to the west coast. California was the destination drawing many for a variety of reasons. Oil, movies, manufacturing, military installations, trans-pacific trade, and agriculture were the key drivers of growth.

As his ancestors before him, Fred D. Huning, Sr., Joseph F. Tondre and many other residents of Los Lunas recognized the opportunity presented. This induced them to incorporate. The Valencia County Commission meeting minutes documenting the proceedings read:

"On July 2, 1928, during a board of county commissioners meeting at the Valencia County Courthouse, Fred D. Huning and Joseph F. Tondre presented a signed petition by residents of the settlement of Los Lunas requesting incorporation as a village pursuant to State law.

The commissioners ordered the petition be filed with the county clerk, while also appointing Pabla Aragon to conduct a census and ordering a survey of the proposed village, whereupon the meeting was adjourned until July 10. On that day, Emiliano Castillo, Sr., chairman; J. Procopio Silva, member; Jesus Gallegos, sheriff; and Luis Baca McBride, clerk (represented in proxy by his deputy Abelino A. Gutierrez) considered the matter of incorporation and, satisfied with the procedure, ordered and declared "the people of the territory embraced within the boundaries of the said survey platted and filed as aforesaid to be an incorporated village under the name and style of The Village of Los Lunas." On August 7, 1928, residents voted at the Los Lunas Public School and returned the following results:

Antonio J. Archuleta was elected Mayor. Joseph F. Tondre, Gilberto C. Luna, Abelino A. Gutierrez, and Jesus Maestas were elected trustees. Fred D. Huning, Sr. was elected clerk while Simon Neustadt would serve as treasurer.
