ANNUAL REPORT DETAILS VILLAGE ACTIVITIES

If you have been wondering how the Village continues to grow there is a new way to find out.

Available on the Village website loslunasnm.gov, the 2023 annual report has been designed as a communication tool revealing how the Village of Los Lunas and its devoted teams are committed to transparency and accountability.

The year 2023 proved another year of remarkable growth and significant achievements for the Village. With a population exceeding 18,000 and growing, Los Lunas is currently recognized as the second-fastest growing municipality in the state of New Mexico.

Village Administrator Gregory D. Martin points out that the Village has always been a regional destination for recreation, and in 2023 recreation projects included adding to the growing network of multi-use paths to walk and bike throughout our beautiful community.

In addition, expansion of Daniel Fernandez Recreation Center included a second gymnasium and other new program rooms that encourage the growth of sports leagues and youth programs to meet the recreation needs and desires of the growing region.

The most anticipated project in the region is the I-25 Second Interchange and Los Lunas Boulevard Corridor Project. After two decades of effort, this project is finally underway! In 2023, several significant milestones were reached on this project: (1) 90% design, (2) nearly \$150 million in funding for Phase I, and (3) acquisition of property for required right-of-way. This critical new roadway connection will extend from I-25 on the west to NM Hwy 47 on the east, relieving congestion on Main Street and providing faster and safer routes in and around Los Lunas and Valencia County.

The full interchange and corridor project will be a limited access road and will include the longest river bridge in New Mexico. Phase I of this project will go into construction in 2024, while funding is sought for Phase II —approximately \$80-85 million— which will add a second travel lane in each direction.

Thanks to stable leadership, a progressive and visionary Governing Body, and a tenured workforce of experienced and dedicated employees, the Village of Los Lunas is poised and prepared for another productive and successful year in 2024.

TAX FORMS

The Los Lunas Library, in the front hall, has:

CHILD HELMET SAFETY ACT

The Child Helmet Safety Act (Chapter 32A, Article 24 NMSA 1978) states that anyone under the age of 18 (a minor) must wear protective gear on their head to prevent any accidents.

This law mandates that anyone (operator) on a bicycle, skateboard, scooters, motorized cycles, or skates must have a helmet.

While these outdoor activities are a fun way to exercise and get around, thousands of kids go to emergency departments with head injuries each year. Wearing a helmet can decrease the risk of head injuries by about 85% and facial injuries by about 65%.

The law states; "It is unlawful for a parent or legal guardian of a minor to knowingly permit that minor to operate or be a passenger on a bicycle, skates, scooter or skateboard unless that minor wears a well-fitted protective bicycle helmet, fastened securely upon the head with the straps of the helmet."

The Child Helmet Safety Act will be enforced by Los Lunas Police Officers and Open Space Park Rangers in public parks, streets, and sidewalks. Enforcement will include verbal notification to parent or guardian. If continued, parent or guardian will be cited at their expense.

Helmets are now mandated on Los Lunas Parks and Recreation property including the Skate Park.

GETTING A LIBRARY CARD

You can sign up for a new library card through the online borrower page and fill out the requested information.

After you have completed this information visit the circulation desk at the library at 460 Main St. NE. Library staff will update your account once you have verified your information, and provided your I.D. and proof of mailing address. Once your account is verified patrons can then check out physical items, digital items, and use other library services like public computers.

To verify your information you will need to provide a valid government I.D. and proof of a mailing address. Patrons can provide a copy of a utility bill, phone bill, or other piece of mail with their name and current mailing address.

If you have had a card with the Los Lunas Public Library in the past, do not fill out this form, instead visit the library circulation desk so staff can update your existing account.

If you already have an account with our library but have lost your library card visit the circulation desk to purchase a replacement card for \$2.00.

If you have lost your library card, staff can access your library account to make changes, check-out books, and purchase a replacement card once a patron provides a government I.D. to verify their identity.

A BIT OF LOS LUNAS HISTORY

“A Cultural & Economic History of Los Lunas” was written by Los Lunas Library and Museum Director Cynthia Shetter and can be found on the Village’s website loslunasnm.gov. This newsletter is running excerpts from Shetter’s writing.

In 1935, the gross receipts tax was introduced during the depths of the Great Depression.

Then Route 66 was realigned in 1937 - creating a direct link from Santa Rosa to Albuquerque - ultimately bypassing small settlements, Santa Fe, Bernalillo, and Los Lunas, that were along the original route.

Some residents had already felt the economic impact when the route was re-routed to parallel the railroad tracks linking Isleta to Los Lunas on the west side of the Rio Grande bypassing Bosque Farms, Peralta and Valencia on the east.

Business owners invested in cabins for overnight lodging and service stations but they were no longer on the direct path. The White Hotel had experienced a fire right around the time the first re-route occurred and they rebuilt the Hotel and added a cafe across from the Luna Mansion to be on the Route again.

Eleven years on Route 66 shaped what the Village is now. As 1940 rolled around Los Lunas boasted a population of 686 residents and as the years progressed, the numbers waivered until 1960.

In 1941, the United States entered the World War after the bombing of Pearl Harbor, taking some of the young residents of Los Lunas places all around the world offering them different opportunities.

Opportunities such as the G.I. Bill induced them to go to college giving them prospects they never had before. Many went into careers that didn’t demand working in the fields.

The Korean and Vietnam wars were much the same so the population of Los Lunas had only risen to 973. For those that did return, they embraced their heritage and honored the friends and neighbors that had been lost.
